

Reading this you may be one of those who are housebound. If you are not housebound and have little to restrict you, might you not consider what more you might do to assist those who are not as free as you are.

But there's no need to be lonely for Jesus said, 'I will never leave you,' and he is only a prayer away.

BANK HOLIDAY RECYCLING AND REFUSE COLLECTIONS
During the week of Monday 28 August to Friday 1 September, all collections will be one day later. The Friday collection will take place on Saturday 2 September. Recycling centres are open on their usual days, including Bank Holiday Monday in Williton.

DOWN AT THE STATIONI don't think anyone could complain about not having enough summer weather this year - until the beginning of the school holidays, when the heavens opened! It still remains to see what August has in store for us, but whether sunshine or showers, there will always be some people who are never satisfied. However, whatever the weather, our hanging baskets and floral displays have been watered at least once every day and are currently looking as good as ever.

Summer is the best time to get your boiler serviced and find out any potential issues before it gets cold! Oil is usually cheaper at this time so take advantage - check with boilerjuice.com for all the local prices or join an oil purchasing group like Somerset Community Oil Scheme (tel 01603 881888). Your bill will give you information about your average usage and let you know if you are on your company's best tariff. You can phone and ask if you are not sure. September is when you should register for Winter Warmer Discounts. If you are on pension credits or are considered vulnerable, you may be eligible for more than £100 off your winter bill – provided you register with your energy companies.

Once you have thought about the cold weather, now think about the hot weather! Independent Age have a super booklet called Summerwise which you can download and print or call 08003 196789. It contains useful tips such as checking the effect your medication can have on your hydration and skin sensitivity. They have also produced a new free booklet discussing scams - phone 08003196789 to get a copy.

1 red pepper de-seeded and sliced 1 lb (450 g) courgettes, washed and cut into ½ inch slices

1 teaspoon chopped parsley Season to taste with salt and

Williton RBL Target Shooting Club, currently celebrating its 80th anniversary, is a very active organisation with a range nestled in the old quarry behind Tower Hill. At present the main emphasis is on .22 prone (lying down) small bore rifle shooting but there are plans to increase the number of options available. The existing clubhouse, dating back to the 1940s, is well past its sell-by date so the club has ambitious plans to replace it with a modern building. Fund raising is under way for this project which will also include a 50 metre range.

The club encourages people of all ages to take part in a safe and challenging form of target shooting. It also offers facilities to the Watchet Sea Scouts to shoot air rifles as part of their training plan. This has led to a number of their members joining the club and becoming successful small bore shooters. Throughout its history the club has provided members for the Somerset County and also the English and Welsh national teams. Two of our newer members, one of whom is a junior, were recently awarded their county colours for the 2016/17 season. Finally, we would like to thank everyone who supported our summer fair, it was a lovely afternoon and very successful, raising over £700 for our school.

At the recent Fete we displayed the drawings for the new building and associated ground works, and during the day we received many visitors who expressed a great deal of interest in the project and asked many questions. Most questions were associated with the availability of the building, running costs and what it will be able to offer. In consequence, I thought it a good idea to focus on this within this month's report.

Availability: Providing we can contract for the work by no later than October 2017, we anticipate completion and availability for limited hire during October 2018. By November 2018 we should be fully operational. We have already been approached for bookings and we expect this to continue throughout the construction phase. A number of organisations have already registered their interest, though we still have plenty of space for those who wish to use the facility.

Running cost: The business plan originally drafted in 2013 has been subsequently updated in line with the evolution of the building design and capability. There is no expectation that the new building will pay for the maintenance and upkeep of the entire memorial ground. But there is an expectation that the building will be self-financing and, in the long term, contribute towards reducing the subsidy paid by the Parish Council.

The charity has based its forecasts on current known costs along with costs obtained from similar community buildings, while basing its income on pessimistic usage figures.

Income includes both the parish council subsidy of £6,500.00 per annum along with our current fund raising efforts which are in excess of £8,000.00 per annum, this shall continue.

A copy of the business plan has been available in the Parish Office since 2013 for members of the public to read if they so wish during office opening hours.

Building functionality: The building will be equipped to provide for a variety of activities. In the main hall, there will be a hearing loop system, a 4m x 3m retractable screen for film nights and projection, a portable stage and lighting for theatre and events, up to 200 folding chairs and a variety of folding tables and banqueting tables. There will be sufficient floor area for a badminton court, walking football, four table tennis tables and three mats for indoor bowls. We also have registered interest for yoga, keep fit and Zumba classes.

The building will have two meeting rooms equipped with tables and chairs: the ground floor meeting room will have a retractable screen for projection; the first floor meeting room, accessed by both stairs and a lift, will be fitted with its own kitchenette. The main kitchen will be of a commercial standard to cater for in excess of 100 people, equipped with a cooker, fridge and dishwasher.

In addition to the men's and ladies' toilets, there will be a separate baby changing room and two further disabled toilets, one on the ground floor and one on the first floor.

The changing facilities will be accessed both internally and externally and in addition to the two main changing rooms, there will be a disabled changing room and an officials' changing room, all equipped with lockers.

The old changing rooms will be partially demolished and a new unisex disabled public toilet will be available during the day. This facility will be provided by the charity with support from the Parish Council. The new building will provide additional storage along with a small mess room with kitchenette, which will provide an opportunity for small scale events to be held on that side of the ground. Completion of this element of work is subject to available budget.
