

Do contact us if you are isolated and need help with grocery shopping, medication, dog walking, errands or need a friendly chat. We can put you in touch with someone who can help you.

KEEP YOURSELF SAFE

IT IS VITAL THAT YOU DO NOT GIVE MONEY OR OTHER FORMS OF PAYMENT TO A STRANGER

Once you have made contact with the help group they will allocate somebody to help you and will give you their details so that you can verify their identity. Payment can currently be by card direct with the supplier of the goods or cash on delivery.

Your goods will be delivered to your doorstep, after your helper has either knocked or rung your bell. Your cash payment should be in an envelope to pass to your helper outside. Your helper can advise more about this once they have been allocated to you. If you need to talk to them - where possible speak from an open window or at a distance of 10 paces.

PLEASE FOLLOW THE GOVERNMENT'S ADVICE TO PROTECT YOURSELF FROM CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19)

The government is advising those who are at increased risk of severe illness from coronavirus to be particularly stringent in following social distancing measures. This group includes those who are:

- Aged 70 or older (regardless of medical conditions)
- Under 70 with an underlying health condition.

These groups should stay at home and limit contact with people outside the home.

- If you are in need of medical help, call the numbers 111 or 999 in an emergency.
- RÉMEMBER TO WASH YOUR HANDS FREQUENTLY WITH SOAP AND WATER.
- Watch or listen to the BBC or ITV news for updates.

What is social distancing?

We should ALL (this means people in ALL age groups) be doing our best to adopt the social distancing guidelines. These are:

• Keep 2 metres apart from other people if you have to leave your home and go out in public.

- Avoid contact with someone who is displaying possible symptoms of coronavirus, such as a cough.
- Avoid non-essential use of public transport.
- Work from home, where possible. Your employer should support you to do this.
- Avoid all groups of people, including gatherings with friends and family. Keep in touch using remote technology such as phone, internet, and social media.
- Use telephone or online services to contact your GP or other essential services.

Doing the above will help to slow down the spread of the infection. It is believed that Coronavirus is already in the village, so it so it is vital to everyone to follow the guidelines to help keep Williton safe.

But they said that far from having to "shut up shop", the Church of England must face the challenge by becoming a radically different kind of church rooted in prayer and serving others and we are exploring what we can do to help in this time of anxiety and need. Williton is a wonderful community and we can make it even better by putting others first and making sure that friends and neighbours who might be isolating themselves don't feel isolated from those around them.

At. St Peter's we have not shut up shop and the church remains open. The church will be open from 9.30 am until 5.00 pm every day and available for private prayer and reflection.

We are always willing to chat and pray with you.

On Sunday mornings the Archbishop of Canterbury will be leading all who wish to join him in worship on the television. This is a great opportunity for the church nationwide to worship together.

Can I invite all of you who would like to join me in pausing at 12 noon each day, wherever we are, to this prayer:

Loving God, We pray for all those who are suffering because of the coronavirus, may they know your healing power. When we are afraid for ourselves and our loved ones, give us your strength and courage. When we feel alone and isolated, reassure us with a sense of your presence. Give wisdom to those in authority and may our community work together for the good of all. We give thanks for those who care for others and ask you to bless them in all they do. We ask this in the name of Jesus, healer and physician.

COVID-19 Statement

THE QUANTOCK FOODBANK'S aim is to remain operational for as long as possible, and to return to operational status as soon as practicable after any outbreak of the virus amongst volunteers or their families. Measures have been taken to prevent the spread of infection at its premises.

An increase in demand for food parcels is anticipated as a result of the impact on the local population from the UK's strategy for dealing with the crisis. It is expected that:

- Holiday parks, hotels and food outlets who would normally engage seasonal workers will not do so or will lay off employees as they experience loss of trade.
- Closure of schools will mean loss of income for working parents and, if school kitchens also close, loss of free school meals for those on low incomes or universal credit.
- Small business owners and the self-employed will face severe financial difficulties from the knock-on effects.

This loss of income in the community may coincide with a decrease in the foodbank's supplies through shortages caused by panic buying; and comes at a time when it is already dealing with a record level of need.

The Quantock Foodbank will continue to provide a lifeline of emergency food to people unable to afford the essentials; and encourages continued public donations with regular updates on items urgently required from its incredibly generous supporters.

This support from communities in the Quantock area is very much appreciated at such a challenging time.

WILLITON PARISH COUNCIL

At the Parish Council Meeting held in the Pavilion on Wednesday 19 February 2020 and open to the public for comments before the meeting proper commenced, it was decided that the Parish Council's objection to planning application 3/39/20/003 should be published in the Williton Window, so that every resident in Williton should know what Councillors agreed and their reasons for objecting to the proposal. This is the letter sent to Somerset West and Taunton:

3/39/20/003 - Outline application (with all matters reserved) for the erection of up to 350 dwellings (comprising a mix of dwelling sizes and types and affordable housing), approximately 1,000sqm of flexible uses within D1 and B1 use classes (including a Doctor's surgery and/or business space), vehicle access, public open space, sports and recreational facilities, footpaths, cycle ways, enhancements to the Barrows scheduled monument including information boards, landscaping and associated works, Land to the west of Williton, Priest Street, Williton

At Williton Parish Council's meeting held on 19 February 2020 it was resolved to OBJECT to the proposal on the following grounds:

1. The application site is larger than the allocated site in the West Somerset Local Plan to 2032 in that approximately 1 hectare of land has been included to accommodate B1 and D1 uses together with land for links into Williton, sports pitches and /or community facilities, a community orchard, allotments and surface water attenuation features. It is considered that the inclusion of land for B1 and D1 uses should be included within the allocated site as no proven need has been provided for not including it within the allocated site or justification as to why it has to be on the proposed site and is a site that is not easily accessible by all. This part of the proposal is therefore contrary to policy OC/1, in particular bullet point 4 which states,

"it is new-build to benefit existing employment activity already established in the area that could not be easily accommodated within or adjoining a nearby settlement identified in Policy SC1

and policy EC3, in particular, bullet points 1 and 3 which state,

Development proposals requiring a greenfield location will be directed to existing identified and/or allocated sites for those type of uses unless it can be demonstrated that:

- the proposed location is essential to the business and that it could not be located elsewhere, and,
- it complements existing service and facility provision in the settlement and surrounding area without generating new unsustainable transport patterns

It is recognised and highlighted by the Somerset Clinical Commissioning Group (SCCG) who has commented, that whilst this proposed development does not mean that the GP surgery will not be able to register new patients but together with other recent planning permissions and current applications in and around Williton and Watchet means that the surgery will reach capacity and as such has requested an off-site contribution for healthcare infrastructure. This suggests that the proposed site for the Doctor's surgery is not where the SCCG need the surgery and pharmacy to be located. This further illustrates that policies OC1 and EC3 are

not being complied with.

2. As the number of dwellings proposed is up to 350 on this site but when including the other two allocated sites in Williton, Aller Mead already has planning permission for 90 houses (3/39/18/009) and the applicant has indicated that the other site adjacent to Danesfield School can accommodate 150 dwellings.

This amounts to 590 dwellings and equates to an extra 184 dwellings or 45% more than the "approximate 406 dwellings" mentioned in the first bullet point of policy WI2. The proposed 350 dwellings on the application site would be reduced if the B1 and/or D1 use land was located within the allocated site and would also ensure that this area of countryside is protected in its own right.

The argument put forward by the Agent that more houses than those required in policy WI2 should be provided for as other allocated sites have not been developed and may not be deliverable is not justified as the Local Plan was only adopted in November 2016, three years ago so little time has passed. In addition a number of large windfall sites have been put forward such as the Liddymore Farm and paper mill sites in Watchet and the Doniford Road site (as noted at point 3 below) which could provide up to 959 dwellings that are not included in the Local Plan. It is also considered that the number of houses proposed is not an appropriate amount for Williton as required in the purpose of policy WI2 or at point 1 of policy SC1.

Furthermore the significant increase in the number of dwellings above that required by policy WI2 is not acceptable as in the Issues and Options Document for the Local Plan Review 2040 for Somerset West and Taunton it states that,

.importantly, the housing requirement figures in our current Local Plans are significantly higher than the new Standard method figure by the Government (Option 3a.) This means that even if the proportion of housing development increases in any of the tiers, it is possible (depending on the outcome of Option 3a) that the number of houses directed to any of the tiers may still be fewer than the current Local Plan requirement."

It goes on to say,

"5.3.1 Providing the right number of new homes

The Local Plan will have a housing requirement figure and must have pro-active policies to help deliver this amount of housing. The Government's 'Standard Method' calculates our minimum figure which is 702 dwellings per year totalling 14,040 dwellings over 20 years.

To put this in context, we already have commitments (planning permission granted) of 6,177 dwellings and further sites identified as deliverable of 7,911 dwellings. These total 14,088 dwellings and with many further sites identified as developable and small windfall sites continuing to come forward the housing supply in our area is very healthy and it is unlikely that any further significant allocations will need to be made if we use 702 as our annual requirement figure. We will check the suitability of known sites against the spatial strategy that we take forward"

In other words there is no need for this significant increase in dwellings in Williton over what has been allocated in the Local Plan and it is therefore considered that the number of the application site should be reduced to ensure that over the three sites there is no more than 406 dwellings.

3. The increase in the proposed number of dwellings over the three allocated sites

in Williton will have an adverse impact on the infrastructure of Williton, not only due to the number of dwellings proposed but the fact that the infrastructure of Williton would be further exacerbated by other extant permissions and current planning applications. This includes the proposed 139 dwellings at Doniford (3/37/17/019) which the District Council has resolved to grant planning permission together with the Liddymore Farm site at Watchet (3/37/17/020) where it has also been resolved to approve for up to 250 houses. The number of dwellings could also increase substantially if the planning application at the paper mill site at Watchet (3/37/19/021) for up to 570 dwellings, a 60 bed retirement home and other uses and the application at Cleeve Hill, Watchet (3/37/18/015) for 136 dwellings are approved.

It is considered that the adverse impacts relate to the need for the provision of classroom places at St Peter's School and Danesfield School, pressure on the capacity of the Doctor's surgery, the road network and lack of provision of jobs for the occupiers of these proposed developments including this application site. No S106 Agreement appears to have been submitted to ensure that the provision of extra school places to accommodate the additional pupils from this development or to ensure that a new Doctor's surgery is provided. It is considered that the application should also be refused on the lack of such an Agreement.

- 4. As Williton is at the crossroads of the A39 and A358 all traffic to and from Minehead and to and from Taunton and Bridgwater as well as to and from the coastal strip goes through Williton as does the majority of the traffic to Watchet. The proposed development will increase the amount of traffic using the roads and due to the proposed roundabout at the Co-op (as shown in the paper mill application) and a roundabout for the extant approved supermarket (3/39/14/024) this will increase the time it takes to travel though Williton and will reduce air quality. The submitted transport assessment (capacity modelling) does not however appear to take account of these roundabouts and has not included the traffic increase generated from the applications at Doniford Road, Liddymore Farm, paper mill or Cleeve Hill sites. In fact it has been decided by the authors of the assessment that these sites should not be included for flawed reasons. It is considered that these sites and the proposed roundabouts should be taken into account and any adverse impacts on Williton including over capacity of road junctions be mitigated.
- 5. Whilst it is recognised that access is a reserved matter, the illustrative spine road through the centre of the site will result in a development that is a cul-de-sac and not well integrated into the existing road network. It is considered that the spine road should join onto the Five Bells road (B3191) to ensure that the development is better integrated and will help to reduce the length of traffic journeys from the application site through Williton to Watchet and Five Bells as vehicles will not need to enter Williton but use the proposed spine road. The current proposal is therefore not in accordance with bullet point 2 of policy WI1 and the last paragraph of policy WI2. It is considered that this link should be included in the application site.

In addition, the proposed footpath/cycle way routes do not take you into the centre of Williton so are unlikely to be used for getting to the centre of the village as they are not desire lines. The proposal does not therefore provide integrated footpath and cycle links that connects the proposed development to the village centre as required by the final paragraph of policy WI2. Occupiers of the proposed

development will therefore probably use their cars and use the facilities in Minehead (where there is more choice and free parking) rather than using the more limited shops and facilities in Williton which would be to the detriment of Williton's role as a rural service centre. The proposal is therefore not in accordance with the first bullet point of policy WI1 which states that the proposed development must support and strengthen Williton's role as a local service, administrative and employment centre.

- 6. Policy WI2 states that an indicative masterplan is required. Whilst detail has been submitted on the application site in relation to what uses will be on the site, character, areas and landscaping, the submitted masterplan lacks detail, in particular in relation to how the three allocated sites relate to each other, how the houses will be allocated on each site, the size and number of dwellings, number of affordable dwellings, phasing within the application site, flood mitigation and the road network. These are required to know how the proposed developments will impact on Williton and the surrounding area and to inform what mitigation is required. It is therefore considered that due to the lack of information on an indicative masterplan for the three sites that this is a reason for refusal as policy WI2 has not been complied with and as there is not enough information to make an informed decision.
- 7. It is stated that 35% of the dwellings will be affordable. It is known however that there has been difficulty in filling the affordable houses on the former Croft House site and at Aller Mead. It is considered that a housing needs survey should be carried out to see what the demand is for these properties and if below 35 % is required that the correct percentage be provided.
- 8. It is noted that an Environmental Impact Assessment has not been provided. If this is required it is considered that this should be provided before a decision is made and that the Parish Council are informed when it is received so that further comments can be made if appropriate.
- 9. Policy CF2 states that a health impact assessment is required for all strategic sites which includes this application site. No such assessment appears to have been submitted. The Parish Council wish to be informed when this is received so that further comments can be made if appropriate.
- 10. As part of the site is within flood zones 2 and 3, in particular the proposed routes for the footpath/cycle links, it is considered that the technical information on how the proposal will not exacerbate flooding on the application site including the proposed links into Williton or the surrounding land, the hospital, nearby properties and the A39 are required before the application is determined.

It should be noted that the A39 was flooded in February 2020 from Washford Cross to the site and the road was closed. As this would be the only access into the site and as the A39 is an important and well used road that links Williton with Minehead and beyond it is very important that flooding of the A39 is not exacerbated by the proposed development. It is therefore considered that the proposal is not in accordance with policy CC2.

The Parish Council wish to be informed when this is received so that further comments can be made if appropriate.




