ROM REV ANDREW VIDAMOUR

The title of the novel *Black Dogs* by Ian McEwan refers to an incident where one of the characters, June, is set upon by two wild black dogs in a lonely spot while she is on holiday in France soon after the Second World War.

With great courage (and the help of a penknife), June is able to fend off the dogs and so she escapes, but (not surprisingly) the episode stays with her as a strong memory for the rest of her life. This is partly because the dogs become symbolic, for June, of that dark side of her experience which we may sometimes prefer to ignore but which is often closer to us than we may think.

So Dr Johnson, the eighteenth-century writer, for instance, referred to his experience of depression as being like a "black dog", a phrase also used by Winston Churchill when he was also going through times of melancholy. In the novel, too, the dogs are symbols of general as well as personal suffering, especially in the shadow of then recent worldwide conflict; at the end of the book, the dogs "move into the foothills of the mountains from where they will return to haunt us, somewhere in Europe, in another time" (with hindsight, of course, we are sadly all too aware of the atrocities committed in Europe and elsewhere since 1945).

However, the black dogs also remain important for June because, during her frightening encounter with them, she has a remarkable sense of spiritual warmth and security: "She tried to find space within her for the presence of God and thought she discerned the faintest of outlines, a significant emptiness she had never noticed before, at the back of her skull. It seemed to flow upwards and outwards, streaming suddenly into an oval penumbra many feet high, an envelope of rippling energy, or, as she tried to explain it later, of 'coloured invisible light' that surrounded and contained her."

In the book as a whole, this spiritual awareness of June's is balanced and questioned by her husband's rational scepticism, but her deep experience (of both threat and safety) cannot be denied, nor can it, I believe, be dismissed as merely a reflection of her personality.

We, too, may feel threatened by 'black dogs' (of terrorism, pollution, illness and grief, among other realities), but even in the midst of such mysterious difficulties, I believe that the light of God's loving presence may be found, as Psalm 139 makes clear, in these words addressed to God: "If I say 'Surely darkness will steal over me, and the day around me turn to night', darkness is not too dark for you and night is as light as day; to you, both dark and light are one.".

May you know the light of mercy, reassurance, peace and hope in your times of darkness.

We are all increasingly aware that many more people are living with dementia in our society and so it is a good chance to be aware of how a person with dementia may see the world, so that we can be supportive of those trying to live independently with dementia.

There are many types of dementia. Most people will have heard of Alzheimer's which is where proteins build up in the brain and stop the signals from being accurately transmitted. Vascular dementia is the result of small strokes which damage the brain. Both will get worse with time but how rapidly can vary. Alzheimer's is a smoother process and vascular can be more stepped. There are many other forms, including damage to the brain through alcohol consumption.

The change to the person can also vary but you may see a change in personality, mood, confusion and frustration. People may start to avoid social situations as they feel anxious and exhausted. Later symptoms can include reduced hand eye co-ordination, visual disturbance and of course forgetting immediate information and living in the past.

You may come across someone experiencing symptoms when you are out. Being aware that someone may become bewildered because they have forgotten where they are, or perhaps because the mat in a shop door looks more like a lake, will help us all to be more patient and understanding.

There is a huge range of publications available that are all worth a read. Ask me or your surgery and the Alzheimer's Society on 01458 251541 for information. There is also a super booklet called "When Grandma came to stay" to help children understand and be prepared.

Look out for local dementia awareness events and press releases for organisations.

HEELS VOLUNTEERS

▼ Can you help? Could you be a coordinator?

So many people find themselves lonely and isolated and unable to get to appointments when they no longer have access to a car.

WHEELS volunteers address this problem by providing lifts at low cost to help people, mainly the elderly, from Williton, Watchet, Washford and Old Cleeve, to travel to medical appointments, shopping etc.

Wheels has 30 volunteer drivers but a vital role in our organisation is played by our voluntary coordinators. Their role is to receive requests from passengers, find a driver from our list, and inform the applicant. In addition, a record of passengers, drivers and journeys is kept so that a subsidy provided by Somerset County Council can be claimed.

The Wheels mobile phone is given to the coordinator so there is no cost to you. RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee

LEEK, POTATO AND MINCED BEEF BAKE FOR FOUR

2 lbs (1 kg) potatoes, peeled and cut into ½ pt beef stock (use stock cube)

½" slices

2 oz (50 g) butter 4 oz (100 g) grated cheddar cheese

2 leeks, washed and sliced ½ teaspoon dried oregano

1 lb (500 g) lean beef mince

Salt and pepper to taste

Pre-heat oven to 200°C, fan 180°C, gas mark 6

Melt most of the butter into a large saucepan over a medium heat. Sweat the sliced leeks until softened, add the beef and cook until browned all over. Add the stock, bring the mixture to the boil, then reduce to a simmer for 15 minutes. Season to taste, then remove from the heat. Spoon in to a baking dish, layer the potatoes on top, seasoning well between layers. Dot the top with the remaining butter, then cover with foil and bake until the potatoes are soft, approx 40-45 minutes. Remove from the oven and discard the foil. Sprinkle the grated cheese and oregano on top and return the dish to the oven for about 15 minutes, until the cheese is melted and golden. Remove from oven and leave to stand for a few minutes before serving.
