





Quite rightly we are all encouraged to eat seasonal fruit and vegetables. I'd like us to think about eating seasonal bread. Hot Cross Buns seem to be on sale all year round. Now is the most appropriate season to eat them. In the past they were only eaten on Good Friday. Why? Because they have a cross on them to remind us of the cross on which Jesus died. They are spiced to remind us of the "spices" with which Jesus' body was embalmed for the three days that he spent in the tomb.

There used to be a retreat house in Kent in which there was a cross which I found deeply moving. It had the figure of Christ on the Cross leaning forward and stretching out his arms to embrace those who approached. This reminds me of the Christian belief that He died that we might be reconciled with God and through God with each other.

Surely our world needs that reconciliation as much as ever, because it is not until we are all reconciled together in love that a peaceful and fairer world will be possible. We need to stand shoulder to shoulder with our brothers and sisters of all faiths and none, in solidarity with those who suffer as a result of terror like the people of New Zealand or unjust government like those of Venezuela. We also need to remember at this time of year the new life that Easter represents - new life that followed death. Change for the good is possible.

So please enjoy your Hot Cross Buns and Easter eggs and, in so doing, allow yourself time to reflect upon their meaning. Churches Together in Watchet and Williton will be distributing Hot Cross Buns and Easter Eggs in the village on Good Friday morning. We pray that you will all have a joyful and peaceful Easter.

VV At 2pm on Saturday 13th April, members of Williton Bowling Club will once again be walking through the gates of the club, situated in the corner of the Memorial Ground near the Catwell entrance, to start the 2019 season.

The Bowling Club, which has been in existence since 1923, is one of the few sports clubs in the village playing during the summer months and, like any club, needs to maintain its membership. OWN AT THE STATION

We have been able to get quite a lot of maintenance done this past month in preparation for the new season which commences on Saturday 30th March. Due to work on the line which will still be underway in the Blue Anchor area, trains will only be running from Bishops Lydeard to Watchet and back until 18th April. There will be three trains each way each running day, departing from Williton to Watchet at 10.51,11.51 and 14.31. There will be a ten minute stopover at Watchet before they return, and then from Williton to Bishops Lydeard at 11.20, 13.20 and 15.20. Trains will **not** be running on the Mondays or Fridays during this period.

Many people will not have known but there used to be a tall Victorian water tower building at Williton between the A39 and the level crossing. This served two filling points for the smaller steam trains passing through. This

building was removed back in the early 1960s. However a large 8ft diameter well -head was left partly filled with the old bricks from the tower and covered over with sleepers and other debris. For several years I have been hoping we could make this a feature to be seen by passengers as they come in to the station on the train. This month we have been able to clear the site and West Country Blacksmiths (formerly Aller Forge) have manufactured and fitted a galvanised security grid right over the well. We are



really pleased with the result. There are still two to three feet of clear water. Our work hut has had a couple of coats of stain and some of the old 1932 warning signs adjacent to the crossing have been repainted.

We could do with some more help in the shop/refreshment room; maybe for just one day a week? Do drop down and see us once we are running again. All the usual goodies: ice cream, pasties, sweets, crisps etc. etc.

RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee

LIME AND COCONUT CRUNCHIES

50g (2 oz) butter softened 75g (3 oz) icing sugar Zest and juice of 2 limes

 $100g (3\frac{1}{2} \text{ oz})$ plain flour ½ teaspoon baking powder 50g (2 oz) desiccated coconut

1 large egg To decorate:

25g (1 oz) large coconut shreds

 $65g (2\frac{1}{2} \text{ oz})$ approx icing sugar

Cream butter and sugar together until fluffy. Reserving 1 tablespoon lime juice, add the remaining juice, zest, beaten egg, flour, baking powder and coconut and mix well to form a soft dough. Place 6 spoonfuls well apart on a baking tray, flatten with a fork and sprinkle over the coconut shreds. Bake for 10-12 minutes until golden brown at 180°C, 360°F, gas 4 until golden brown. To decorate mix the remaining lime juice with the icing sugar and drizzle over the biscuits.
