■ We all know that Christmas can be the loneliest time of year for some people, especially when the bad weather reduces their ability (and willingness) to leave the front door. The great Christmas get away can mean that people are left on their own without visits from friends and family and so may be more in need of a visit.

There are lots of local events in your area such as Carol Singing and Christmas Markets. Perhaps you could invite an elderly neighbour to join you at one of these events?

Waste and recycling always come under strain at this time of year with all that present unwrapping. Another large headache is the number of Christmas trees that need to be chipped after the event. Go to page 26 of this month's Williton Window for all information about recycling over Christmas and New Year.

Remember to save energy and save money!

As I write this, it is definitely feeling a lot colder, even a frost some mornings, so it's a good time to think about reducing your energy use. Wasting energy is easy, but so is saving it and that saves you money!

There are lots of ways to save energy – like boiling the right amount of water for a cuppa, or fitting energy saving light bulbs. Washing clothes at 30°C uses a lot less energy and saves time as well as money. Save even more by turning the light off when you're not in the room.

If you have central heating, turn the thermostat down by one degree – this can save £80 in a year. You need to be comfortably warm, but not hot.

Leaving electrical items like the TV and computer on stand-by wastes lots of money, and so does leaving things like phones and toothbrushes on charge when they are fully charged. It will usually only take a couple of hours, not overnight. Turn them all off at the wall and SAVE MONEY!


There will also be many other Christmas activities, including a craft day and the traditional Christmas dinner.

The market will be The market will be held on Friday 15 December between 9 and 11.30 in the Parish Council Rooms, Killick Way. We sell fresh produce, flowers, eggs, preserves, jewellery, crafts, greetings cards and seasonal gifts.

WILLITON PAVILION PROJECT UPDATE
On Monday 20th Mourealt VV On Monday 20th November, work commenced on the Robert Street entrance into the recreation ground. This aspect of the project involves major ground works and, in consequence, the lane and footpath into the ground will be closed to the public from Monday 27th November 2017 until Monday 8th January 2018. It will be open sooner if the works are completed earlier than planned. This phase requires that the earth bank is excavated, the electricity pole relocated and most of the mains services installed. Installing the gas supply will also require the closure of Robert Street for a short period of time.

Our contractor Harris Brothers & Collard Ltd (HBC) has informed all the residents affected by the works and signposts have been placed at all three entrances into the ground.

This work is required before HBC can access the ground with the necessary plant equipment to commence the construction.

The design team at HBC has been working on the floor plans, looking at the detailed design and working with building control. This work has raised an issue with regards to the layout of the foyer and we have had to have a rethink on the position of the stairs and required fire doors. Other than that, the building remains as is, although as we move forward, we should expect other design issues to arise.

During the work, emergency contact numbers will be displayed on the site and in the Parish Office window.

The working group is also active and we will soon complete our research on hire charges for 2018-19. This, along with an indication of our expected operation costs, will allow us to set and agree the hire rates for the coming year. These will be made available on our website.

Work on the new website continues and we hope to be operational by January. We are also looking at setting up a Facebook page and also exploring the use of other media sites to promote the building.

We will provide details of the construction program in the January edition of the Williton Window, along with details on public access into the ground from

RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee

APPLE RUM MERINGUE FOR SIX

4 oz (100g) ratafia biscuits 4 oz (100 g) soft brown sugar

4 tablespoons white rum 3 egg whites

1/4 level teaspoon salt 1½ lb cooking apples

1 oz (25 g) unsalted butter 3 oz (75 g) granulated sugar 3 oz (75 g) caster sugar ½ level teaspoon cinnamon

Cover the base of an ovenproof flan dish with the ratafias and pour the rum over them. Peel, core and thinly slice the apples into a saucepan, add the butter, cinnamon, brown sugar and 2 or 3 tablespoons of water. Simmer until the apples are just cooked. Leave it to cool, then spoon the apples over the ratafias. Beat the egg whites with the salt until stiff but not dry. Stir in the granulated sugar and beat for about two minutes or until the meringue mixture is smooth and glossy. Fold in the caster sugar and immediately spoon the meringue over the apples in the flan dish. Swirl the meringue into soft peaks. Bake for about 10 - 15 minutes on gas mark 4, oven 350°F, 150°C until pale beige. Serve hot or cold with ice cream.



7 OLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR PIONEERING MUSGROVE STUDY

Eating (DAFNE) or similar.

Taunton and Somerset NHS

NHS Foundation Trust

A ground-breaking research study at Musgrove Park Hospital, led by Musgrove consultant Professor Rob Andrews, aimed at helping people with type 1 diabetes safely exercise is appealing for volunteers in Somerset to test it. The study includes a new course which provides people with information so that they can exercise without upsetting their blood sugar levels. The Musgrove EXTOD Education (Exercise in Type One Diabetes) team needs to recruit 50 participants to trial the programme under their supervision. Participants can be any age from 18-70, and should either be doing more than 30 minutes of exercise twice a week, or have signed up to a sporting event in the next six months. They also need to know about counting carbohydrate intake, by having been on a course such as the Dose Adjustment For Normal

Professor Andrews is being supported by experts from his team at the hospital and the University of Birmingham and the University of Exeter. Volunteers will need to attend eight appointments over an eight month period. Travel expenses will be covered and the EXTOD team hope to begin the trial – the second phase of the study - at the end of February.

Revised collection days above also apply to assisted and clinical waste collections.

Garden waste collections will not take place Monday 25 December - Friday 5 January, resuming from Monday 8 January 2018 on usual days.

Decoration-free natural Christmas trees under 6ft should be composted. Take to your local recycling site or, if you pay for garden waste collections, put them out on your usual garden waste collection day from 8 January. (As a very last resort you can send your tree for landfill burial. Place next to your refuse bin on your usual collection day between 8 - 19 January 2017).

Recycling centres are closed on Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day. Open all other days on their usual schedule. Vehicle permit conditions apply as usual over the festive season. All recycling sites accept only debit or credit card payments for disposal of soil, hardcore, tyres, gas bottles, vehicle parts and commercial waste, and to purchase Revive compost. Asbestos and plasterboard disposal is by online pre-payment. Crewkerne and Dulverton community recycling sites' £2 entry fees are by cash.

RECYCLE FOIL IN YOUR BLACK BOX
Somerset residents are being urged to renew efforts to recycle aluminium foil. To make that easier, all foil can now be recycled in the same box – usually the black one – as food and drink cans. Somerset Waste Partnership (SWP) wants to collect all aluminium foil, such as from take-away containers, trays from festive mince pies, lids from some food packaging, and clean aluminium wrapping from Christmas cooking. Metallised plastic foil, such as pet food pouches, cannot be taken. To check, squash the foil - if it springs back, it is plastic based and not recyclable. At the end of your washing-up, rinse foil used for food to remove the worst of any contamination, scrunch it all together so it will not blow away, and add it to your black box so it can be easily spotted by the collection crew.






