

ROM REV JANE SPERRING

Earlier this year I attended the Methodist Women's conference in Swanwick. Louise Wilson led a very interesting session on Sunday morning relating to the 17 UN Sustainable Goals. I must admit, to my shame, I didn't know them, and in case you are the same as I, they cover social, economic and environmental development issues including poverty, hunger, health, education, gender equality, clean water, sanitation, affordable energy, decent work, inequality, urbanization, global warming, environment, social justice and peace. Louise was asking us to think about how we, as individuals, could make a difference to achieve these goals. She related them all to the idea of hospitality and we looked at examples of God being host, and God being guest, using passages from the Bible. It was a thought provoking session.

We had a choice of workshops and one I attended was about mindfulness. Mindfulness is an awareness of ourselves and of the world around us. I was thinking about this as I walked the dog the other day and looked at the abundance of butterflies that seem to be enjoying the sunshine this year. Mindfulness is living in the moment and taking a break from the busyness of our lives today. Mindfulness helps us slow down, and in slowing down we can start to appreciate the wonderful world around us. Even if you can't walk on the Quantock hills you can still appreciate the wonder of God's creation in gardens and hear the bird song. You only need to look at the changing pattern of the sky for your heart to sing and say - My God how great thou art!

As we perhaps take some time out during the summer for a holiday or a day off, we need to also take time to stop and stare, and appreciate all that God has given us, in creation, in family and friends, in the love we experience from others. So if you do nothing else this month, do stop and stand and stare - and really and truly appreciate this wonderful world that God has given us.

## WARDS FOR WILLITON'S UNSUNG HEROES!

A On Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> July two Williton people were among others from around the county to be recognised for their outstanding contributions to the community of Williton on the occasion of the Somerset County Council Chairman's Awards for voluntary service.

John Parsons' award was in recognition of his role as Williton Station Master and his work as a co-ordinator and driver for Wheels. He is an active member of Watchet Baptist Church and assists in the management and maintenance of the Sanctuary. He is chairman of Williton Gardening Club and treasurer of Williton allotments. He is also on the editorial committee of the Williton Window and one of our staunch band of monthly distributors.

Bill Vaughan was a prime mover in getting the Williton Pavilion financed through grant applications. He has been a parish councillor for over ten years. looking after the finances of the council, and also arranged the finance of the Parish Office. Bill is a quiet man, who has been for a long time the backbone of Williton Parish Council.

In addition to a framed certificate, each nominee was presented with a Somerset Council tie and an attractive enamelled badge.

WOMEN'S INSTITUTE
In July, our speaker was from The Conquest Riding Centre. Most of our members agreed that, although we had seen the sign on our journeys to Taunton, few had been into the centre and we knew little about it.

Rhoda, our speaker, a part-time worker at the centre, deals with their marketing and social media work. The centre is run by a charity, with no grants. Rhoda was extremely enthusiastic in telling us about their use of recycling materials which cannot be put in the normal council recycling, to raise money. They also have a café open at the centre from Tuesday to Friday.

The centre has nine staff, only one of whom is full-time and they are dependant upon their 69 volunteers to help with their work, not only with the disabled, but with able-bodied children with other disabilities including autism, behavioural difficulties, emotional problems and mental health problems. Their teaching includes animal care, as well as the use of sheepskin saddles, where the rider gets a full physiotherapy work-out, with the warmth of the horse passing through the saddle, as well as using the horse's rhythmic breathing in a type of yoga stretching exercise, plus carriage driving for the wheelchair bound.

It was an extremely interesting talk about something from our local area and we were all keen to get involved in their recycling as well as popping in for a cup of tea and piece of cake on our next journey to Taunton.

Our September meeting is on the 19th, and our speaker will be Emma Duke talking about the Lost Coast of Somerset. Visitors and new members will be made most welcome (a charge of £3.50 is made for non-members). We meet at 2pm at Danesborough View Common Room. Chris Smith, W.I. Member

Come and join the Somerset Credit Union at the Talking Café in Williton on the last Tuesday of every month 10 am to 12 noon, starting on August 27th.

You just have to save regularly (e.g. £5-10 a month) for the first few months and then you can apply for loan. No dodgy loan sharks or high rates of interest! The Somerset Credit Union only charges 1.5% a month interest. Credit Unions are all over the world, supporting people to be able to save to buy the things they need. It costs £1 to join and you can get help to fill in forms. You simply need to have proof of your identity and name and address. Under 16s can join for free and can save so they can buy the stuff they need, or so they can go on school trips that mum can't afford.

- Help to connect you with people who need services.
- Listen to your ideas and give you friendly advice and feedback.

This could be suitable for you if you are a mum and need to work around your children or someone who has retired and loves working with people and the community.





## RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee

## LEMON CAKE

4 oz (100 g) soft margarine or butter 8 oz (200 g) caster sugar

4 oz (100 g) self raising flower Ring and juice of one lemon

2 large eggs beaten

Beat the margarine with half the sugar until light and creamy. Beat in the eggs and then gently stir in the flour and finely grated lemon rind. Put into a greased and lined 8" (20cm) cake tin and bake in a pre-heated oven 180°C, 350°F, gas mark 4 for approximately 40 minutes. Remove the cake to a wire rack. Mix the remaining sugar with the lemon juice and spoon over the top of the cake. As the cake cools, this will form a sugar crust.
