



ROM REV DEACON DAVID

Lent, this year, seemed to fly by and suddenly the Holy Week of Easter was upon us. As we entered the Holy Triduum, the reality of the true meaning of Easter again became apparent, from the Mass of The Lord's Supper and the humility of the *Washing of the Feet* through Christ's Passion right to the Great Easter Vigil Mass. Starting once again in Wellington Square in Minehead, our Good Friday Walk of Witness was well supported, with Christians from each denomination in the town joining the singing as we walked. Of course, the 3 pm Passion liturgy was as full as ever and very moving.

I love the significance of the Eastern European service of *Swieconka*, The Blessing of The Easter Breakfasts, with its significance of the foods presented in their beautifully decorated Easter baskets. Think about it – we **FAST** for the 40 days of Lent and, to celebrate Jesus' Resurrection, we **BREAK our FAST** with food specially blessed on Easter Saturday (GREAT Saturday in Polish). Thanks must go to the wonderful linguistic help I get from Thomas Glare who fills in so well when my humble Polish runs out. This year we had 76 people in the Church for this celebration and Blessing. To add to our Easter joy, we had two baptisms and one confirmation in Sacred Heart.

The glorious weather helped all of us enjoy the rest of the Easter break, but farther afield, we remembered the good folk of Paris as we watched in dismay the fire that engulfed Notre Dame, the Cathedral of Paris and the Mother Church of the French Catholics. We remember also all those Christians in Sri Lanka who tragically lost their lives whilst at worship that Easter Weekend. May their souls rest in peace.

Now, as we move irrevocably from Spring to Summer, we are still no wiser about what the dreaded "*B-word*" will bring us and our global destiny still awaits around some corner or another, but what will continue, come-what-may, is our Church life and the community spirit that comes with it.

This edition, I would like to finish off this piece with some serious thoughts based on the Beatitudes, but "tweaked" towards those of us who are not getting any younger:

Blessed are they who understand my faltering step and shaky hand **Blessed** are they who know my ears must strain to catch the things they say

Blessed are they who never say "you've told me that story twice already today"

Blessed are they who have time to stop with a cheery smile and chat a while

Blessed are they who looked away when I spilled on the cloth today

Blessed are they that make it known that I'm not alone, but loved and respected

Blessed are they who know the way to bring back memories of those yesterdays

Blessed are they that help to ease the days of my journey home in caring ways. Our Lord preached His sermon on the Mount so eloquently and every one of The Beatitudes is beautiful, but I was quite taken by this timely modern interpretation.

Taking the Pressure off Doctors Surgeries

We are all aware of the GP recruitment crisis affecting many of our surgeries which has a further impact on our Accident and Emergency Departments. So what is the best process for accessing care?

No appointment needed: Pharmacies are a good place to start; just ask at the counter for details. As qualified healthcare professionals, they can offer clinical advice and over-the-counter medicines for a range of minor illnesses, such as coughs, colds, sore throats, tummy trouble and aches and pains. They can also support you with advice on prescribed medicine.

You may not need a Doctor: Our surgeries are also investing in the employment of a range of health professionals. When you book an appointment you may be able to be seen quicker by someone other than a doctor who has the correct qualifications to treat your symptoms. Find out how your surgery prefer you to book appointments before you need one so you can access help quickly when you need it.

By phone: If you are unsure who you should see, especially if you are concerned during surgery out of hours, dial 111 for instant telephone advice or go online https://111.nhs.uk . In case of an emergency dial 999.

D-I-Y Healthcare: Invest in self- care by reading about your own potential health conditions and ensuring that you have the correct diet and lifestyle to keep you healthy. Stock up on simple medication and learn about the symptoms of potential illness such as stroke or heart attack.

An incredible £1,450.00 was raised and this money will go the Respite fund that serves Taunton, Burnham on Sea and the area that the WASPS covers, Southwest Somerset. It is a remarkable achievement and this was due in no small measure to all those who volunteered to help out on the day and with the setup and cleanup. Thank you so much and thanks to everyone who came out and visited the gardens. Thanks once again to David and Rosemary Freemantle for opening your gardens for us.

If anyone had ever told me when we had our first meeting that the WASPS would one day have over 50 members I would have said that they were crazy. If they would have said that this group would help People with Parkinson's by offering some financial aid through a Respite Fund I would have asked them if they were dreaming. Just over 6 years on and we now have a membership of 58 people with more joining each month and the Respite fund has helped over 50 people in Southwest Somerset. Even more important is the awareness that has been created in the last six years. We have come a very long way in a short time. There is so much more to do, but we have made a good start.

Our next meeting will be on Thursday, 6th June and we will be enjoying a cream tea at Doniford Farm. It should be lovely and it is so nice to enjoy the summertime. This is a yearly event and we move the venue around so that we can get out to see something different every year. July is BBQ month and that is always lots of fun. For the past 6 years Joe and I have held this event in our garden. This year we are changing our venue and once again David and Rosemary have kindly offered us the use of their garden. A change is good but I think that we will be keeping on our resident chef. He is willing to train anyone else who might like to give it a try.

We do not hold a meeting in August, when everyone has vacation plans. We are back to regular meetings in September and all the information about that will be in the September Williton Window. 
FLOODING MATTERS
Parts of Williton are prone to flooding. These are usually flash floods and can happen at any time of year, when heavy deluges of water and run-off from fields cause the Monksilver and Doniford Streams to rise, overflow their banks, flooding any properties that get in their way, and then continue down the village streets. These floods can be exacerbated by blocked street drains and gullies. They affect not just the residents of flooded properties but the whole village, through impassable roads and increased insurance premiums.

PREVENTION

We would encourage everyone in the village to play a part in keeping an eye out for any blocked street drains or gullies and thank you for any part you feel you could play however small. Also for blockages in streams, culverts and other waterways. Please report your findings to the Parish Office on 01984 633979 or email <u>clerk@willitonpc.org.uk</u> . If the blockage is serious, such as a fallen tree across a waterway, please contact the Environment Agency on 0800 80 70 60.

T PETER'S SCHOOL DIARY

This has been a busy half term, so everyone has appreciated our half term break to rest and recharge themselves. The next few weeks will also be demanding, with more trips to look forward to, sports activities, a sponsored walk and move up day, not to mention all the academic studying!

Oak class have been busy learning all about growing. The children have based their topic around the story 'Jaspers Beanstalk'. They have loved watching their bean grow and enjoyed planting sunflowers and cress. In Maths they have learnt about time and their daily routine and also had fun matching and ordering numerals to quantities. All children have produced some beautiful art work of Van Gogh's 'Sunflowers'.

Ash class, our year ones, have been enjoying the start of their new topics -'animals including humans' and 'We are Britain'. They have completed a sensory walk around the school and grounds and have created portraits, golden frames and titles to add themselves to the royal family. Soon the children will be going on a trip to Allerford Rural Life museum, where they will have a chance to play with Victorian toys, look at old equipment and take part in a Victorian school experience.

Elm class have been learning about Anglo-Saxons and Vikings in topic this term. So far the children have learned all about Viking Life and imagined what it would have been like to be at the raid at Lindisfarne. They are looking forward to a trip next half-term to the Museum of Somerset where they will become Saxon warriors for the day and take part in a fierce battle re-enactment!

Fir class have been learning all about plants in science. In the first lesson the children went outside, sketched the plants they could find and labelled the names of the parts of the plant that they knew. Then, the class designed an investigation into the requirements of plants for growth. Each child potted a sunflower seed and then decided whether to put it on the windowsill with water or without water. Other children even put some seeds in a dark cupboard! The class hope that their investigation will help them to answer the research question 'Do plants need water AND sunlight to grow?' They can't wait to see whether the predictions are correct.

Yew class returned from their three day residential in the Cotswolds, exhausted but happy. They took part in kayaking, paddle boarding and other exciting activities. It was an amazing experience for them. This term the children are learning about Oceans, Mountains and Rivers in topic and 'Animals including humans' in Science. The children are also learning a selection of songs to sing at the Regal Theatre in Minehead in June.

Happy stars, our nurture group, have been so excited over the new royal arrival, baby Prince Archie, that they have made him a card and posted it to him. They have also started to design him a royal christening cake, which the children plan to make.

RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee

CHERRY AND BANANA LOAF

8 oz (225 g) SR flour 2 beaten eggs

4 oz (100 g) chopped glace cherries 6 oz (175 g) soft brown sugar

2 mashed ripe bananas 4 oz (100 g) soft tub margarine

Sieve the flour into a bowl and stir in the sugar. Add the margarine, beaten eggs, chopped cherries and mashed bananas, and beat for about two minutes until well mixed. Put into a 2lb lined loaf tin and bake for 1½ hours at 160°C, 325°F, gas 3. Cool on a rack.
