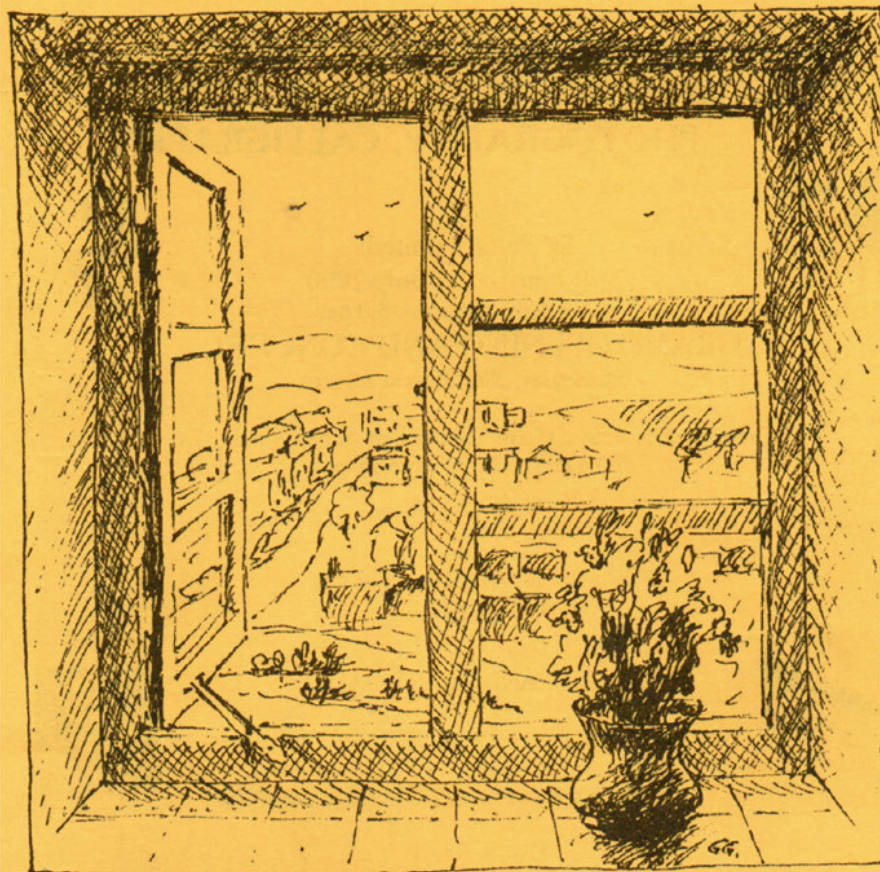

I woke this morning at 4.30am with a slight panic – I need to write the article for Williton Window! Not all bad though, as the birds were happily singing away and the promise of a lovely day, so after not being able to return to sleep, I started planning what I could write.

Williton Parish Council are very pleased to enable the restart of this amazing publication – one which has been missed by many; long may it continue.

We continue to be extremely busy; at our recent meeting, Cllr Peter Payne was re-elected as Chairman, and Cllr Ian Aldridge re-elected as Vice Chairman. We have a full complement of 12 Councillors and together we are all trying our best for the local community.

There have recently been several road closures, and I understand that all households have not been made aware – this included our office, but when we do receive notification, it is displayed in our office window. Wales & West Utilities have agreed to hold a public drop-in session, in the Pavilion, on 21st September, 9am – 6pm, so please pop in for any updates.

The public footpath from Catwell to Townsend has had an emergency closure, as from the 18th of May 2026 for 18 days, due to erosion of the riverbank. We have been reporting the issue over previous months, so hopefully repairs will be undertaken to ensure that it can re-open safely.

An exciting piece of news is that, as I write this, new play equipment is now installed in the children's play area, finished in time for the half term holidays. It is looking fantastic – I am sure plenty of play adventures will take place for many years to come. Also, the addition of the Nest Swing, which is fully inclusive, is brilliant.

Further to the recent purchase of the former library building, we are currently working on the plans for refurbishment – please feel free to pop into the office for an update or look at the suggested plans. These will also be available on the website when finalised.

“Oh how good is it to have Williton Window back in print? How many connections have been lost or yearned for when Williton Window closed down? We have all appreciated and give thanks for the work of trying to keep us informed by the Council team. But the personal contact was lost for those who used to pick up that little booklet to re-read a personal memory or a moment recalled from a connection to an event you visited. During COVID those of us on the helpline were told some fabulous stories of Williton’s past.

I for one miss those conversations with so many. I also learned about our Williton residents sadly with sight problems who would have the pleasure of hearing something about local goings-on from the Window, read by a friend, carer or family. We are also fully aware that those sadly dealing with dementia can have memories of times long ago; they may be able to recall where they were or how they used certain items at various ages in their life. So it is with hope that as time goes on, there will be stories/reflections that give inspiration and joy to our Williton residents. Maybe, some may even help us, learn again about the old days and what the people were like who ran the shops and where they were located. You might even have photos or tales to write down we can use in future articles. Any memories will always be welcome.



Talking about memories, it is not difficult to cast my mind back to nine years ago when I walked Williton’s streets, trying to learn about its history whilst house hunting. I’d come across details about Herbert Henry Hole, renowned photographer who’d lived in Long Street.

Photographer James Date; Watchet’s highly respected photographer decided to sell up in 1876. He decided to make a deal with Henry H. Hole, for all of his equipment, including 1000 plates. Probably, some of these included some of his most renowned photographs, possibly proving very lucrative in later years.

This evoked a memory for me that made me smile, for I went to a lecture about Victorian photographers some years back which was held at my local museum in Brighton, purely on a whim. Really because I always wondered why people had their photo taken always looking so miserable. It was apparently not appropriate to smile in those days! But, in my mind I wondered was it because they had such bad teeth? Sadly, the artificial teeth company in Williton did not open till 1902 or they might have been of help. So was there another reason why people looked so grim? It turned out the person presenting this talk had also felt the need to find out. We all secretly expect the portraits were posed and then had plants etc. put around them to make things look homely. But there was another reason . . .

You had to wait a long time and remain motionless, before the photographer told you, you could move; which was of course very difficult but . . . Unseen, he'd put you into a neck clamp, used to keep your head at the correct angle, also the props put around you were for you to lean on, in a certain way the photographer thought was most artistic. Is this why in some of these family photos the children look terrified after seeing their parents clamped into position!

Happy days! Thank heavens for some technology moving on to self - expression, even the dreaded selfies that always make me look - "Ugh!" There is more about H. H. Hole if anyone's interested.

News from the Station



Firstly, we have to say that the Williton Station team are delighted that the Williton Window has made a return!

For those of you who don't know us, Williton Station is the principal passing station on the preserved West Somerset Railway – a 22 mile long line running from Bishops Lydeard to Minehead. Williton Station is a busy little station where trains cross (the line is single track). We have a Grade II Listed station complex, built mainly between 1862 and 1876, boasting many original and nostalgic features. You can not only buy tickets for a journey here, but you can also visit our excellent little café and shop, buy yourself a cup of tea and a bun, and watch the trains go by. We are a varied and friendly bunch (our motto is 'Williton Station. It's cheaper than therapy!')

One of the visiting locomotives was Class A4 number 60007 'Sir Nigel Gresley', and this loco will be returning for a special weekend on 3rd-5th July. The A4s were the class of locomotives which included the world famous 'Mallard' which holds the world record speed for a steam locomotive (126mph). Sir Nigel Gresley (named after her designer, the Chief Mechanical Engineer of the London and North Eastern Railway) holds the record for post-war speed (112mph). Come along and see this magnificent piece of engineering history!

Staying Safe in an Online World

a series of articles by Edward Martin

The internet has changed the way we live. We shop online, speak to friends and family across the world, manage our bank accounts, watch films, and even control devices in our homes with the touch of a button. The online world has become part of everyday life. Sadly, criminals know this too.

Cybercrime is no longer something that only affects large companies or governments. Ordinary people are now regular targets. Scammers are becoming more convincing, fraud is increasing, and many attacks rely not on complicated technology, but simply on catching someone off guard.

The good news is that staying safe online does not require expert knowledge. In most cases, a few simple habits can dramatically reduce the risk.

PHISHING This is where criminals send fake emails, text messages, or even phone calls pretending to be organisations such as banks, delivery companies, HMRC, or well-known businesses. These messages are designed to create panic or urgency. You may be told that your account has been compromised, a parcel cannot be delivered, or that you owe money. The aim is simple — to trick you into clicking a link or giving away personal information. Pause before you act. Genuine organisations rarely pressure customers into immediate action. If something feels wrong, it probably is. Never click on suspicious links in emails or text messages. Instead, visit the company's website directly or contact them using a trusted phone number.

PASSWORDS are another major weakness. Many people still use simple passwords or reuse the same password across several accounts. While it is understandable — remembering dozens of passwords is difficult — it creates a serious risk. If one account becomes compromised, criminals may try the same password elsewhere. Strong passwords do not need to be impossible to remember. A phrase made from several unrelated words can be both secure and memorable. Using a password manager can also help by safely storing passwords for you. Most importantly, avoid using the same password everywhere.

TWO-FACTOR AUTHENTICATION often called 2FA, requires you to enter a code sent to your phone after typing your password. Although it adds a few extra seconds when logging in, it can prevent criminals accessing your accounts even if they know your password.

SOFTWARE UPDATES are also important, despite being regularly ignored. Many people postpone updates because they appear inconvenient or unnecessary but, updates can contain vital security fixes. Criminals actively search for computers and phones running outdated software because known weaknesses can be exploited. Keeping devices updated is one way to stay protected. In the next issue I'll cover social media, online shopping, and child protection.

THE ACCIDENTAL PILGRIM WHEN LIFE TRIPS YOU UP: HOW HOMEOPATHY HELPED ME HEAL

It happened in an instant. One moment I was walking to my car during one of my pilgrimages, the next I had tripped. I went down hard, my face hitting a drum I was holding. Arnica made from mountain daisy, is always my first choice after a fall. Brilliant for bruising, swelling, soft tissue injury, and shock, both physical and mental. A telling sign it's needed, when someone's insisting they're fine when they clearly aren't. I took it within minutes. The bruising came up as expected, but resolved quickly.

Aconite addressed the mental shock, that shaky, rattled, ambushed feeling after sudden fright. Also known as "arnica for the eye," it's indicated for intense pain once the initial shock wears off, and was particularly relevant as I had struck my eye, cheek and nose in the fall.

Ledum works beautifully with or after arnica for bruises. Especially suited to dark or purplish bruising that is slow to clear, perfectly describing my eye, disappearing within eight days.

Ruta addressed my wrist, for the contusion and sprain. Ruta goes deeper than Arnica, into tendons and ligaments. Improvements in movement and reduction in pain over the following days was remarkable. I continued taking it until all pain resolved and full movement returned.

Symphytum made from comfrey, long known in herbal tradition as "knitbone", supports the body's repair of bone tissue, and is also indicated for blows to the eye and surrounding bony structures. It should only be used once a suspected fracture has been properly assessed by a medical professional.

Calendula made from marigold, addressed the cuts to my nose and below my eye. Suited to open wounds and broken skin, it supports clean healing and helps prevent infection. Clean wounds thoroughly first, its healing action is rapid.

As Rumi wrote, "The wound is the place where the light enters you." A fall is rarely just a fall it's an invitation to pay attention, to care for yourself, and to discover resources you didn't know you had."

Homeopathic remedies are chosen on individual symptoms, prescribed on the person in front of you.

Warmer weather doesn't lower the risk: Spring COVID jabs to protect vulnerable people in Somerset

As spring brings brighter weather, many people naturally feel more active and optimistic. But illnesses like COVID-19 haven't gone away, and for some, the risks remain very real.

42% of people in Somerset have already been vaccinated this Spring but the virus spreads easily all year round and can be very dangerous and even life threatening for vulnerable people such as those who are immunosuppressed and those who live in a care home for older adults.

That's why the NHS in Somerset is encouraging eligible people to book their spring booster when invited and reminding families and representatives with responsibility for care home residents to return consent forms where needed.

Not just for older people: What does having a weakened immune system mean?

If you live with a weakened immune system, your body can find it harder to fight off infections, increasing your risk of serious illness from viruses. Only people with specific conditions; including having had an organ transplant, undergoing some cancer treatments, or receiving long-term specialist therapies for conditions such as rheumatoid arthritis or inflammatory bowel disease; are recommended to have the COVID-19 vaccination. If you're unsure whether this applies to you, guidance is available at www.nhs.uk/covid-vaccine, or you can ask your pharmacist or GP surgery if you are unsure.

Support for housebound people

If you or someone you care for is eligible for the COVID-19 vaccination and is housebound, the Somerset Foundation Trust (SFT) Vaccination Outreach Team or your GP practice will get in touch between April and

the 30 June to arrange a home visit appointment. It is sometimes normal to receive a national reminder from NHS England before your local team gets in contact, but please do not worry as this does not mean you have been missed.

Giving consent for vaccinations in care homes

If you have a loved one living in an adult care home who is eligible, the care home should be in touch with you about upcoming visits from local NHS vaccination teams. Please return consent forms as soon as possible with your decision if you have power of attorney. Care home staff can help with any questions and more information is available: www.nhs.uk/covid-vaccine.

Rob Weaver, GP and Deputy Chief Officer at NHS Somerset, said:

“Warmer weather sadly doesn’t change the risk of COVID-19. The virus continues to circulate and for older people and those with weakened immune systems, the risk remains. Vaccination is one of the most effective ways to lower the risk of severe illness and reduce the chance of hospital admission. So please come forward when invited to avoid any delay in your protection.”

If you are eligible, you will be invited by text, email, NHS App messages or by letter but you don’t need to wait for an invite – just visit the NHS website, use the NHS App or call 119 now to book your appointment

Max temp 18 OC on the 23rd. Min temp here +2 OC on the 20th.

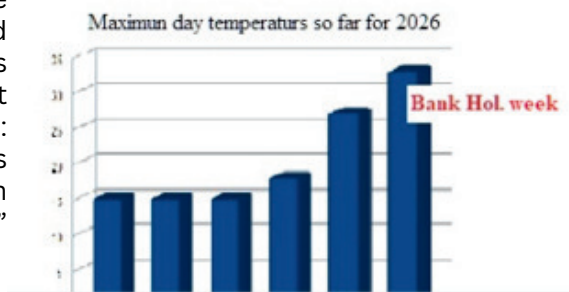
Max pressure 30.45 inches on the 31st. Min pressure 29.6 inches on the 26th. The total rain was 35inches. Very low for March.

Some of us will see the young birds are being fed by their parents: the crows in the trees in long street Williton are nesting high: the Country Folk saying is “When the crow’s nest high then summer will be dry!” turns out true – so far!

peanut cookies

If you have favourite family recipes then please do share with us for others to enjoy.

- Recipe makes about 40
- 140g/5oz butter
- 110g/4oz castor sugar
- 110g/4oz soft light brown sugar
- 1 large egg beaten
- 110g/4oz crunchy peanut butter
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla essence
- 200g/7oz plain flour
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 tsp. baking powder

Heat oven to 180 degrees/350F/gas mark 4

Cream sugars together with butter till smooth, beat in the egg, then cream in the peanut butter and the vanilla essence.

Sift in the flour, salt, and baking powder to the mix.

Stir until smooth. Do not beat, as it will turn oily.

Roll the mixture into small balls, place well apart on at least three greaseproof-lined baking trays

Use a fork to flatten them slightly.

Bake for 10 -15 minutes till light brown, not dark!

Ease off of greaseproof onto a cooling rack, they crisp as they cool. Store in an airtight container.
