

OUR VILLAGE AGENT, IZZY SILVESTER village community



Plenty to do this December I have compiled some ideas to get you thinking about ways to keep you safe, healthy and entertained during the darkest month.

Make sure you get out and about! The darkness and bad weather are very isolating and it is easy to stay in and then realise you haven't seen anyone in an age! Keeping in touch and making friends via community activity reduces isolation and also means people are thinking of you and will miss you, should you have an accident. We have a listing of local Christmas events on our website https:// somersetagents.org/somersetchristmasevents/or call us on 01823 331 222. Perhaps you could take an elderly neighbour with you?

Get out in the light. Take a lunch time walk and expose some skin to soak up some daylight. This helps regulate your sleep patterns so you feel less tired in the winter. The NHS suggest there is not enough sun to supply your vitamin D however, so we need to get our vitamin D from food sources (including fortified foods) and supplements.

Free Flu Vaccination Check with your GP to see if you are eligible for a free flu vaccine or buy one from your pharmacy. Even if you don't feel you are in an at risk group for flu complications, by protecting yourself you minimise spreading infection to others who may be more vulnerable than yourself.

Watch out for Scams: This is the time that fraudsters increase their campaigns. With stress and rushed purchasing, people are less likely to spot a con. Watch out for counterfeit goods which could be potentially dangerous and counterfeit websites which do not have the HTTP// or the lock symbol. Sometimes it is placed on the website and not on the address to catch you out. Some websites are dressed up to look like a big brand so watch out for small differences. Fake holiday offers are also rife, as are phone calls about your phone or internet being cut off.

The Family Invasion! Preparing for your extended family visiting can also be stressful. Pre-plan with the family so everyone knows what to expect; perhaps reduce present buying by having a "Secret Santa" scheme so everyone gets one present rather than one each from everyone. Sharing the cooking load by getting family to bring dishes can help, as can getting guests to bring their own duvets. Put away any fragile objects or special toys so younger children don't cause upset and have house rules such as out of bounds teenage rooms to reduce friction. Don't forget to remove any sharp equipment, climbing temptations (including cords on blinds), dangerous liquids and medication from sight and height.

Don't be alone: If you are on your own at Christmas, join a volunteer group such as the Salvation Army, Crisis, Shelter and Do it. You will need to check this early as some charities require training and so will expect more commitment than help on Christmas day only. Perhaps you have space to entertain a guest who may be on their own at Christmas. If you are alone and unable to volunteer, ask us if there is a Christmas Lunch in your local area that you can attend.

T PETER'S SCHOOL DIARY

This half term is always busy with the lead up to Christmas and, of course, exciting, as there are lots of different activities going on. In the next few weeks our Christmas production will be our main focus, with the whole school rehearsing. First a look back over the last few weeks.

Ash Class have been learning all about animals this term and they talked about the lack of food available for birds during the winter months, so decided to make bird feeders to put in their gardens. First, the children threaded wholegrain Cheerios onto pipe cleaners and tied them into a loop. Next, they drizzled the Cheerios in honey and rolled them in bird seed. Hopefully, more birds will appear in their gardens now! They also thought about the features of amphibians and how they have adapted to live in water and on land. The children used this learning to design their very own amphibians with legs to walk on land and gills to breathe under water. What creative thinkers in Ash class!

Fir Class paid their respect to the soldiers in the World Wars by creating their very own poppies to put on a class wreath. The children carefully painted cupcake cases in green and red paint to create a powerful wreath which they presented in the Remembrance Assembly in front of the whole school. In science the children learnt about John McAdam and how he invented a different road surface called macadamisation; later tar was added to the surface and is now known as tarmac.

Our year 3 and 4 children attended a workshop in aid of Remembrance Day. Two historians presented props and information to the children, including a firing canon! The children enjoyed understanding the meaning behind Remembrance Day.

Yew class have been learning how to write a newspaper report in English and studying maps of the local area in Geography. This has included sketching and model making. These children have the main parts in the Christmas play, so are busy learning lines too.

Happy Stars, our nurture group, have been thinking about all of the soldiers who fought in the wars and made their own poppies. On Friday 8th November they went on a sponsored wellie walk to raise money for their own special Christmas party and fortunately the sun shone, making it even more fun!

Our PTA announced they had received an amazing £7662.06 through the Co-op's Community Fund. Every penny of the money raised will go towards the new outdoor area, not just completely covering the cost of the build, but allowing them to buy essential equipment and resources for all our children to use. A huge thank you to everyone for supporting this cause. After school on Friday 13th December it will be our Christmas Fair organised by the PTA and everyone is welcome to join us. SG

RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee **ICED CHRISTMAS PUDDING (FOR 8)**

8 oz (225g) mixed dried fruit 3 eggs

2 oz (50 g) halved glace cherries $4\frac{1}{2}$ oz (140g) caster sugar 5 tablespoons brandy 10 fl oz (300 ml) double cream 3/4 pint milk 5 fl oz (150ml) single cream

Preheat oven: 300°F, 150°C, Gas mark 2

Place the dried fruit and glace cherries in a bowl and spoon over the brandy and leave to soak for 2-3 hours. Bring the milk nearly to the boil. Beat the egg whites with the sugar until well mixed. Pour on the milk and cook over a gentle heat without boiling, until the custard coats the back of the spoon. Cool for 30 minutes. Whip the creams together and mix with the custard and the fruits and brandy mixture. Turn into a large bowl and freeze for two hours until mushy. Mix well and put into a 3 pint (1.7 litre) pudding basin, lined with non-stick paper. Freeze for 2-3 hours until firm. Take out of the freezer about 20 minutes before serving. Turn out and decorate with a sprig of holly. Serve immediately and enjoy. (Put into two smaller containers if there aren't 8 of you.)
