

■ Before entering the ministry I was a teacher. I remember in school assemblies at this time of year someone would reiterate the old saying 'March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb.' The saying dates back to the eighteenth century, where it was coined by Thomas Fuller in his book, 'Gnomologia'. The saving refers to the month of March being the transition between winter and summer, often starting with storms before becoming milder towards the end of the month. The converse has also been used: 'If March comes in a like a lamb it will go out like a lion.'

Interestingly, the saying has been shown to be untrue if it is taken to be a specific weather predictor, with studies failing to find a correlation between especially bad weather at the start of March and good weather at its end - or the converse. However, this saying may refer to the constellation of the stars. At the beginning of March, the constellation of Leo, the lion, is on the eastern horizon at sunset. By the end of the month, the constellation of Aries, the ram, is on the western horizon. This is an interesting idea, but fails to take account of the saying occurring specifically in meteorological folklore.

The saying also has biblical connections. John the Baptist, at Jesus' baptism, calls him the 'Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.' In the book of Revelation, when Jesus' coming again is written about, he is called 'the Lion of the tribe of Judah.' So Jesus is known as both the 'Lamb of God' and the 'Lion of Judah.' Given that the Bible does not make any connection between these titles for Jesus and the weather, perhaps it is best to take the saying at face value, however inaccurate it may be.

Given the storms that we suffered during the month of February this year, I hope that we will all have a much more calm and peaceful March... and whatever happens with the weather. I pray that God will richly bless you as springtime approaches once again.

The Quantock Foodbank is still exceptionally busy after a very challenging Christmas period managing huge quantities of gifts being brought in, whilst trying to pack for food parcels going out. During December we packed 67 decorated Christmas carriers containing seasonal food and chocolates which had been donated to make the usual parcels more festive. The number of families being referred is nearly four times greater than last year and 465 bags have been packed during December and January. Since the Foodbank opened in November 2018, we have supplied food and household items to nearly 2000 people, 900 of these babies and children.

Those who are in receipt of food parcels are very grateful to all of you who regularly contribute and make their lives a little easier to bear. Thanks are also due to the volunteers who have put in an enormous amount of hard work and extra hours to satisfy the high demand.

The shelves are fairly well stocked at present, with the exception of tinned fruit, potatoes, sweetcorn, carrots and cold meat. Thank you all for your continued Marlene Mason support.

Ash Class have been innove Ash Class have been innovating their Talk for Writing text 'The Magic Porridge Pot'. The children substituted parts of the original story, such as the characters, setting and magic item, with their own imagined ideas. One member of the class substituted the magic porridge pot with a magic golden bowl that makes delicious chocolate gold coins when you say the words 'cook, little golden bowl, cook'. As well as changing the story, the children have been focusing on how to write accurately using capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, Fred finger spelling and writing on the line. They have produced some AMAZING innovations that have been written with care and accuracy, we are so proud of their perseverance and independence. The most independent learner each day is awarded the 'Independent Bear' and it is safe to say the whole class deserved the bear after this piece of work!

Elm class have been learning the value of money and how the principle of this is strongly linked to the place value work they did in the autumn term. The children have been learning how to write a newspaper article linked to their story 'Sandy Cove'. Their next focus in English will be poetry. The starting point is a poem by Kit Wright called 'The Magic Box'. The children will innovate the poem by thinking about what they would like to include in their version of the poem, the delicate swish of a butterfly wing, warm woollen mittens in the soft snow, or wild geese that fly with the moon on their wings.

Ash and Yew classes went over to Danesfield to visit the space planetarium and had a great time learning about all of the different planets in our solar system.

Yew class also visited Croft House Care Home, where they enjoyed singing songs and chatting to some of the residents.

On 12th February, we had a focus on road safety. The whole school came off timetable to learn about how to keep safe when crossing the road, or exiting cars near a busy road. We have been concerned about the safety of the children during drop off times as drivers often drive too fast past our school, or park unsafely, making it hazardous as visibility is compromised. As well as doing class work, the children spent some time outside by the road side to practise crossing the road safely.

Happy Stars, our nurture group, is like a big umbrella with lots of different sections for different children's needs under it. One group of children have been learning the story massage program, which Mrs Brooks and Mrs Rutt are both trained in and are both working towards the best practice award. RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee HOT SAUSAGE SALAD FOR FOUR

1 tablespoon olive oil 16 cherry tomatoes 1 pack sausages 2 little gem lettuces 1 roughly chopped red onion 1 large avocado 1 heaped tablespoon whole grain mustard 1/4 cucumber

1 tablespoon light brown sugar 1 tablespoon red win vinegar

Heat the oil in a deep frying pan (or wok if you have one). Snip the sausages into four and put them in the pan. Add the onion and fry for a few minutes until brown, stirring occasionally. Spoon in the mustard and sugar, tip in the tomatoes, and cook for a few more minutes, until the tomatoes start to split and the mixture is covered in the mustard glaze. Separate the lettuces into leaves. Peel, stone and slice the avocado. Halve and slice the cucumber. Mix them all together and pile on to a platter. Spoon the hot sausage mix on top. Stir the vinegar and a tablespoon of water into the pan, dislodging any sticky bits, and spoon the pan juices over the salad and serve with crusty bread.

We have been very busy at the Parish Council throughout the winter, organising contractors and working on behalf of the parishioners.

The Open Day for the clubs and organisations in Williton was very well attended on Saturday 8th February at the Pavilion. Good to see so many people attend and hopefully some found a new hobby or group to join (I did). A big thankyou to all the volunteers for setting all the tables and chairs up then putting them all away again. Tea and coffee was served and great cakes were available. Well done to everyone. The Parish Council had a stand giving information on various plans that concern the village and the work of the council. Now some good news about The Steam Coast Trail (SCT) - it is coming to Williton.

This project was initially conceived ten years ago by local environmental group, Forum 21. Although the original name 'Cycle West Somerset' has changed, the concept has remained the same, to create a breath-taking network of multi-user paths around West Somerset, weaving together walkers, runners, cyclists, mobility scooter and wheelchair users through glorious coast and countryside.

The ultimate aim of the SCT is to link Minehead all the way to Williton. With two phases complete, the project is gaining momentum and exponential community support; in 2019 alone the two paths recorded a total of 70,500 trips, around a quarter of which were cycle journeys.

Phase One: Completed Dec 2016, 2.2km of beautiful beachfront path running from Dunster Beach (almost!) to Blue Anchor—this path saw 6.500 trips in August 2019 alone.

Phase Two: Completed September 2018, just over 1 km of new path linking Old Cleeve (Dragon's Cross) to Washford. This path avoids a notoriously dangerous stretch of the A39 and opens up previously inaccessible countryside, and with fantastic views of the heritage trains!

A further four links are in varying stages of feasibility and concept design:

Phase Three: link the Phase One path all the way to Blue Anchor.

Phase Four: link Watchet to Williton via Doniford. Phase Five: link Minehead to Dunster Beach.

Phase Six: link Washford to Watchet.

An exciting project which deserves all our support.
