



ROM REV KATHRYN FLENLEY

These dark days of winter can be very depressing, can't they. We are reluctant to get up in the morning and then having to pull the curtains in early evening reminds us that we have a long time to wait before we can turn the clocks forward. Yet, as I write and look at the watery sunset, snowdrops the vanguard of Spring are gradually opening up their pearly-white petals. Sometimes known as the Fair Maids of February they remind us that hope does indeed spring eternal in the human breast as tradition has it that snowdrops instil

new confidence and courage within our minds.

As our political and economic landscape is set to change as we prepare to leave the European Union, we are unsure of what opportunities and challenges lie ahead. We hope for confidence and courage in our leaders and stability in our nation so that all can flourish in a society that cares for each individual, whatever their circumstances.

This word 'hope' can appear to be a bit wishy-washy. 'I hope it is going to be fine tomorrow' can mean that I don't particularly think it is going to be, but I'll hope for it anyway. Yet, without hope we descend into despair. Those snowdrops, piercing the bare earth, have been pushing away silently underground without any visual indication that they are at work. That's what hope is like – it looks forward to a brighter future as yet unseen, towards which we all have a part to play, however seemingly insignificant. St Paul puts it this way, 'Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.' So, just like the hidden flourishing of the snowdrop's shoots, we can spread hope like spring sunshine, sharing words and deeds of kindness that will spring up and inspire confidence and courage in those around us.

Or maybe you could be a coordinator, which would involve receiving requests by phone (WHEELS mobile phone provided) and organising lifts for 5 days once a month Again, please do get in touch.

RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee Crunchy biscuits with a chocolate topping

125 g unsalted butter, softened
110 g light brown soft sugar
110 g caster sugar
125 g unsalted butter, softened
126 g unsalted butter, softened
127 g unsalted butter, softened
128 g unsalted butter, softened
129 g unsalted butter, softened
120 g self raising flour
120 g self raising flour
120 g self raising flour

1 beaten egg 175 g milk or white chocolate chips

Chocolate bits and pieces to decorate

Cream the butter and both sugars together until pale and fluffy. Once creamed add the egg and mix thoroughly. Add the flour and salt to the mixing bowl and mix thoroughly. Then add the vanilla extract and chocolate chips and stir through. Roll the mixture into a long thick sausage shape and wrap in cling film to hold its shape. Place in fridge to harden for about an hour. To bake, pre-heat the oven to 180oC, 350oF, gas mark 4 and line two baking trays. Cut the dough into 1cm thick rounds, place on the trays well apart, bake for 8-10 minutes until just setting. They should be brown on the outside but pale in the middle. Remove from oven and immediately place a chunk of your favourite chocolate bar in the middle of each biscuit, so it slightly melts as the biscuit cools. Leave in the tray for 5-10 minutes, then transfer them to a wire rack. Store in an airtight tin and eat within 5 days.

In January the Parish Council set its budget for next year which starts on 1st April when your Council Tax will be due. There are fewer households paying tax this year which means increasing the rate to raise the same amount. Despite this, the Council's budget can be covered by a rise about the same as inflation. Other authorities financed from Council Tax are the County and District Councils, Fire Service, Police and Somerset Rivers Authority. Please bear in mind that most of it goes to the other authorities. For a Band D property only £100.56 of it goes to the Parish.

Two vacancies on the Council have been filled by people who want to be involved in helping to provide a service for the community. They did not need to be elected. All they had to do is fill in a form and hand it in to the Parish Clerk. It gets put before the Council and it usually means co-option at first try. Jean Stanford has joined us and Rosemary Woods has returned to the Council. Why not apply for one of the remaining vacancies? We are a friendly bunch and always pleased to welcome new people with fresh ideas. Welcome to Jean and Rosemary.

In the budget there is money for "projects", things councillors put forward to be done next year. The list includes a vehicle speed indicator device or SID for short. Simple, buy one and fix on a post somewhere! Well not quite. Highways have to approve the position of the posts. Those are still in place from when Highways financed SIDs. What type of device is best? Does it only show if a vehicle is too fast or display the actual speed? Should it record the speeds for statistical purposes? What does it cost? How much does it cost to train an installer to work safely on the highway? Our Clerk or her Assistant have limited time and councillors have to help by looking into its feasibility. It is not always understood how long this can take. However, anything that reminds us, me included, of our poor driving habits that endanger others and ourselvesmust be worth doing.

It has been reported that food waste is being left on Bellamys Corner. Whilst we understand bread for feeding the birds, it is not appropriate to leave vegetable peelings! Please could food waste not be put out, otherwise we will have a vermin problem!

Unfortunately they don't stop, so please be wary of anyone trying to sell to you by phone or the internet, anyone trying to get your bank details, or trying to gain entry to your home as bogus service engineers etc. One of our councillors is looking into setting up a Scam Marshall scheme. More about that in future.
