

January – are you glass half full or half empty? Do you start the New Year with resolutions and excitement or shiver with the horror of bad weather, no money and dark nights? Take the half full- option and embrace a more positive mind-set to support you through the harsh winter months when life can be most challenging.

You don't need to pay a fortune on diet and detox kits, heating or a holiday to survive winter. Appreciate the beauty of winter to keep you feeling upbeat. Think log fires and walks or time to snuggle under a duvet, with a hot water bottle on the sofa and not feel guilty about watching the TV or reading a book all day! Get excited by planning the work you are doing in the garden for next summer or researching where you want to go on holiday. Eat local and simple foods. Making cheap, homemade vegetable soups keeps you warm and full throughout the day.

Driving can be tricky in winter, the rush hour is in the dark and the roads can be filled with ice, floods, potholes and wet leaves. The AA has advice to keep us all safe: https://www.theaa.com/driving-advice/seasonal/winter

Also, here are some top tips for staying well in the cold – and we know the past couple of years have bought particularly cold weather in the late January – March period with various Beasts storming in! These are particularly aimed at people who care for others but useful for other people too!

Ten Top Tips for to help keep us in good health this winter

- 1. Pressure ulcers often start in the home. If you notice a red spot that doesn't blanch when you press it, it could be the start of a pressure ulcer.
- 2. Do not rub the areas of red skin as this could cause a breakdown of skin.
- 3. Rubber rings can create areas of increased pressure, not prevent them.
- 4. If incontinence products are used try to not multilayer them as this could increase the risk of pressure ulcers occurring.
- 5. When moving out of bed do not ruck up bedding which could drag on the skin.
- 6. Where possible, reposition or move regularly to avoid prolonged periods of high pressure.
- 7. Remember that dehydration does not only occur in the summer. When we turn the heating on we still need to keep hydrated.
- 8. Keeping properly hydrated helps to prevent against Urinary Tract Infections.
- 9. Incontinence issues? Try switching to decaffeinated drinks but switch over slowly to allow the body to get used to the withdrawal of caffeine. Keep drinking at regular intervals during the day, as this can actually help with incontinence issues.
- 10. Remember good hand hygiene can help prevent against bugs and infections. Washing your hands with soap and water after going to the toilet and before preparing food for others is an essential way to reduce the spread of unpleasant illnesses to friends and family.

ASPS - WILLITON AND SURROUNDING AREA PARKINSON'S SUPPORT
Here we are at the start of a brand new year, new resolutions still intact, we

hope, and looking forward to a good new year for everyone. We would like to wish everyone a very Happy New Year. I know that the WASPS have a lot to look forward to.

We are now back to where we started 7 years ago - a support group for our local area for anyone who has Parkinson's. As a member of Parkinson's UK we had to attend workshops, send in reports and follow their guidelines. None of this on its own was hard to do, but when it came to getting volunteers we ran into problems; there were simply too many rules and regulations. So we took the honest approach and told them we were not big enough to work within their mandate and they let us go. They understand our point of view and we will still have links to them. We recommend that anyone who has Parkinson's take out an individual membership. It is very good value for money and they send out information to all members. Their magazine alone is well worth the membership.

We will continue to operate as The WASPS and hold our meetings at the Williton Pavilion on the first Thursday of every month, except for February when it the first Wednesday. RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee

RICH FRUIT BUNS

If you have any dried mixed fruit and black treacle left over from making vour Christmas cake, do make these!

150g (5 oz) butter 75g (3oz) chopped mixed fruit

150g (5 oz) self raising flour

A good tablespoon black treacle ½ teaspoon baking powder 1 teaspoon mixed spice 150g (5 oz) caster sugar

Chop the butter into small bits and melt in the oven. Mix all the ingredients together and put into 12 paper cases in a bun tin. It is a soft mixture and will spread and spill if too much is put into the cases. Put in a pre-heated oven 190oC / 375oF / Gas 5 and bake for about 20 minutes.

It was with great regret that in Mid-November Williton Parish Council received a letter from Cllr Tony Perret advising that he was resigning from the Parish Council and, by default, from the Chairmanship of the Council. Tony has been on the Council for many years and I am sure that you will join the Parish Council in thanking him for all the hard work he has done for Williton during the time he has been on the Council and particularly whilst he has been its Chairman. At the last Parish Council Meeting I was honoured to be elected as the new Chairman, especially as I only became a councillor early in 2019. In that short time I have learnt a lot about the Parish Council and how it works, as well as discovering the amount of hard work done by my fellow councillors, our Parish Clerk Michelle Francis and her Assistant Jo Holmes, and what a great many others do behind the scenes for the benefit of our community.

There are many things going on in the village which just seemed to happen, for instance the Fete and Williton Christmas. Now that I am on the Parish Council it is clear that they don't just happen but a lot of organisation has to take place. So, as we start a New Year, can I thank everyone who has done so much for the village in 2019 and, in advance, for all they will be doing in 2020.

Tony's resignation has left us with a further vacancy on the Parish Council (we have 3 vacancies in total), and if you would like to find out what the Parish Council does, with a view to becoming a Councillor, please give Michelle or Jo a call on 01984 633979.

Over the past couple of months in addition to doing some fun things like organising the Christmas Parade and Festival, and getting the lights up around the village centre, the Council has been looking at several planning applications for large developments within its parish boundary. Although all the planning decisions that affect Williton are made by Somerset West and Taunton Council (SWAT), the Parish Council does comment on every application that is made.

Recently an outline application for 139 houses south of Normandy Avenue has been considered; a detailed application for 90 houses off Aller Mead has been submitted; and, although not in our parish, the application for the redevelopment of Watchet's paper mill site has implications for traffic management in Williton. Recently a consultation was held in the Parish Office for 350 houses to the west of Malmsey House, as well as a consultation regarding a new filling station at Washford Cross. These applications, if they are all agreed, will have a major impact on our community, not just with the potential to increase the size of the village by about 30% but also with the increased traffic that these developments will bring.

The Parish Council represents the residents of Williton and will do all it can to make sure that the decision makers at SWAT know how the village feels.
