

I would like to have been able to report that the first Santa Trains had visited Williton and all went well. The station was decked out with fairy lights and a decorated tree sat in the waiting room window to welcome the trains. As we have not got all the covid-19 sanitizers and other precautions around the platforms as yet the station is officially still closed to the general public. Staff were on hand to operate the gates and be available for any emergencies.

I still have plenty of books, both general reading or special train related volumes and should we get some fine weather (Fridays or Saturdays) during the next couple of months I will have them on display outside on my drive at 6 Long Lakes. WEST SOMERSET BUILD BACK BETTER

Is a campaign focusing on local issues that need to be resolved in order to take better care of the planet and each other when things get 'back to normal'. There is a national campaign with broad aims which we support and we are addressing the problems and

solutions that we have in a rural area with an ageing population and mainly low paid jobs. We are a group of community organisations, individuals and businesses concerned with improving transport systems; creating affordable, energy efficient housing; encouraging local food production; reducing waste and pollution and helping nature recover. We work with local organisations and initiate new projects, sharing knowledge and ideas for action. There are lots of things that we can all do to make a difference.

Our informal meetings had to be replaced by Zoom but we were able to get out and talk to people during the summer when we had market stalls in Minehead and Watchet and we have created a 'signpost' which was taken to various communities, showing the way to make things better. Groups in Minehead, Watchet and Porlock are finding alternatives to plastic so we can reduce the amount that we throw away, and regular beach cleans have removed a lot of it from the sea. There are schemes to repair and re-use things with people who have the skills to do this and plans to use electric vehicles for community transport. A new working group has been set up to create closer links between food producers and consumers. We held an on-line workshop in October with speakers on 'people power', community supported agriculture, alternatives to our cars, and community engagement. People can get involved by joining our virtual meetings and working groups and helping us let the public know about all the exciting initiatives that are coming from people in this area. We would love to have more people helping us plan activities and get our message across using websites, social communications and other media.

I'm sure you are familiar with the message; what a terrible year. Hibernate seems like a good plan, but when to set the alarm clock, February, March...who knows when? So I'd better stay awake.

Things still go on with the Parish Council, but for social distancing rules and the Government's request to work from home means the Parish Office is not open to the Public. Do you know where it is? It is the first building on the right hand side of Killick way, between the filling station on Fore Street and the library, also in Killick Way. When it can re-open you know where to find our Clerk, Michelle Francis, and when they are appointed, her assistant.

The new financial year starts in April and before that the Council has to decide what it wants to do with your money. The total turn-over of the Council is about £90,000 which is collected by the Somerset West & Taunton District Council. The District Council then pays it back to the Parish. A larger slice goes to the District Council and even more to Somerset County Council. The Police, Fire Brigade and the Somerset Rivers Authority also have a share.

Of course, the Christmas Festival had to be run differently, but we hope you still turned out to see Father Christmas. Brightening up Fore Street did not look like it was going to happen, but thanks to a volunteer from the business community the trees and lights went up. The Christmas tree on Bellamy's Corner was put up by Councillors and helpers. We need more people coming forward to help with running events.


You don't have to be a Parish Councillor to role up your sleeves.

WILLITON WEATHER



DECEMBER

Frosts were seen on the mornings of the 4th and 5th. At the start of December, the Jet Stream swung below the west pulling in wetter weather. More details in next month's Magazine (February Edition).

NOVEMBER

In the first half of November, we had days warmer than average and very high pressure of 30.6 inches on the 19th (Higher than the summer) yet there were gales on this day.

The maximum temperature on the 9th,10th & 17th was 18 C.

The minimum temperature on the 4th was -2 C with a frost.

The maximum pressure was 30.5 inches on the 5th higher than in summer.

The minimum pressure was 29.6 inches on the 1st.

The total rainfall was only 54.5mm.


There were gales on the 15th, 16th, 18th, & 19th. causing a few roads to be blocked with trees. We saw frosts on the 4th, 5th, 26th, 27th and fog on the 7th, 17th, 22nd, 28th and 29th (all day).

Please remember to put out water and food for the birds.

Astronomical Data

Look out at the sky you may see the conjunction of the planets. Jupiter and Saturn may be seen in the lower SW sky look after 5:00pm. And Mars is in the southerly direction, apart from the Moon these are the brightest "Stars" objects to be seen (look even after Christmas).

It's December, and as Village & Community Agents, we know this can be a really tough time of year, so I'd like to share a little of what we are doing to help people during the winter months.

Christmas is upon us, and here at CCS (Community Council for Somerset) we are very busy with the Somerset Food Resilience Taskforce, in partnership with Somerset County Council. We are working together to increase food security for residents in Somerset.

Across Somerset, CCS Village Agents and volunteers delivered nearly 1,000 meals to families in need to help prevent holiday hunger during half term, and have also recently delivered nearly a tonne of donated potatoes to people in need, distributed through 10 community groups. We are delivering regular food boxes to clients on a weekly basis and often distribute donated goods such as books, household cleaning products, and much more that people need!





Dear Residents

We have seen a vast increase in the number of telephone scams in recent weeks from fraudsters claiming to be from HMRC, TV Licencing, Amazon, Utility Companies and many others. What do most of these have in common? When they call you be it an automated call or a person on the phone, most will eventually ask you to press number 1 on your keypad to be connected to a particular department (Please do not do this).

Why did that department not contact you in the first instance? Because they need you to press 1. The most likely outcome is you will be connected to a premium rate phone line charging an extortionate rate for absolutely nothing at all. Please take care and be wary of any unexpected phone calls. If you receive a call and you think it is fraudulent then please report it to Action Fraud at this link: https://www.actionfraud.police.uk/contact-us

Two elderly residents in the Clevedon area have been the subject of serious fraud. Both received telephone calls stating they were police officers - one from Luton and the other allegedly from Bristol. The supposed officers were very persistent and even asked one of the victims to call 191 to check their identity with a colleague. This was a clever ploy, as the line had not been disconnected and the phone was merely handed to an accomplice. In both instances they were asked to attend their banks, and were advised by the fake police that they could get around the security measures / questions. On arrival the victims withdrew thousands of pounds between them, which was later collected from their homes by a courier. A password was given by the fraudster to use when handing the money over to the courier to make it even more convincing.

This type of fraud can occur anywhere, so always be wary of unexpected calls.

Never give out any personal details, especially financial account numbers or passwords.

If you have any concerns, hang up immediately. Contact the bank or organisation they claim to represent using a mobile or different phone in case the offenders are still on the line. Never use any telephone numbers provided by the fraudster.

Police will never ask you to attend your bank or withdraw cash.

Beware Amazon Scam Phone Calls

If you receive what you believe to be a suspicious email, phone call or text message from someone purporting to be from Amazon concerning your account, ask the caller to confirm their telephone number and the order or account number they are referring to. **DO NOT** give the caller any of your personal or financial details, but tell them that you are going to contact Amazon on-line to establish the nature of the problem.

Usually the caller will then hang up, but if they persist make a note of the conversation and then politely end the call.

Then go to **stop-spoofing@amazon.com** and report details of the call. Remember - Amazon never contacts a customer by telephone.

As we look forward to 2021, we need to think again what it means to follow Christ and to build our lives and communities based on mutual love, respect and service. 'For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many.'

May we all know the Lord's leading and guiding as we step out into a New Year.





Response to 'One Somerset' and The Future of Local Government in Somerset.

"We want to make it clear that the District Councils of Somerset do not support 'One Somerset' and the proposals for a single council for Somerset.

"The detailed work which the five councils of Somerset commissioned together clearly concluded that a single council was the wrong solution for the people and communities of Somerset.

"Somerset's District Councils have been focused in recent months on supporting our residents and businesses through the Coronavirus crisis. This remains our priority including focusing on how we help Somerset's communities and economy recover. However, as Somerset County Council is determined to push the debate on the future forward during the pandemic, as four districts we will now be putting our collective efforts to developing an alternative proposal. We have always said we would refocus on this when the time was right.

"We know we can offer a better future for the people of Somerset that reforms local government and is ambitious for our communities and their quality of life. Somerset does not deserve the cheapest local Government. Somerset deserves the best local government.

"We will develop the best plan for the future with the help and involvement of our communities."

Background Information:

Local government has seen big reductions in funding from central government and that means challenges for everyone.

At the same time, the challenges our communities face require urgent attention which cannot wait.

The key challenges for Somerset communities, alongside recovering from the impact of the Coronavirus pandemic, are:

- High rates of children growing up in poverty and poor social mobility
- Large numbers of struggling families
- Growing numbers of older people who are increasingly living in poor health
- The climate emergency
- Homelessness and the lack of genuinely affordable housing
- The economy including productivity, skills and wage levels

District Councils in Somerset have already undertaken radical change and as a result are financially sustainable, and able to protect services to communities without making cuts. However, we recognise that further change is required in the future.

A team drawn from the five councils of Somerset, including the county council, undertook further work on the options, and we agreed the well-trodden path of a single Unitary model was not the right choice for Somerset.

Our invitation to Somerset County Council to rejoin this joint work remains open. We will focus on a plan for widespread joint reform, that focuses on the needs of our communities.

Our aim is not to simply cut costs. Our intention is to find a way, to improve life for all residents in Somerset now and for the future.

Our communities do not deserve the cheapest local government. They deserve the best local government which will drive improvement in quality of life.

Just as Somerset County Council, we need to be invited by the Government to submit our plan for positive change in Somerset. If that invitation is received, we will consult with our communities on our proposals to help the people we serve, alongside partners in the NHS, police and more, shape the way our plans develop.

This will be a plan developed with our communities to create a better future for everyone in Somerset.

Hinkley Point C Community Bus Service

Free bus service between Bridgwater and Minehead after the Christmas holiday period, the service will re-commence on Monday 4th January.






