The other day I walked with my son over the hill from Watchet towards Danesfield School. The last time I remember doing this was when I was about thirteen years old, prior to that I remember running half way up it from Danesfield before turning right into a field and heading towards Doniford on school cross country runs – something I dreaded and would have done anything to get out of. I am sure I was not the only one. Always half way through the run I recall gasping for breath and going weak at the knees; I was never a strong runner and afterwards how I disliked running the

gauntlet in the girls open shower room. I remember too envying a friend who ran like the wind, her feet hardly seeming to touch the ground.

So, imagine my surprise and delight when this time I actually had my eyes open and could see the scenery surrounding me. I have to say I was taken aback. Never before had I realised that there was such a panoramic view from the top of the hill. My goodness, what a wonderful sight, the Quantocks, the Brendon Hills, Exmoor and, sweeping back down towards Watchet harbour with the majestic line of fir trees along the playing field, reminding me of a scene from a long forgotten foreign holiday, the view over the sea to Wales.

Perhaps I never realised what was here all the time because I was so wrapped up in my own misery – that of being forced into cross country running that I never thought to lift my eyes. How much more must we miss when we become self-centred rather than broadening our perspectives? I am reminded of Psalm 21. 'I lift my eves to the hills – from where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.'

My son was so taken with the view that he suggested we went back at dark to see the lights. I can honestly recommend this too, and you may also be lucky enough to hear an owl.

### UNDRAISING MEAL for Rohingya refugees

We have all seen reports of the Rohingya people being forced to leave Myanmar and become refugees in Bangladesh. These people have nothing and are living in terrible conditions. Shah and his team from the Bengal Spice restaurant in Williton are planning to go out to Bangladesh in December to take much needed provisions and medicines to them.

To help raise funds for this cause there will be a fundraising meal at the Bengal Spice on Tuesday 5 December arriving at 7.30pm to eat at 8pm. ### OADWORKS A39

The A39 is due to be closed for roadworks for 3 weeks from 6 November for 350 meters east of Dragon Cross. According to the Highways Department it will be shut between 9.30am and 3.30pm, and open at weekends. The official diversion route takes you through Raleghs Cross and Wheddon Cross and down the A396 through Dunster back to the A39. There are other roadworks also taking place on the A39 between Williton and Minehead during the same period, including night closures. But the road should reopen in time for Dunster by Candlelight. ### ROM YOUR VILLAGE AGENT, IZZY SILVESTER

With winter approaching, are you dreading the sound of the electricity bill coming through the letterbox? If you are lucky enough to have gas, well, that will make the same noise...

Saving energy means saving money, so now is a good time to get some good habits – not filling the kettle too full when you're only making a cuppa, turning off lights and appliances when you don't need them, or turning the central heating down a bit and putting on a cardigan. It all helps!

An easy way of seeing just how much energy you are using is to have a SMART METER installed, then you'll see in pounds and pence just how much it costs to boil a kettle full of water. It will also mean an end to balancing on a chair to read the meter, or having a big credit balance if you pay by direct debit.

Installation is straightforward, a phone call to your energy supplier will get you an appointment for the engineer to fit the SMART METER. It takes about 2 hours, and the supply will only be cut for a short time. The meter is replaced and you get a little display unit to show you how much gas and electricity you are using in pounds and pence. The engineer will have a photo ID card, and won't try to sell you anything – the SMART METER is FREE. You will also get a booklet of energy saving tips, to help keep your bill down. If you have gas, the engineer will also check gas appliances for safety.

Most people can have a SMART METER, even if you have a prepay key meter. There are accessible displays if you might have trouble reading the standard display unit. It doesn't use the internet or the existing mobile phone signal. The SMART METER simply sends your meter reading to the supplier, and you get accurate bills.

To get a SMART METER, please phone your energy supplier.

### **RECIPE FOR THE MONTH** by Shirley Dee

### **AMERICAN BROWNIES**

2 large eggs 3 tablespoons cocoa powder 8 oz (200 g) caster sugar ½ teaspoon baking powder

2 oz (50 g) melted butter Pinch salt

2 oz (50 g) walnuts, roughly chopped ½ teaspoon vanilla essence

3 oz (75 g) plain flour

Pre-heat over to: 180oC / 350oF / Gas mark 4

Well grease an 8" square tin. Whisk the eggs and sugar together until the mixture is thick and creamy. Beat in the butter and vanilla essence, sieve in the flour, cocoa, baking powder and salt and fold into the mixture with the walnuts. Turn into the prepared tin and bake for approx 35 minutes. When cooked leave in the tray for ten minutes, then cut the brownies into squares and remove from the tin while still warm.

It is always good to see a lot of smiling focus and that It is always good to see a lot of smiling faces, and that is just what I see when I start the regular monthly meeting. The reason is simple, they have participated in the 45 minute exercise class run by Jenny Manvell and are now relaxed and ready to get on with the meeting. It is really amazing to see the benefits of exercise so clearly demonstrated. We know that it will not cure us of Parkinson's, but it will help us to fight back and to take back control of our lives.

Deb Withey and I went to a Research Information Day at Buckfast Abbey in Devon and came away with some very positive information. There are quite a few research projects going on in the Southwest. We are able to participate in this research which might one day find a way to help us slow down or ultimately stop Parkinson's in its tracks. One of the key points that was made is that if newly diagnosed people with Parkinson's are given information and start exercising they stand a much better chance of reducing and/or delaying the effects of Parkinson's.

We have come a long way in a few short years. Many new support groups have been formed and there is so much information available to those diagnosed. Unfortunately there are as many different forms of Parkinson's as there are people who have it. This makes it very complex and hard to deal with but that does not deter researchers from looking for a way to fight back and hopefully one day a cure will be found.

Our next regular meeting is on Thursday 2nd November at the Danesborough View Common Room in Williton. Exercises start at 1:15 and the main meeting starts at 2pm. WILLITON PAVILION PROJECT UPDATE
Following a review of the tenders received, we can now confirm that, subject to agreement of the required contract terms and conditions, Harris Brothers & Collard Ltd (HBC) has been selected as the preferred contractor for the construction phase of the Project. HBC are a company located in Bridgwater and they have recently completed the build of Wembdon Village Hall, which can be seen if you travel through Bridgwater towards Junction 23 of the M5. HBC provided the most compliant and affordable solution. Their pricing was at the top end of our budget and we will need to wait and see if we can secure enough of the remaining contingency to remodel the old building as part of this phase, We are currently optimistic that we can and as our fund raising activities continue, we believe we will secure the balance of the budget required to complete the works.

The planned activity is due to start by the first week of November and by the time this edition of the Williton Window is published, the construction phase may well be underway. A leaflet will go out to those living in Robert Street to advise them of the start date for the Project. Completion is currently scheduled for October 2018.

We are sad to announce that after about twenty years of fund raising within the village, Di Hooper and Mo Mossman have decided to call it a day with their regular table top sales and coffee mornings at the Parish Offices. Both Di and Mo have been instrumental in raising many thousands of pounds toward the Project. Their presence within the village will be sadly missed by many who just drop in for a chat and a coffee. Di plans to carry on fund raising in the new Pavilion later next year by selling pitches to traders and providing teas and coffee for those wishing to stop by.

We are now working on a new website for the charity with the Pavilion having its own section. This will include all relevant data about the building including, size of rooms, facilities on offer, hire arrangements and charges for the coming year. We hope to launch the website around January 2018.

### **C** EPTEMBER WEATHER


