THE FUTURE OF THE WILLITON WINDOW MAGAZINE

The Williton Window magazine was started twenty years ago in July 2000 and has been produced monthly ever since by a team of volunteers, and distributed free of charge to every household in Williton parish.

Lockdown has given many people cause to think about some of the jobs they have been doing almost as a matter of habit. In my case, for the past 14 years I have put my heart and soul into producing and helping to distribute the Williton Window (with valuable help from my husband), but health and age have decided us that it is time to stop. The same applies to Tony Guest, who has liaised with advertisers and managed the financial aspects of the magazine since its very beginning.

Because of lockdown, the last two months' magazines have been published online only, as will this, the July edition. We propose producing another online edition in August.

In the meantime, we very much hope that a new team of people will step forward to take over the production and distribution of the magazine. The new team would ideally consist of:

- 1. Magazine editor, preferably with DTP (Desk Top Publishing) experience (approx 3-4 days work spread over the month) to liaise with contributors, copy-edit and format contributed articles and some advertisements, design the cover and put the magazine together into print-ready form, and email to the printer, after approval by an editorial committee.
- 2. Advertising "manager" with book-keeping knowledge (approx 2-3 days work spread over the month), to invoice advertisers, chase up payments, keep a spreadsheet record, reconcile bank balance, liaise with editor, etc.
- 3. Distribution organiser to liaise with the printer, sort the magazines when they are delivered, with two helpers, and organise the team of distributors (1 day a month).
- 4. More people to help sort and deliver magazines.
- 5. A person in charge of the whole operation, ensuring that it runs smoothly and liaising with editorial committee.

Needless to say, help would be given during the handover.

However, if nobody has stepped forward to take over by 10th July, the magazine will cease after the August edition, which would be extremely sad. Advertisers would be refunded any outstanding monies.

N-STREET PARKING PATROLS TO RESUME
On-street parking patrol On-street parking patrols restarted in Somerset on 1 June, following the easing of coronavirus restrictions. With more pupils returning to schools and some businesses starting to reopen, Somerset County Council's civil enforcement officers will return to help keep roads clear and traffic moving. At first, they will serve penalty notices on vehicles parked on double yellow lines, in places with loading restrictions, bus stops and dropped kerbs in public areas – all locations where no vehicles should be parked. For the first seven days, penalties will not be served where parking is permitted, such as resident bays, pay and display locations, limited waiting bays and single yellow lines (at times). The vehicle may have been left correctly and the driver may have, for example, self-isolated. A warning letter will be left on these vehicles asking that it is immediately removed to avoid receiving penalties in future.

Requests for residents' paper permits have been on hold since the start of the UK lockdown but preparations are now being made to issue them. The expiry date will be extended to make sure people receive a full 12-month period. All annual virtual resident permits are being extended for two months to cover the period of suspension and ensure everyone receives a full 12 months' value. Please check with your district council for information on car parks in your local area.

C WP SITES AND SERVICES

All SWP recycling sites are on their usual summer schedule but with restrictions to ensure social distancing for the safety of customers and staff. Reduced loading bays can mean long queues. If queuing, turn off engine, maintain social distance with those waiting, and then unload on site swiftly to let others take your place.

The widening range of materials taken at all recycling sites now includes wood, paint, small electricals, and plastic pots, tubs and trays.

All 16 sites accept these materials:

- NEW: Plastic pots, tubs and trays (recycled in UK)
- NEW: Man-made wood chipboard, MDF, etc. (recycled in UK)
- NEW: Natural wood painted, treated and untreated timber etc (recycled in UK)
 - NEW: Small household electrical items (recycled in UK)
- NEW: Paint (water-based recycled in UK; other paint landfilled in Somerset)

Not yet taken: cardboard, Tetra Paks/beverage cartons, and more. These household recyclables should be put out weekly as part of the usual kerbside collection.

TITIZENS ADVICE

Citizens Advice are known and trusted as a reliable source of advice and thousands of people a year turn to them for help when they face troubling circumstances. School is different, but still exciting! With only our Reception and year 1 children allowed in school at present, we have created a new class for our keyworker children. So now we have Rainbow class, which as the weeks have past, has expanded and now we have Sunshine class too! Ash class, our year 1s, has also grown, so now we have Ash Keys and Ash Leaves. All our children have been very busy over the last few weeks as you will see.

Oak class have spent time reading stories and learning songs. One of their favourite stories is 'The Snail and the Whale' and the children enjoyed adding and subtracting snails and drawing and cutting spirals. As a treat they got to watch the film too. Phonics has been a focus, as well as PE. The class has concentrated on their balance and jumping skills and had fun learning social distancing games. RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee CHEESE SCONES

8 oz self-raising flour 2 oz butter

1 teaspoon dry mustard 3 oz grated strong cheese

1 teaspoon salt ½ pint milk

Pre-heat oven to 200°C, 425°F, gas mark 7

Sieve dry ingredients, then rub in the butter, add the cheese and quickly mix to a soft dough with the milk, as required. Shape into two rounds and slash them into four. Brush with milk and bake for about ten minutes until well risen and golden. As with all scones, work quickly!
