TROM REV MIKE SHERBURN, WATCHET BAPTIST CHURCH

Skiddaw was the first mountain I ever climbed. My dad was climbing it on a Lake District family holiday and so I went along – he loved climbing mountains. And discovering vast beaches, too. I remember feeling awestruck by the enormity of Harlech beach, when I went as a teenager with my family to Snowdonia. My dad and I played cricket there. (It's the rules: you have to play cricket if you find a big beach.) Over the years, we found lots of mountains and beaches. We skimmed stones on Scottish loch shores and climbed Brandon Mountain in Ireland. On one occasion, Dad drove us from our Norfolk home to Snowdonia at Easter time, where we stayed in a tent and climbed two mountains in two days before heading home again!

It's more than 15 years since my dad died – so now I take my children up mountains and to discover fantastic beaches.

Just before I got married, Dad and I had a day out. We drove across country to see the abandoned road under the shadow of Mam Tor in Derbyshire. And it struck me that this trip wasn't special because of the destination (although it was amazing), but because of the time spent together on the journey. Travelling together made it special.

Williton is a place of journeys. The ribbons of road that run through it,

and its railway station, make it a special place. A place of comings and goings. A place that is a significant landmark for many people of their journeys. If you've travelled from far away to holiday at Minehead, Williton says that you're nearly there. If you travel in to work at Williton Hospital, this is where you come to make a difference.

Journeys are a huge part of what it means to experience humanity. Lots of them are physical, but not all. As we travel, those we travel with often become more important. I've recently been reading a book about the songs that pilgrims sang hundreds of years ago on their way to Jerusalem, a journey often made with friends and family. The songs these pilgrims sang (The Songs of Ascents, Psalms 120-134) include one about how God watches over every coming and going. For Williton, a landmark place that is filled with comings and goings, that's so important. All the journeys of life have God watching over them. That doesn't make them easy – it certainly didn't for the pilgrims – but it did mean the pilgrims had confidence that someone was always walking with them.

From your village agent,

village & community agents

We are all aware that there is an increasing strain on our finances indivi-

dually, for the county and the country as a whole. Universal Credit can cause debt through changing payments from advance to arrears forcing people to find a month's rent and childcare ahead, reduced payments for disabled people and a 6 week wait before your first payment. All this alongside the continued cuts to central government and Somerset County Council services leads more people into reduced circumstances.

If you are struggling with finances, it is important to seek help and not try to ignore it. Advise your utilities and rent providers to let them know your circumstances and to find out if they can support you with this. It is vital that rent and council tax are paid, but repayment plans for other debts may be available. Do look at www.moneyadviceservice.org.uk and www.moneyadviceservice.org.uk<

Check what discounts are available if you are on benefits, such as the warmer homes discount on electricity and gas bills, BT basic and reduced water bills. You may still be able to save money on car and home insurance and utilities or by changing from an expensive TV and broadband package to freeview and finding alternative exercise plans such as a jogging group over a gym membership. Remember to check your contract in case there are exit fees. I can assist you with doing this if you need a friendly person to help!

If you have debt problems, do talk to Christians Against Poverty, who will support you in finding a repayment solution tel: 0300 328 0006. You could also try local advice such as Wiser Money in West Somerset. Contact Maria Taylor Wiser Money Mental Health Caseworker Mobile: 07925233462 or email: maria.taylor@mindinsomerset.org.uk or go to the West Somerset Advice. Phone them on 01643 704 624 to get an appointment.

Cheap and safe loans are available through credit unions www.findyourcreditunion.co.uk. There are several across Somerset.

If you need support in regaining skills to get back into work, do ask me about the Positive People Program where you will work alongside a navigator who will help you overcome obstacles to finding work.

Visit one of our Talking Cafés where one of our agents will be available to direct you to support suitable for your circumstances. They run in Minehead at the Beach Hotel every Monday from 10-1.00. I am available on Tuesdays in the Williton Pavilion from 10-12. Remember it is always better to talk and get ideas and support from others, rather than keeping it to yourself.

Surviving Winter grants are available for older people living in Somerset, who are unable to adequately heat their homes. If you are struggling to afford to heat your home this winter contact me for more information.

Please phone me Izzy Silvester your village agent on 07931 018045, leave me your name and number and I will ring you back. Or e mail me on izzy@somersetrcc.org.uk . I work Monday to Thursday.



T PETER'S SCHOOL DIARY

It was lovely to have a break, to be able to rest and recharge before continuing the term and the lead up to Easter. We have World Book Day and Science week to look forward to and, as well as enjoying dressing up on World Book Day, we will be launching a sponsored read supported by Usborne Books. Last year this was extremely successful and we received £1000 worth of new books for the school. Hopefully we will be able to match this or maybe exceed it this year! Now back to earlier in the term.

Oak class have been learning all about different types of transport for their topic work. The children have taken part in a variety of activities. They really enjoyed taking part in a traffic survey at the front of our school, they made cars and designed a vehicle and made it from junk modelling. They will be finishing off with a visit to the moon for a picnic inspired by the story 'Whatever Next!' by Jill Murphy.

Ash class have been having lots of fun with plants over the last few weeks. The children have sketched and labelled parts of plants, planted seeds, beans and bulbs, and created some dance movements to show the life cycle of a flowering plant. In computing they have looked at e-safety and have created some wonderful posters to share safety messages.

Elm class produced some amazing artwork during their Rainforest Art Big Day. They continue to learn about animals including humans in science. More recently they have been learning all about how our muscles work and have practised using rulers for measuring in maths.

After learning the poem, they have had lots of fun experimenting with different words and phrases. When the model was plugged into a computer, if it had been correctly assembled and programmed, it would start drumming! The children could then investigate what would happen if different components were added to their programme.

This term the children have been swimming; everyone has become more confident in the water, had fun and improved their swimming skills. The class also visited Hinkley Point C, because last year they won a competition to name one of the boring tunnel machines. It was a fantastic experience.

FARMERS URGED TO BID ONLINE FOR FLOOD WORK
Farmers across Somerset are being invited to bid in the UK's first countywide auction for works to help stop flooding. The auction will be run online from February 26 - March 12 using a new Environment Agency web app, which can be found at www.nfmauction.org.uk.

The website offers Somerset farmers a unique combination of possibilities. First, to select for themselves different natural flood management (NFM) activities. Second, to pick out parts of their land where they believe those activities will produce the best flood prevention results for them and for local communities. Third, to bid for funding for those activities.

As the main purpose of NFM activities in Somerset is to slow the flow of water down through the higher parts of river catchments, the web app will not allow farmers to place bids for land in low-lying Internal Drainage Board areas, but the auction otherwise covers the length and breadth of Somerset.

After the auction closes, bids will be checked by the Farming & Wildlife Advisory Group SW (FWAG SW). Grants from Somerset Rivers Authority (SRA) will then be given to the best, most competitively-priced ideas.

C OMERSET WASTE PARTNERSHIP RECYCLING NEWS

Textile and shoe recycling: Wearable items can be sold on-line, swapped at swishing events or donated to charity*. Both wearable and unwearable items can be collected via recycling centres or kerbside collections. For kerbside, we ask that clothing and textiles (i.e. old towels, sheets and curtains, but excluding stuffed items i.e. duvets quilts and pillows) are put in plastic or compostable bags - not black sacks – and marked textiles. The materials need to be kept dry to maintain their value and stop mildew spreading when stored. Shoes should be tied in pairs. Clothing, textiles and shoes are primarily sent to JMP Wilcox & Co in the West Midlands, where items are sorted and graded into those suitable for reuse and those to be recycled into cleaning cloths, fillings for mattress and seats etc, or where possible, processed into clean fibres known as "shoddy" to be rewoven into new materials.

Textiles should **never** be put in a refuse bin to be sent to landfill. Natural fibres will rot potentially releasing gases and man-made fibres will simply remain intact. So, please use the kerbside collection services for damaged, stained or odd items, as well as for unwanted wearable clothing.

REMEMBER that adults' and children's clothes, shoes, hats, belts, handbags, ties and soft tovs are collected to sell to raise funds for the Williton Pavilion. Please contact Diane Hooper on 632497 to arrange collection or leave them at Diane's house - Roughmoor House on the industrial estate, next to Station Café.

FLAPJACKS (BY REQUEST)

100g (4 oz) block butter 25 g (1 oz) dark brown sugar 2 tablespoons golden syrup

200 g (8 oz) rolled oats Pinch salt

Melt the butter, sugar and syrup together in a saucepan or microwave, add the oats and salt and mix well. Put into a greased non-stick pan and cook in oven at 190°F, 375°C or gas mark 5 for about 20 minutes until golden brown. Cut into fingers while still warm. Tip: if you heat your tablespoon in very hot water the syrup will slide off easily.
