





Last Minute Christmas Puddings

150g (5oz) Self Raising Flour 75g (3oz) Bramley Cooking Apple 25g (1oz) Chopped Roasted Hazelnuts 2 Medium Sized Eggs 110ml (4fl oz) Irish Stout 1 level tsp Baking Powder Grated zest of 1 Orange & 1 Lemon

8 Greaseproof Paper Circles

454g(1lb) Jar Mincemeat 175g (6oz) Currants 50g (2oz) Softened Butter 75ml (3fl oz) Black Treacle 2 tbls Dark Rum

1 rounded tsp Ground Mixed Spice

8 Individual metal or foil pudding basins

8 Squares of Baking Foil

Preheat the oven 180C (350F Gas Mark 4)

- 1. Peel, core & chop up the apples.
- Sift the flour, baking powder & mixed spice into a large bowl, then add the butter, eggs, treacle, Rum & Stout then mix with an electric whisk.
- 3. When fully mixed add the mincemeat, apple, currants, nuts, together with the grated lemon & orange zest.
- 4. Mix together using a wooden spoon, then divide the mixture evenly between the 8 well buttered pudding basins.
- 5. Cover each basin with a well buttered greaseproof circle, followed by a square of foil, which you fold under the rim of the basin using a pleating motion to seal.
- 6. Place the basins into a shallow roasting tin. Pour in about ½ inch of boiling water into the roasting tin and cook in a pre heated oven for 45-50 mins.
- 7. Allow to cool for 10mins before running a knife around the edges and turning out onto serving plates.
- This recipe can be made using a 2 pint pudding basin and steamed for 2 hours on the top of a hob.
- Mixture can be made 24 hours in advance and stored in the fridge.
- Suitable for freezing after cooking. Allow the pudding to completely defrost before reheating in the oven for 25 mins. Janet Cook

As you may be aware, the government has now invited Somerset County Council to submit its business case for local government reform in Somerset. There are currently two proposals - one from Somerset County

Council (One Somerset) and one from the four district councils - on the table for submissions. One Somerset would see the county council and four district councils replaced by a single, new council. The article below sets out the case for **One Somerset**.

One Somerset: Together we can work as a united team

Somerset: It's a county of contrasts but it works as a whole - not two halves. If asked where you are from, you may say your town or village, your county. It's vour identity.

That's just one of the reasons why One Somerset, a single new council for the county, works. It makes sense. It unites Somerset as a single team with a strong and clear voice and sense of place and belonging.

All are agreed that the current, three-tier system (county, district and town or parish) is past its sell-by date, that reform is needed and that unitary is the way forward. It makes sense that it's a single unitary under one Somerset flag.

The plans have been developed with the people who know Somerset – like the County Council teams who provide three quarters of local government services and city, town and parish councils who are right at the heart of communities.

Together we can: work as one in a crisis. Since March, Somerset like the rest of the country, has been rising to the challenge of the pandemic. But it shouldn't take a crisis to bring Somerset together – such as flooding or coronavirus. When these happen, it takes time to bring every council, agency or organisation on board at a time when we can least afford to delay.

As a single council Somerset would have one strong response from Day One, harnessing the strength of our long-established partnerships with health, care, education and blue-light services.


Together we can: realise ambitions. One Somerset is aiming high – it's about making life better for people in Somerset with people in Somerset. It's giving people in their city, town or village the power to do more at the grass roots. Local Community Networks would bring parish/town/city councils together with the unitary council as well as voluntary and community groups. Together we can get things done.

Together we can: keep supporting the mums-to-be, the vulnerable children, adults and families and deliver quality services that ensure ALL people, whether young, old or somewhere in between get the respect and care they need.

Together we can: invest in Somerset with a unitary bonus of £18.5m each year. This is cash that can be spent on issues that really matter from addressing climate change to caring for the most vulnerable. One Somerset' sums add up: the savings are realistic.

Together we can: stay as Somerset. One Somerset doesn't want to split up the county, build a new bureaucracy or create more confusion. One council equals one strong Somerset voice, one point of contact for customers and one, Somerset united team to serve the residents, communities and businesses. Together, we can. Christmas already! Who would have thought it? At the close of this very strange year we are sorry that we have not had service trains running since the first couple of days in January. At that time we were looking forward to an exciting new timetable with galas and special events, but it was not to be. However life goes on and despite the current lockdown (mid November) we have been able to continue working parties every Tuesday morning since July. This is something which is not possible to do from home!! Early in November the Quantock Belle carriage set, which had been sitting in platform two all the summer, was removed back to it's home at Bishops Lydeard, and this left a large patch of weeds which have had to be removed and by the time this is read in December that should be complete. I am pleased to say that the new roof on the Lamp Room has now been successfully fitted and it looks very smart. The walls of the hut will now be repaired and repainted ready for the New Year.

The West Somerset Railway has been planning for some time to run Christmas Santa trains, as I mentioned last month and, subject to government permissions, I am showing the revised running days and times of departures. UNCERTAIN FUTURE FOR TALKING NEWSPAPER

The future of the West Somerset Talking Newspaper, a local charity which has provided regular news broadcasts to blind and partially sighted persons since 1980, looks uncertain unless a group of new persons come forward before the end of the year to take over the administration of the non profit making charity. The newspaper has been unable to operate since March

2020 due to stringent Covid 19 restrictions, particularly because tapes and discs cannot be sent to vulnerable persons.

Chairman Roger Hurst stated that the current group of unpaid trustees will retire from the charity in 2021 when the lease for the rented studio in Williton expires. He added, "This group, myself included, have administered the newspaper for many years and we feel the time has come to retire and seek a new committed team to either take on the existing operation or to form a completely new local Talking Newspaper". Mr Hurst added that the existing newspaper currently has 40 blind and partially sighted clients who would normally receive fortnightly local news broadcasts by arrangement with the Free Press. "With the continued uncertainty of this dreadful pandemic it has given us the opportunity to assess the situation and we feel now is the time to seek out a group of 6 or more persons with fresh ideas and fund-raising initiatives to take over the helm if the newspaper is to survive. It currently costs approximately £3,000 per year to run the charity, which includes studio hire and equipment purchases, and any new group would need to bear this in mind before considering taking on the challenge" he added. "The bottom line is, however, that unless a new team of trustees is found before the end of this year, we shall regrettably look to close the newspaper in 2021"

Mr Hurst concluded "Whilst the time has come for me to also stand down from a commitment I have enjoyed I would, of course, be more than happy to give advice on finance, equipment etc to any persons who feel they would like to consider taking on this challenging but worthwhile cause whether it be by way of taking over the existing charity or by starting a completely new Talking Roger Hurst can be contacted on 01984 640060 Newspaper in the area."

Rainfall in Williton was 140mm. Oh and the gales, the worst on 29th winds of 50/60mph.





INN FOCUS

One particular aspect of life that I particularly miss in these difficult times is a visit to the local pub. Whether it be for an occasional meal, Sunday roast, quiz night, skittles or just putting the world to rights over a couple of drinks with friends, or whoever is present at the time. For centuries pubs have been a fundamental part of social life. Back street boozers, gastro

pubs, village locals have all characterised our country and are world renown. Each has an individual character and appeal. In Williton we are fortunate to still have three excellent pubs, each with their own individuality, between them catering for all tastes. But across the country pubs have been closing at an alarming rate for the last thirty years, with over 13000 closures since the year 2000 - a quarter of all pubs at that time. The BBPA (British Beer and Pub Association) estimated pub closures at 37 per week between 2016 and 2017.

Contributory factors in this decline have been the ban on smoking since 2007, the recession of 2008 and changes in drinking habits, especially in the younger generation. But high taxation is a major factor. Pubs have to pay VAT on all the food and drink they sell whereas other outlets including supermarkets don't, giving them an unfair advantage. In addition the duty on beer according to its strength puts on average another 52P on each pint. The other big factor and possibly the biggest have been the exorbitant rents charged by the big pub chain companies (Pubcos) on their tenants. Also the "Beer Tie" with these companies forces tenants to buy particular beers at a much higher price with penalties if they purchase elsewhere. This has led to pubs being sold for housing or supermarkets as they become unviable for the tenant, the pubco apparently more interested in selling to developers than in the pub trade or the community affected by the closure. Losing pubs is particularly felt in rural areas. Over the last decades villages have lost their local industries, schools, shops, libraries and even churches, leaving the pub as the only social outlet. Many villages now have no pub or bus service so become isolated dormitories. Property values can also be adversely affected. Potential buyers like to know that there is a pub nearby – whether they use it or not.

The Covid pandemic now threatens to become an even bigger cause of pub demise. Many pubcos have continued to charge rent while the pubs were shut during lockdown and even after reopening in July pubs suffered from vastly reduced customer numbers in order to comply with social distancing and associated regulations. Some, including a few in villages close to us here have already closed with their future uncertain. The advent of the second lockdown brings more anxiety. Yet throughout the land pubs have met this challenge head on and adapted to benefit their local communities during this emergency. Take-away meals and even free delivery was a godsend to some of us endangered species (vulnerable). All manner of support has been reported, acting as food banks, shops and providing help and support for the 'at risk' in their communities.

Whilst the future remains uncertain, there was a glimmer of hope until paused by Covid. For the first time in many years the number of pubs and bars in the UK actually increased in 2019 by 315, mainly small bars or 'micropubs'. Being small in size means lower rents and no 'beer tie' means beer can be bought from any brewer at a competitive price. Generally consisting of one room the emphasis is on conversation, with no electronic music or similar distractions. There has been a steady increase in micropub numbers since their conception in 2005. In recent times more and more pubs have become independent and pubco owned pubs have halved in number since 2003. Pubs have adapted themselves to suit local needs, some adding the role of village shop to their portfolio. Others host part time Post Office facilities or have converted outbuildings into cafes or tearooms. These and other socially motivated innovations have confirmed their status as community 'hubs'.

Organisations such as the Campaign for Pubs, the British Beer and Pub Association and CAMRA (the Campaign for Real Ale) all help in supporting pubs. They have many initiatives backed by large membership, lobbying MPs with petitions such as opposing unfair tax rises and the 'beer tie'. One such issue about to be debated in parliament is changes to the Small Brewers Relief (tax) which could be disastrous for independent brewers at an already difficult time for small enterprises. The knock on effect would also increase prices to pubs and their customers. To follow progress on this and other licenced trade issues or developments see the web sites for the above organisations.

So, what can we look forward to? At the time of writing we cannot be certain of current restrictions being lifted after four weeks. Pubs depend on the Christmas period as a major part of their annual income. So much depends on how events unfurl in the coming weeks. The community needs pubs and pubs need the community. Research from the University of Oxford suggests moderate alcohol consumption may improve wellbeing, due to the social interaction involved in having a drink with friends at the pub. I could have told them that! The effects of lockdown on mental health are becoming more apparent so social outlets are actually more of an essential than not.

Hopefully as and if the situation improves I hope to report on how our much loved social venues progress out of this predicament. Other related topics can include local pub origins and history as well as news on individual pubs (sports, games events etc.). Then there is also the local cider industry, breweries and distilleries – all part of the Inn scene. Meanwhile let us raise a glass at home to those who have just succeeded in developing a potential vaccine against Covid. A very big thank you and Cheers! FORUM 21 HELP WITH ENERGY BILLS AND HEATING

As winter approaches, we can advise on ways to reduce your heating costs.

The surviving winter grants will be available again for people over 50 on low incomes who find it hard to pay winter bills. We can also help with the Warm Home Discount from your energy supplier, for eligible people, and low cost logs from our community woodland. If you are thinking of switching, we can let you know which companies are not in the warm home discount scheme.

A number of home improvement grants are now available offering a variety of measures to make houses more energy efficient, and we can let you know how they work and how to apply for them. The Eco and Eco flexible grant schemes offer various types of insulation and improvements to heating systems for people on low incomes. Some things are free and others may need a contribution from another source of money, and they must be installed by an accredited installer in order to get the funding. Home owners get more help but tenants can also apply. The new Government Warm Homes grants, up to £5000 or £10000, have introduced funding for measures that was not previously available, for example old homes that could not use the loft and cavity wall grants, and for people who want to install renewable heating systems such as heat pumps. Secondary measures such as glazing and doors may also be included. However, care must be taken to ensure that the company used is part of the scheme and that the work done will not lead to higher bills because it was not suitable for that property. 


