

ROM REV CLIVE GILBERT, Vicar of Williton and Watchet

A couple of months ago as I stood on the bridge near St. Peter's Church I saw an amazing sight. Suddenly a brilliant flash of blue shot from beneath the bridge and there it was: a kingfisher, which flew down the river and out of sight - they really are amazing birds and incredibly beautiful.

Celtic Christians have always fully appreciated the links between creation and their faith. God set us here in this world and has given us the responsibility of being stewards



of his creation. Ann Lewin says that the writers of the psalms, together with poets and those who write prayers, can express our wonder and delight in God's creation. The poet W.H. Davies wrote: "What is this life if full of care, we have no time to stand and stare..."

Do you delight in creation? Do you make time to stand and stare? Do you wonder at the beauty of the world in which you live - in the beauty of a butterfly or kingfisher, or are you too busy to see them? For me I know I need to take time to observe the beauty of the natural world and to enjoy and marvel at it, and marvelling at it I ponder on creation and see God's hand at work within it.

I rarely feel closer to God than when I walk out and away from the town or village and walk slowly listening to and looking at the natural world around me. It's at those times that I then feel close to God and know his presence. Perhaps you could try it for yourself? Maybe that walk might bring you closer to God.

Chief Seattle of the Sioux, a Native American leader, said, "This we know; all things are connected. Man did not weave the web of life; he is merely a strand in it. Whatever he does to the web, he does to himself. You may think that you own god as you wish to own our land; but you cannot. He is the God of all human beings....... the earth is precious to him, and to harm the earth is to heap contempt on its creator." (Chief Seattle in a speech, 1854)

I pray that in coming closer to his creation, we might all come closer to God.

October brings the dark nights again and is therefore a good time to think about security. Lights on in the house and curtains open at dusk allow people to see all your belongings, so do remember to close the curtains and lock the door. However, remember to take the keys out of the inside of the lock if you have a care alarm. Keys in the back of locks stop the front of the lock from working. If you try to open it from the outside with another key, you can break the lock - trust me, I speak from experience here!

Halloween can be stressful. You do not have to open your door to 'Trick or Treaters': feel confident to lock it and report issues to your PCSO or parish council.

On another security conscious note, cyber security and scams are not going away. If in doubt, do not open a suspect email, even if it purports to be from someone you know - and don't click on any links. As for phone scams, remember that banks never ask for your account details. Always put the phone down and contact your bank independently, to report and find out if there is an issue. If you think you have been scammed, report it immediately to the person it reputedly came from e.g. the bank or a friend's hacked email through a different means e.g. text a friend if you think their email is hacked or phone the bank on a separate number. Call Contact a Citizen's Advice Scams Action adviser by calling 0300 330 3003 and call Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 or use their online reporting tool. Dial 101 and ask for support if you need it. Consider using a banking app or online banking so that you can see what is happening to your bank account at short notice.

Sometimes calls are a nuisance because they are cold selling calls and you just don't want them. Consider using an answer phone which allows you to hear the person speaking the message so you can decide whether you want to pick up or invest in a call screening system from your provider such as BT Call Guardian. Remember if you agree to buy something and change your mind, you have a 14 day cool off period to cancel any agreement. Generally it is best to ask for details in writing rather than agreeing directly on the phone.

Enjoy the cosy dark evenings in front of the fire and enjoy the autumnal beauty and harvest festivals and other lovely Autumn get-togethers. Check your parish magazine for local events and groups you can join and don't forget to see if you can apply for a warmer homes discount from your electricity or gas provider from 14th October if you are on a means tested benefit.

Simon Hilditch was only 62 and was a shining example of the tenacity that we all must have to make it through the day. His sense of humour, sharp wit and kindness will always be remembered. Parkinson's gave Simon a really hard time and Simon was constantly trying to outwit its effects, but in the end it was

We have been reviewing the goals of the WASPS. We wanted to be a community based group offering support to people with Parkinson's The membership grew from 18 to almost 60 with new members joining us. As we all know that an ever expanding group takes a lot more time and energy for the people coordinating. Since we were amalgamated with Parkinson's we had to abide by the rules and regulations, which is only fair. Volunteers are encouraged to attend workshops to guide them through handling various events. It was getting too much for the WASPS, especially for me as the coordinator. I have wanted to step down and let someone else become coordinator, but no one person came forward. We all wanted the WASPS to continue and came up with an idea that we could be a committee based group. This idea was disallowed by Parkinson's. We had to have a coordinator or the group would have to disband. They would help us to find a coordinator, but we felt that the next coordinator must come from the WASPS. The end result is that we cease to be affiliated with Parkinson's on December 31st 2019 and on 1st January2020 we become the WASPS, a committee based group just the way we wanted. We will still meet, as normal, on the first Thursday of every month and carry on as usual. Of course we will obey the rules of the Data Protection Act. We have discussed this at length with Parkinson's UK and it has been an amicable split. We recommend that individuals become Parkinson's members as you get a lot of information about Parkinson's. So the WASPS will continue just as they have since February 2013: the WASPS are here to stav.

Our next meeting is on Thursday 3rd October with exercises starting at 1:15 and the regular meeting starting at 2pm. This month we will have a guest speaker giving information on 'Getting your garden ready for Winter'. If you suffer from Parkinson's or are a carer please feel free to come and join us. We are very grateful to the Post Office for their help.

Residents in the Exmoor and Quantocks area including West Somerset communities such as Williton, Monksilver, Stogumber and Triscombe, are invited to a free Two Valleys Community event to promote Natural Flood Management. The event will run on Wednesday 16th October at Williton Pavilion, starting at 10:30 am with sessions running into the evening.

The event is open to all local residents, and a 'local larder lunch' and afternoon tea will be provided.

The event will give people the chance to hear from, and speak to, experts in Natural Flood Management (NFM) who will talk about NFM and the financial help from government that could be available to local residents and landowners who have suffered from flooding or want to receive advice on how to better manage water on their land.

NFM has already proved effective in slowing and storing surface water run-off that is threatening residents in Yarde, Stogumber and Triscombe. Following on from this success, the plan is to use a similar approach for those land or property owners whose run-off water drains into either the Monksilver or Doniford streams.

The morning session will explain what NFM is, and there will plenty of opportunities to ask questions of the experts. In the afternoon, and on into the evening, there will be drop-in sessions including interactive workshops, group discussions as well as a film screening.

The event is being organised jointly by the Wildfowl & Wetlands Trust (WWT), and the Environment Agency (EA), who are delivering the Defra-funded scheme. ROCK CAKES

8 oz plain flour 2 oz lard

Pinch salt 4 oz dried mixed fruit 2 level teaspoons baking powder 4 oz demerara sugar ½ level teaspoon mixed spice 1 large egg beaten

½ level teaspoon ground nutmeg Grated rind of half a lemon

2 oz butter Milk to mix

Preheat oven: 200°C, 400°F, Gas 6


Grease two baking trays. Sieve together the flour, baking powder, salt and spice. Rub in the fats, add the fruit and the sugar, mix well, add the egg and enough milk to make a stiff dough. Using two forks, place the mixture in small rough piles on the baking trays and bake for about 15 to 20 minutes, then cool on a wire rack.


TA/EATHER - AUGUST






