OWN AT THE STATION

I hope all local people have been able to hear the trains running again. It's amazing how many let me know they are glad to hear them each day. It's part of our heritage. Unfortunately, we have only been able to run three trains a day during April, from Bishops Lydeard to Watchet and back, but there have been several people on the trains including several party bookings. By the time this Williton Window is published trains will be running the whole line through to Minehead and back (BBC Points West featured this return to service as their main news item on Good Friday). However, there is still some track and sleeper work to be done in the Blue Anchor section before we are fully operative.

At Williton there are signs of summer as over the Easter weekend our Plant Sale Stall has opened.
