

ROM CLIVE WOOLDRIDGE - METHODIST CIRCUIT

I had an interesting experience last week while on retreat in Cornwall. On the first evening I was seated next to Rev. Steve Wilde, who was hosting the event. He apologised to me for arriving late and explained that he had been dealing with a very difficult matter, in which he and various other leaders of the church in Cornwall were being accused of underhand behaviour by a member of a local church. Steve had agreed to meet the man to calm things down, but instead of the man being placated he had become more and more unwilling to listen. Steve didn't tell me what they were accused of but said that, as far as he knew, the whole accusation was silly and no wrongdoing had occurred. What should have been a situation which was quickly resolved became a major incident which had taken up his whole afternoon.

In the end, Steve had been able to shake hands with the man and pray with him, but he admitted to me: "How hard it is to love your fellow man sometimes." This, though, is exactly what Jesus told us to do when he instructed us not only to love our neighbour but to love our enemies and pray for them.

Our Christian discipleship is not easy, because Christ calls on us to go against our natural inclination and turn the other cheek. If someone as good as Steve Wilde found this a difficult thing to do, those of us who are not as good must find it a real challenge; but that challenge is exactly what we are to try to overcome as followers of Jesus.

To continue this theme, this morning on breakfast television I saw a very interesting piece about Random Acts of Kindness, when people carry out little acts of kindness to strangers, such as leaving sweets and chocolate paid for in a vending machine, with a note asking people to help themselves. Researchers have found these acts have health benefits both for the person committing the act and those receiving the kindness, with people smiling for the rest of the day. The word "Ractivist" has been coined and we are all encouraged to do likewise - surely a twenty-first century way of loving others!

As we move away from Christmas and towards Easter, may you be touched by the Holy Spirit and through God's grace may you be blessed by a new way of dealing with others, to love your enemies and, by doing so, make the world a more peaceful and better place.

TEW TEXT NUMBER TO COMBAT RURAL CRIME

Avon and Somerset Police launched a new text service on 17 January, to help prevent and detect rural crime. The police are asking rural communities and businesses to help by providing information and intelligence about suspected crime in their area. This new number will allow the public to text information directly to the Rural Crime Team, who will be able to assess and action the intelligence quickly and efficiently.

Inspector Joanna Mines, from the Rural Crime Team in Somerset, "We want to hear from anyone who has information about any suspicious or potentially criminal activity in their area, for example - details of people / vehicles seen behaving suspiciously, potentially stolen goods or livestock being offered for sale either to the public or at markets, sightings of stolen vehicles etc."

The number won't be monitored 24/7 but the team will look at it when they are on duty. It therefore shouldn't be used for reporting crimes, or anything which requires an immediate police attendance. In those circumstances please dial 999. The new number is **81819**. You can still pass on information via the independent charity Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.

RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee

SIMNEL CAKE

4 oz (113g) sultanas 6 oz (170g) butter 3 oz (85g) chopped mixed peel 6 oz (170g) caster sugar

3 large eggs 1 - 2 tablespoons of milk 8 oz (225g) plain flour 1 lb (450g) marzipan 3 - 4 tablespoons apricot jam

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon 1 teaspoon ground nutmeg 1 beaten egg for glazing 12 oz (340g) currants 7 inch / 18cm lined cake tin

Cream the butter and sugar together and beat in the eggs gradually. If the mixture starts to curdle add a little flour. Sieve the remaining flour with the spices and fold it in, then add the fruit. Mix to soft dropping consistency with a little milk. Put half the mixture into the tin and level it off. Divide the marzipan into three and roll out one third to slightly smaller than the tin and lay on top of the cake mix, cover with the rest of cake mix and level it off. Place in a pre-heated over and bake at 170°C / 325°F/ gas 3 for one hour, reduce the heat to 150°C /300°F/ gas 2 for two more hours or until the cake is firm to the touch. Allow to cool in the tin before turning it out, leave on the lining paper, wrap in foil and store for at least two weeks.

When required, unwrap the cake. Heat the jam. Roll out one of the reserve pieces of marzipan into a round to put on top of the cake. Brush the jam over the cake and press in the marzipan, fluting the edges. Brush with beaten egg. Make the remaining marzipan into small balls, press them into the top and side of the cake and brush with beaten egg. Place cake under grill and brown it, then cool. Use the rest of the marzipan to shape a nest, brush with egg, coat with chocolate strands, place it on top of the cake and fill with little Easter eggs. Enjoy!

DOWN AT THE STATIONWe have had a busy month getting on with repainting. Some people have asked whether we are changing the colour scheme - NO! It is just that we get a better finish with these undercoat colours. The redecoration of the toilets is nearly completed as well, really bringing home how much it was needed! One of the long benches in the waiting room has been re-upholstered, where the springs had come away from their restraints. Hopefully it will now last for many years to come.

Preliminary planning is in place for the visits of The Flying Scotsman in May and September. We understand the May trips being organised by a tour company are already fully booked. Tickets for the WSR trains in September will go on sale online on March 14th. It would be good to have some more volunteers in place before then!

Anyone who has travelled to Minehead will have seen much activity at the level crossing, where a large section of the line is being completely relaid. Sometime, probably in the autumn, the crossing itself will be replaced.

Half-term trains have been using only the three car DMU diesel, travelling from Bishops Lydeard to Watchet only. Several people have taken advantage of the special combined trips to visit Snowdrop Valley at Wheddon Cross.
