

FROM YOUR VILLAGE AGENT, IZZY SILVESTER

Do you want some advice about how to get back into work, education or training? Do you have a question about technology, for instance about social media, the internet, saving money online or how to use your mobile phone? Do you need help with aspects of health care, finance or housing?

The Community Council for Somerset has developed a range of 'Talking Cafés' where you can get useful information on all of the above. There will be people on hand who can give you advice from a range of professional agencies in an informal, relaxed environment. The Talking Café in Williton will be in the library from 10.30 am to 1pm on Wednesday 11 April.

On Friday 6 April, West Somerset Healthcare PPG is hosting a 'Living Better' afternoon at West Somerset House, Killick Way, from 1-5pm. Do come and find out what's on locally and who is there to help. Meet your Living Better nurse and your Village Agent. Find out about family support services, get advice from Police and Fire services, discover local fitness and leisure activities, find out about local charities that can give you free advice and help to save money. There will be free refreshments and a free raffle.

Some villages have the support of a West Somerset Advice Bureau member. Watchet has a member available at the Friendship café in the Sanctuary (Swain Street) on a Wednesday afternoon (3-5pm) and the Employment Hub in the Children's Centre in Williton from 10am to 12.30pm every Tuesday.

Spring may be the time for a clean and tidy, but for some this can be a struggle, either because you do not have the physical strength or because everything has got a bit on top of you. If you decide to get rid of stuff, there are many online Facebook buy and sell groups which are great because you can see if anyone wants your things before you lug them to a car boot. You can also advertise small items for free in local newspapers. Call me or Google the Somerset micro provider list for ideas of people who can help in other ways.

Everyone was notified as quickly as possible not to even try to venture out as it was too dangerous. I went over to the meeting room just in case someone arrived, but thankfully no one appeared.

On Thursday 5th April we will be holding our AGM at the Bicknoller Inn. It is interesting to hear a review of what we have done in the past year and our plans for the year to come. We continue to grow and with new people come new ideas and of course more support for those of us suffering with Parkinson's.

▼ ILLITON PAVILION PROJECT UPDATE

W March has been an eventful month, construction of the main steel frame commenced just as we were experiencing freezing temperatures and snow. Luckily, this quickly cleared and did not cause any significant delay. The main steel frame and upper roof level was completed on time and the flooring for this area should be completed by mid-March. Work will then start on the lower level sections of the building and the Pavilion will start to take shape.

During the month we also met with our partners West Somerset Council and EDF Energy for a project review. This was followed by the signing of the main contract for the construction phase of the project with our contractor HBC. This activity had to wait until the final design for the building had been agreed.

We have received some questions about the building and for clarification, the main hall will be 9M x 18M with a wooden semi-sprung floor, marked for badminton and there will be a temporary stage available that will be adjustable in height and size. The ground floor meeting room will be 7M x 5M and the first floor meeting room will be 6M x 4.7M.

The annual Parish Assembly will be held on 25th April at Danesfield School where we will give a detailed account on progress, along with an indication of some of the challenges we have faced and design changes that have occurred since work commenced.

We are pleased to announce that the website is now active, though still under construction. It will evolve as we move forward and hopefully by the end of April it will have all the required information available for the booking process. This will include an active calendar to allow potential users to see availability and the type of activities that are taking place.

With the Pavilion comes an opportunity for employment and the charity would like to hear from anybody living locally who would be interested in offering their services as a self-employed cleaner. The basic hours will be 2 hours per week on a Monday, though the job role will be a flexible arrangement and the total number of hours required each week will be based on the frequency and type of bookings. An hourly rate will be agreed with the charity which shall be reviewed on an annual basis. As the building will not be available until November, this is a request for information and an opportunity for somebody to register their interest. Nearer the time they will be contacted and invited along for an interview.

Also, as part of the Pavilion Project we made improvements to the War Memorial, most evident being the hard standing and CCTV. We have also upgraded the electrical supply within the building to support activities to be held on the ground. This work has been undertaken in conjunction with the RBL who have for a number of years maintained the garden within the gated area. At their request, the charity has agreed to adopt the garden and we are now looking for a volunteer who would be prepared to give some time, perhaps an hour or two a month, to tend the area and keep it neat and tidy.

Doniford Car Park. This is a subject that pleases no one, the imminent closure of Doniford Beach car park. It is a well used facility provided by Williton Parish Council. The Council finds itself in a difficult situation. The erosion of the shoreline is weakening the fence and the land to such an extent, that the fence needs to be repositioned back from the cliff edge by several metres. The result will be an unusable car park as it will be so small. There is also a hazard of masonry falling on to people or cars, evidenced by the crack in one of the lime kilns next to the car park. The lime kilns are not in the ownership of the Council. The Council has been told by its professional Health and Safety advisors that the car park is considered unsafe and it should be closed. The Council will do all it can to find an alternative place to park. Meanwhile, please be mindful of the narrowness of the road and poor visibility and not to make the situation worse by parking on the highway. Please also respect that the lane is the entrance to a private home and should not be used for parking. There is a public right of way from the highway to the concrete ramp down to the beach and this will remain as a pedestrian access only.

100th Anniversary of the Armistice. Plans are being made to mark the 100th anniversary of the Armistice. This year November 11th falls on a Sunday. A service to mark the sacrifice of the men from the Parish who gave their lives in the Great War and conflicts since then will take place at the War Memorial on the Memorial Ground, starting at 10.45 and to include the two minute silence at 11.00. When the service is finished there will be a parade from the Memorial Ground to St. Peter's Church. An interdenominational service will be held reflecting the wider consequences of war and all those both on the front line and the home front who were involved. A poetry competition is being organised for the students at St. Peters First School and Danesfield Middle School. Winning students will be invited to read their poems at the services. We want this to be a special event. It will need people to help plan it and run it on the day. If you are able to help in any way, please contact the Parish Clerk.

2 tablespoons Parmesan cheese 2 tablespoons of cream

2 chicken breasts, skinned Make ½ pint (250ml) cheese sauce,

using Parmesan cheese

Pre-heat the oven to 180°C, 350°F or Gas 4. Mix the breadcrumbs with half the cheese, coat the chicken with this mix and fry in the butter or margarine until brown all over. Add the cream to the cheese sauce and put half the sauce in to an ovenproof dish. Transfer the chicken to the dish and cover with the remaining sauce. Sprinkle with the rest of the Parmesan and bake for about 30 minutes until brown. Nice with small new potatoes and broccoli.


EBRUARY WEATHER






