It is known that patients and all health and care staff are eager to find out when they will receive their COVID-19 vaccination. The NHS is prioritising vaccinating those people who, experts have agreed, will benefit from it the most and they are systematically working through all eligible groups according to the national priorities.

Please do not call or turn up at your GP surgery or the local hospital to enquire about COVID-19 vaccinations.

People are asked to support the NHS:

- By not contacting GPs and health services about vaccinations. You will be contacted when it is your turn to be invited for your vaccination. Some phone lines are jammed with people asking about vaccinations and this is preventing people who need help from getting through.
- When contacted, please attend your booked appointments
- Please continue to follow all the guidance to control the spread of the virus and save lives.

Please continue to attend any appointments as planned – if there is a requirement to change any details for your vaccination appointment you will be contacted directly.

Somerset: Dog Thefts 28/01/2021 9788



Dear Readers,

There were two incidents where dogs were stolen during the night of Tuesday 26 January. On both occasions pure bred dogs or new-born puppies were taken from secure outside pens. One incident was in Alveston, South Gloucestershire and the other at Oueen Charlton in Bath & North East Somerset. Whilst both of these were outside of our area, this does not mean it could not head our way and it is far better to be forewarned.

We want to remind all dog owners to review and increase the security of their pets wherever possible. Ensure that they are microchipped and registered, and make sure your garden is secure.

It is estimated that dog thefts have increased by 250% as the COVID-19 restrictions have caused a huge demand for puppies across the country. Although these offences are classified as "Theft", losing a pet in this way can cause enormous trauma and heartbreak to a family.

BT TELEPHONE SCAM 01/02/2021 9788 SOMERSET



Dear Readers,

One of our schemes from North Somerset has kindly notified me of an old scam that has reappeared.

Here are the basics of what you need to look out for and be aware of: A caller will state they are from BT, and you have an unsettled balance on your account of £***, you will be disconnected if immediate payment is not paid and the bill will rise when reconnected at a later date.

When challenged, they provide a false name, last used was 'John Peacock' and a strong foreign accent was detected, the caller states they can prove they are from BT and goes through a process where they pretend to disconnect the line momentarily. The recipient is asked to end the call and try and call someone else which they find is not possible. The reason this is not possible is the caller had initiated the call and only they can terminate, they simply mute the phone to make it appear they are not there, this gives the impression the line is dead. When the Scam caller hears you stop trying to call out, they will clear the line and call you back giving the impression they have reconnected your line.

AT THIS POINT YOU MAY FEEL REASSURED THIS IS GENUINE, IT IS NOT.

If in any doubt call your provider and check with them, never hand over your bank details to someone that calls you out of the blue.

National Insurance Scam

Mobile Number Used: - 07760164081

On 2nd Feb the above number (recorded message) called one of our residents (a retired police officer) on 2nd Feb 2021 claiming to be from the National Crime Agency, stating they had identified him via illegal activity on his phone and although the voice did not specify what these offences were it stated that failure to respond would result in his National Insurance Number being cancelled and him being arrested.

This is an attempt to obtain your National Insurance Number in order to commit identity fraud. It's an old trick using a modern system so just hang up and NEVER engage in any dialogue with these people. No branch of any law enforcement agency would ever contact you in this manner. PC.

If a tree outside your house needs pruning, please-contact see below*. Maintaining a hedge is the responsibility of the landowner. If a hedge encroaches on a highway and causes a hazard or an obstruction, the landowner is expected to cut the hedge back. If a landowner fails in this duty and this inconveniences highway users, Somerset County Council can serve notice on the owner to ensure the hazard or obstruction is removed.

When you contact Somerset County Council please provide the following Information (if available):

- Your name and phone number, in case they need to contact you.
- The number on the street light column.
- Where the street light is, including the road name and area.
- Whether the street light is outside a specific property.

When you report a faulty street light Somerset County Council will inspect it as soon as possible. Repairs are normally carried out within 5 working days but where lights are not working because of supply cable faults this could take longer.

When are my items due back?

All items on loan, but not overdue, have been automatically extended to at least 31st March 2021. If your items were overdue before 25th December 2020, you will need to review these via your library account.

Return dates will be extended again if necessary, to ensure items borrowed are not due back until after Lockdown 3 is lifted.

You do not need to visit a library to return items at present.

Remember, all returned items are quarantined for at least 72 hours and remain on your account until the quarantine period is completed. Items are backdated to the date that you returned them.

The total rainfall was 96.5 mm.



JACK HURLEY, MBE

Editor of the Free Press from 1970-80

John Edwin Hurley (always known as Jack) was born in 1913 at Williton, which was always to be his home. He

attended the village school and went on to win a scholarship at Huish Grammar School, Taunton, proceeding to become the first ever junior reporter on the West Somerset Free Press in August 1930 at a weekly wage of eight shillings. He then went about his business on a bicycle, staying on the staff for over 50 years to become chief reporter, news editor and finally editor, a remarkable record of service to local journalism for which he deservedly was awarded the MBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours in June 1981.

Jack was a friendly, understanding man and although extremely busy (like his predecessor Norman Cox) his office door was always open to all, no matter of what standing. I was accepted as a compositor apprentice on the printing staff of the West Somerset Free Press at Williton by the then managing editor, Mr. F. N. Cox, in 1948 and remained on the printing staff at the Free Press until my retirement in 1998. During my employment I saw tremendous changes in production and, among others, had the privilege of learning much from Jack.

During his Army service in the Second World War Jack was involved in what was to be the biggest news story of his life – yet not a word of it was allowed to be printed! He was travelling on a train from Taunton back to his Army billet at Exeter when it was involved in a horrendous crash near Bradford-on-Tone, just outside of Taunton. Luckily for him, Jack survived unscathed, but unfortunately there were numerous terrible casualties, among them many Service personnel, especially sailors and marines returning to their south coast bases. The powers that be decreed that it would be bad for British morale if the incident was made public, so a complete blank-out on it was ordered. Therefore Jack lost his news scoop of a lifetime.

In 1963 Jack succeeded Herbert Kille as the writer of Notes by the Way, the weekly West Somerset Free Press column of chat and miscellaneous information. Jack then had an inspiration, and the Exmoor sage named Will Widden was born, to be found at the foot of his weekly column of Notes. Will had a variety of associated cronies, such as Arnie Bladderwick, Toby Tribble, Garge Gurnet, Taum Trobey, Lizzie Lukins, etc., all of them aired in Jack's deep local knowledge of accents and dialect, vivid abbreviated grammar and variety of expression. A kind of "verbal shorthand" Jack called it, examples being "Cassen go?" and "I know he's inther 'caus I sidden come out!"

The *West Somerset Free Press* was first published in July 1860 at Williton by Mr. Samuel Cox, a Watchet-born man. During his editorship of the *Free Press*, Jack Hurley introduced a major change to its style by putting news on its front page on 12 May 1972.

Jack also wrote books, among them being Microstudies for the Exmoor Press. These included Murder and Mystery on Exmoor, Legends of Exmoor, Snow and Storm on Exmoor, Exmoor in Wartime and Rattle His Bones. However, Rattle stood out from the others, because it provided Jack with space for original research into the history of the Poor Law, with particular application to the two local workhouses of Williton and Dulverton.

Fond of amateur dramatics, Jack worked with the blind playwright Phoebe Rees, who wrote The White Dove of Bardon; and he was a member of the Nettlecombe Players when they won the Sybil Thorndike Trophy. He also enjoyed appearing as a rustic "Jan Stewer" at Williton's former annual concert, which was always performed to packed audiences at the village's Church Room (now demolished). Much amusement was aroused by Jack's puns on some of the well-known locals, but his comments were always accepted with good humour.

Jack was always keen on sport, but his major passion was for music. He was an accomplished organist and played the organ at Williton Methodist Church for over 50 years, or on more than 5,000 Sundays. While reckoning up statistics, he once said that, by the time he retired as editor of the Free Press, he had written more than 20 million words! During his journalistic career Jack reported on countless meetings, court hearings and inquests, concerts and plays, soccer matches and many other items, besides contributing his vast local knowledge to many articles.

Jack died on 2 December 1983, aged 70 years. He left the unique legacy, especially to his beloved West Somerset, of being able to transcribe even the dullest subject into fascinating reading.




Short Story Writing Competitions

Early collections from February

COVID continues to put pressure on recycling and rubbish collections. We and our contractors are doing everything we can to keep disruption to a minimum while keeping staff and public safe.

We continue to take a precautionary approach to limit contact and minimise risk: for example, crews work in tightly-controlled team bubbles and the whole bubble isolates when a member is symptomatic, has a positive test or is in contact with someone who tests positive.

This inevitably means far higher staff absences than expected, as well as unpredictable daily changes as team bubbles isolate or return to work, and crews are reallocated to maintain all services.

In the first three weeks of January, COVID contributed to the loss of nearly 800 operational days – compared to 58 in December.

We are also taking a very precautionary approach to bringing in extra agency staff to cover shortfalls. That adds to the strain on crews, many of whom have been working long hours for a long time.

With current pressures set to continue, we are taking additional steps to protect crews, help them manage the workload and maintain services.

Extra steps from Monday 1 February

6am starts for collections, rather than 7am

This early start will further reduce contact between team bubbles as crews have staggered starts over a longer time. It will also allow them a head start on work that may take longer if staff are absent

Residents have understood and supported early starts in the past, such as the 2019 heatwave and to avoid specific traffic hold-ups.

Householders will need to put recycling and rubbish out by 6am – or the night before. We will start communicating this from today, Wednesday 27 January. Initially this will be for a month and will be reviewed to see if it needs to continue.

We will not immediately return for some missed collections

We will not take such decisions lightly, but staff absences will sometimes make it impractical to return for missed recycling or garden waste collections the following day. In these cases, residents need to take containers in until their next collection.

Rubbish collections will not be affected and any missed recycling collections would be prioritised the following week, with extra recycling taken. We will communicate as widely and as soon as possible with affected areas when decisions are made not to return, through social media and updating key stakeholders.

We ask for your patience and would encourage you to follow the SWP Facebook page @somersetwaste for the most up to date information. Continued on next page Continued from previous page

We have updated our online system for missed collection reporting so residents will know when we will be returning.

A wide range of safety measures and options are already in place for collection crews and depot staff.

These include working in bubbles, minimising contact with colleagues and customers, use of PPE, and careful hygiene.

SUEZ has a rigorous approach to tracing any contacts and isolating bubbles of staff should there be any suspicion of COVID.

We support staff who choose to wear masks, providing them with reuseable masks and guidance for safe use. All staff have full work PPE, including gloves. Note: Government guidance does not recommend face masks for the operational waste sector. It inevitably leads to frequent touching of the face which carries its own risks when constantly handling waste.

As well as working in closely monitored small team bubbles, collection crews - where possible - meet their driver at an agreed point each day rather than at a depot. There is a rigorous and effective approach to tracing contacts and isolating bubbles when necessary. Note: guidance acknowledges that social distancing may not be possible inside vehicles and we encourage crews to keep their windows open to allow a fresh airflow.

All staff are encouraged and helped to maintain high hygiene standards, with hand sanitisers freely available at all locations and to crews on the move, as well as washing facilities, including those on the new recycling vehicles. At depots, safety steps already include screens, one-way systems, and spaced starts, which will be extended from 1 February. Additionally, crews clean down their vehicles cab and touch points at least three times a day and this is regularly monitored by our supervisory team. Somerset Waste Partnership






