ROM REV KATHRYN FLENLEY
What is it about Twelfth Night that encourages us to bring the Christmas celebrations to a close with feasting and the odd glass of cider? Here in the West Country, January 6th heralds a good deal of cider drinking at the annual wassail. The word 'wassail' comes from the Anglo-Saxon phrase 'waes hael', which means 'good health'; one legend concerning its origin says that a beautiful Saxon maiden named Rowena presented Prince Vortigen with a bowl of wine while toasting him with the words 'waes hael'.

Originally, the wassail was a drink made of mulled ale, curdled cream, roasted apples, eggs, cloves, ginger, nutmeg and sugar. It was served from huge bowls, often made of silver or pewter. Jesus College, Oxford, has a Wassail bowl which can hold 10 gallons of drink!

The Wassail drink mixture, sometimes called 'Lamb's Wool' because of the froth formed by the pulp of the roasted apples, was believed to scare off worms and maggots that were regarded as 'evil' spirits and to attract the 'good' spirit embodied by the robin.

The ceremony of wassailing takes place around the oldest orchard tree where it is toasted and traditional Wassail songs are sung.

Here's to thee, old apple-tree,

Whence thou mayst bud, and whence thou mayst blow,

And whence thou mayst bear apples enow

Hats full! caps full!

Bushel-bushel-sacks full,

And my pockets full, too, huzza!

Within the Christian Nativity story, January 6th commemorates the visit of the Three Kings who have followed a star that reveals the presence of Jesus. In Spain, this important Festival is known as 'The festival of the three Magic Kings' when children receive their presents delivered by the Three Kings! Here you might buy a special cake called a 'Roscón', normally filled with cream or chocolate and decorated with a paper crown. In France you might eat a 'Galette des Rois', a type of flat almond cake, often with a toy crown cooked inside, and decorated on top with a gold paper crown, whilst in Mexico a special cake has a figure of Baby Jesus hidden inside. Whoever finds it is the 'Godparent' of Jesus for that year.

We know the festival as The Feast of the Epiphany and many churches hold a service which also celebrates the Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan; people are often sprayed with water as a recognition that a new year has begun when we can start afresh, filled with hope for the year ahead and for a deepening of relationships with each other and Jesus.

In Watchet on January 7th there will be an Epiphany Service at the Salvation Army Hall starting at 3 pm to be followed by the opportunity to enjoy a Galette des Rois. So, whether you wish each other 'good health' with a glass of cider or celebrate the visit of the three Kings by enjoying a rather rich cake, remember that these celebrations look to the future with hope. Hope for a good harvest and hope for a deepening of relationships. May we all look forward to 2018 with hope in our hearts. Waes Hael!

WOMEN'S INSTITUTE
Christmas comes but once a year, and when it comes it brings good cheer! Well, that was certainly true for our December Meeting, held on a cold, miserable and wet afternoon. HILDCARE COSTS

Getting help with your childcare costs is easier than you might think. Childcare Choices brings together all the government childcare offers in one place, including two new schemes for working parents: Tax-free childcare and up to 30 hours a week funded childcare for 3 and 4 year olds.

Families in Somerset are already benefitting from these offers. If you are a working parent and you have a child that is three years old by 31 December you can apply now for up to 30 hours a week funded childcare to use from January 2018. If you are successful you will receive an eligibility code to take to your early years provider.

If you already have a 30 hours childcare place, you must re-confirm you are still eligible every three months. It is easy to do - just check the secure messages in your childcare service account. Go to gov.uk/childcareaccount

TIPS ON USING 30 HOURS FUNDED CHILDCARE

Different childcare arrangements work for different families. When deciding, you might want to consider the following:

- * You can take up your 30 hours between 6am-8pm, but no session can be more than 10 hours.
 - * You don't have to use all 30 hours, just those that meet your needs.
- * Providers have a choice whether to offer the hours and some may not offer the full 30 hours.
 - * You can split your hours between providers.

Splitting is limited to a maximum of two sites per day. Remember to get your 30 hours code checked by all the providers you use.

30 hours is available for 38 weeks of the year (just like the existing 15 hours scheme). Some providers will allow you to 'stretch' your 30 hours entitlement over 52 weeks of the year meaning fewer hours per week (e.g. you could take 22 hours a week for 52 weeks).

RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee BACON AND MUSHROOM PASTA FOR TWO - EASY AND TASTY

6 oz (150g) dried or fresh pasta Black pepper

6 oz (150g) streaky bacon, cut into pieces 2 oz (50 g) tasty cheese grated

Knob of butter 1 tablespoon parmesan cheese

4 oz (100g) mushrooms quartered Sprinkling of fresh chopped parsley

1 tablespoon oil

Cook pasta as directed and whilst it is cooking fry the bacon in the butter until starting to crisp. Add the mushrooms and continue to cook for three minutes. Drain the pasta and mix in the oil, and season well. Put into an ovenproof dish, place the bacon and mushrooms on top, cover with the tasty cheese and then the parmesan. Cook under a pre-heated hot grill until the cheese has melted. Sprinkle with the parsley before serving. Very nice served with a tomato salad.


OWN AT THE STATION

Williton Pavilion Project UPDATE

Work continues on 41. Work continues on the new access road and the footpath should be complete and open by the end of December, weather permitting. During the month we met with several residents from Robert Street who previously have suffered from flooding, the meeting was to discuss the proposed improvements to the access road that may help alleviate the ponding affect that occurs at the entrance to the ground when Robert Street is flooded. As a community funded project, there is no money in the budget for any major flood alleviation work, the budget will however, allow for minor improvements by widening the lane and introducing a small gradient into the ground, this will help hasten the dispersal of any collecting water.

In January we should soon see the ground works commence which will take several weeks to complete, they will then commence the construction of the steel frame for the building. Progress through January and February will be very much weather dependant though to date, we are still on schedule.

At the next charity meeting to be held at the end of January, we shall agree the hire rates for 2018-19 and these will be published within the March edition of the Window.

HOW TO GET URGENT HEALTH CARE AT WEEKENDS

If you or someone you care about falls ill at the weekend, it can be a worrying time. It can also be difficult to know what to do. The NHS has a website with much information, including when to call 111. This is the NHS nonemergency number, it is fast, easy and free. When you call 111 you will speak to a highly trained adviser, supported by healthcare professionals. They will ask you a series of questions to assess your symptoms and immediately direct you to the best medical care. It is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. And calls are free from landlines and mobile phones.

You should use the NHS 111 service if you urgently need medical help or advice but it's not a life-threatening situation.

For less urgent health needs, contact your GP or local pharmacist in the usual wav.

If a health professional has given you a specific phone number to call when you're concerned about your condition, continue to use that number.


