

ROM ROSIE BROWN, Watchet Baptist Church

My husband and I have just returned from our Easter break, which was, for me, something of a pilgrimage. We camped in the village where I spent many years of my childhood and where my mother and I were very involved in the parish church. My father, an Anglican clergyman, died when I was ten and we had to leave the Rectory within three months. Thankfully my parents had bought a house in Norton St Philip to retire to and we were able to move there.

In those days my mother and I used to go to the Three Hour service on Good Friday; spend most of Holy Saturday helping to decorate the church and rejoice in the good news of the Risen Lord on Easter Sunday.

Since those childhood years many things have changed (I'm an OAP now!) but the annual commemoration of those world changing events around 2000 years ago speak to me afresh each year.

As I sat in Norton church in much the same place as I had sat some fifty odd years ago and remembered in the dim light what the death of the Lord Jesus meant for me, time stood still.

I was again overwhelmed by the enormity of what Jesus went through... the cruelty and horror of it all. The church was peaceful except for the familiar chiming of the clock on the quarter hour and the beautiful Taize chants playing softly in the background. How different from the day of noise and violence 2000 years ago. But suddenly there was quietness on that day, too, when Jesus cried out, "It is finished," and the full horror of sin was for ever doomed by the death of the perfect, sinless Son of God. Quietness, too, as the body so disfigured by torture was taken off the cross, wrapped in cloth and gently laid in the cool tomb.

As we left the church, moved and silent, we continued to ponder the depth of love that God in Christ has shown us by taking on himself all the sin of the world that we, through trust in him, might go free.

Holy Saturday always feels like a day in limbo somehow. This year for us we spent time walking with some of the family. In years past it was a day full of activity preparing the church for the glorious Easter morning. But all those years ago it must have been a day full of bewilderment for those whose hearts were broken.

For us, after a chilly night in the tent, we were woken by the most amazing bird song! "See, what a morning," I thought, as I poked my nose outside!

We knew the church would be transformed! The joy oozed out of every flower and the scent was glorious! There were smiles and Easter greetings as we gathered and the church was full as the Rector announced, "He is risen!"

We loudly responded, "He is Risen indeed! Hallelujah!"

He is risen indeed - Jesus is alive and vou and I can meet with him and know him! He's not just for Christmas, He's not just for Easter, he is for Life!

ROM OUR VILLAGE AGENT - IZZY SILVESTER The Pound in your Pocket is Changing

Have you seen one of the new pound coins yet? You won't miss them - they are 12 sided like an old three penny bit (remember them? - I certainly do!) and very attractive. They are lighter than the current coins, so won't weigh your purse or pocket down so much.

The bad news is you've only got until 15th October to change old pounds for new ones. You could spend them or give them to charity. Just be sure to empty them out of the jam jar you've been saving them up in for a rainy day. After 15th October, you will be able to take them into your bank and get them changed, but probably only in bags of £20.

Coin operated things like car park machines and supermarket trolleys are being adapted to take the new coins – let's hope they are all done by October!

The old fivers are also due to go the same way, on 5th May 2017. After that date it's the long trudge to the bank. New polymer £10 notes will start to circulate in the summer, with the £20 note following in 2020.

Four of the girls grew up during World War II, and two were postwar babies, so all were working at Carr's in the late 40s, the 50s and the 60s. Interspersed with details of the personal lives of our six girls, it makes for very entertaining and informative reading.

RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee

RHUBARB AND ALMOND CAKE

8 oz (220 g) soft margarine or butter 1 teaspoon baking powder 6 oz (170 g) caster sugar 3 oz (85g) cornflour Pinch salt 3 oz (85g) ground almonds

1 lb (450 g) rhubarb, cleaned and chopped 2 eggs (beaten) 8 oz (220 g) plain flour A few sugar lumps, roughly crushed

Pre-heat oven 180°C, 350°F, Gas mark 4

Beat half margarine or butter with 4 oz (110g) sugar, add the salt and eggs. Mix the flour with the baking powder and half the cornflour. Stir gently into the creamed mixture and add half the ground almonds. Put the mixture into a 9" lined and greased tin, smooth the top and place the rhubarb on top. Rub together the remaining ingredients and spread the crumble mixture over the rhubarb and then sprinkle with the roughly crushed sugar lumps. Bake for about 70 minutes.

DOWN AT THE STATIONThe running season is well under way now and at the time of writing we have been seeing a busy Easter holiday period with many trains very full. In fact on Easter Saturday it was standing room only when the first train came through. Something to do with a visit of The Gruffalo (whoever that might be!). As you receive this issue it is likely that we will be in the middle of the Spring Gala running from 27 - 30 April. Several visiting engines are expected to this all steam event along with many visitors and it will be a busy time for the volunteers.

Speaking of volunteers it has been good to receive enquiries from two or three new ones recently and we are hoping they will soon be part of the team here at the station. We are a cheerful bunch who like to keep the station and its environs clean and tidy for others to enjoy. It is amazing how many visitors from other countries call by, and indeed from other parts of the UK. While there are several heritage lines in the country, ours is always considered rather special which of course it is! Tea, coffee, ice creams, pasties etc are always available on train running days.

Everyone keeps asking about the visits of the Flying Scotsman engine. Well, it is due on 23rd May but for reasons beyond our control is not now likely to come through Williton on that day. 
WILLITON PAVILION PROJECT UPDATE
