



To everyone who supported us all through lockdown and used the Top Ten poster, we send our thanks. You helped us enormously by donating those items which we needed most and ensured that we never once ran out of items required to fill the food parcels.

Since we opened in November 2018, we have fed 4,000 people, and 1,900 of these were from the start of lockdown to the end of June. Although we expect numbers to drop significantly during July and August, we anticipate that there will be an increase in the Autumn as many furloughed and seasonal workers are laid off. Since the foodbank will still have an ongoing role to play during the financial fall out and any further outbreak of Covid-19, we value your continued contributions.

On 18 June we received the news that the Quantock Foodbank had been entered on the Register of Charities as a CIO, which was the culmination of many months of hard work by the Trustees.

### ROM OUR VILLAGE AGENT, IZZY SILVESTER Somerset village & community



Many people have missed going to their local Talking Café run by CCS Agents – there were 21 venues at the last count before lockdown. We are delighted to be back with our Talking Cafés – virtually anyway – streaming live weekdays at 11am on our Facebook channel – www.facebook.com/talkingcafesomerset/live. You can catch up on previous sessions or join in on the lives each day, asking any questions you have in the comments and interacting with us agents again We'd love to 'see' you there online and help in any way we can - don't forget the question you ask and have answered during the live session may help many other people in the same boat who are watching!

**Loneliness:** We all feel lonely from time to time. Feelings of loneliness are personal, so everyone's experience of loneliness will be different. One common description of loneliness is the feeling we get when our need for rewarding social contact and relationships is not met. But loneliness is not always the same as being alone. You may choose to be alone and live happily without much contact with other people, while others may find this a lonely experience. Or you may have lots of social contact, or be in a relationship or part of a family, and still feel lonely – especially if you don't feel understood or cared for by the people around you (see our information on the causes of loneliness https:// www.mind.org.uk/information-support/tips-for-everyday-living/loneliness/aboutloneliness/#WhatCausesLoneliness). Lockdown has amplified this for many people, as groups and regular social activities have ceased, but there is always support and help at hand. We can arrange regular Talk & Support calls for you for free, just to have someone to chat to, arrange befriending services and link you to Good Neighbours schemes where they are set up – our Agents are very skilled in helping people overcome loneliness and reduce isolation.

Care during Hot Weather Warm weather is something many people look forward to every year, but it's worth remembering that sunny spells can pose health risks for some people. Before the hot weather arrives, it is a really good time to think about what you can do to protect yourself and your family and friends from heat. For some people, such as older people, those with underlying health conditions and those with young children, the summer heat can bring real health risks. That's why we're urging everyone to keep an eye on those you know who may be at risk this summer. If you're able, ask if your friends, family or neighbours need any support.

The top ways for staying safe when the heat arrives are:

Hydration is crucial: Drink plenty of fluids and avoid excess alcohol.

Make sure you keep water with you at all times, especially if you are out and about

Close curtains on rooms that face the sun to keep indoor spaces cooler and remember it may be cooler outdoors than indoors

> Try to keep out of the sun between 11am to 3pm Walk in the shade, apply sunscreen and wear a hat

Wear light, loose fitting cotton clothes If you feel unwell, seek medical help by calling 111.

Out on Bikes: During lockdown, many people have taken the opportunity to get their family out on the bikes to enjoy the quiet sunny lanes. It's a timely reminder not just for cyclists to be car aware, but for drivers to 'Think Bike' and really slow down on country lanes. This time of year navigating windy, narrow lanes, your view may be obstructed overgrown hedgerows. C TATEMENT FROM CHIEF CONSTABLE ANDY MARSH:

I want to address some of the concerns raised about our handling of incidents over the weekend and give a wider context around the increasing demand we are facing as lockdown eases. To do this, I want to give a snapshot of the demand being placed on us to give the public a better understanding of the incidents we dealt with and the people we were trying to help over the weekend just gone.

Between 5pm on Friday 17 July to 8am on Monday 20 July, we received 1,017 calls to 999 requiring an immediate emergency response and a further 914 which needed a priority response. This is in addition to calls to the non-emergency 101 number and reports submitted online through our website.

The incidents we attended resulted in 178 people being taken into custody between Friday and Sunday – a 20 per cent increase on the last weekend of June and higher than the levels we were seeing before lockdown began.

#### Significant incidents from over the weekend included the following:

- A serious disorder in Easton, Bristol, on Saturday night following which two men were stabbed. One man was left in a serious condition. Two arrests were made and an investigation is ongoing
  - A 150-strong street party in Easton
- Four serious collisions a pedestrian died on the M32, another on the M5 near Clevedon and people suffered very serious injuries in collisions in Henbury and Yeovil
- 14 officers were assaulted while trying to help people and protect the public, facing being spat at, biting, scratching, punching, kicking, pushing and verbal abuse including racial abuse. All these officers remained on duty including one who returned to work immediately after treatment to a dislocated shoulder.
- We pulled officers away from front-line response duties to form a dedicated unit to respond to reports of unlicensed music events. This team successfully prevented one such event near Frome in Somerset on Saturday night after information from the public but were then deployed to Upper Swainswick near Bath to prevent any more people turning up to a rave which was already underway when we had our first calls. We called officers in from rest days and other forces to close the event down by Sunday afternoon. We've seized five vehicles and sound equipment and made one arrest. A post incident review is ongoing and we will take robust action against those found to be responsible.
- Officers were trying to find 39 missing people including nine assessed as high risk
- There were 95 calls reporting concern for welfare and 36 for people in mental health crisis
  - Officers also had 79 reports of domestic assault to respond to

We cover a huge area – from Thornbury to Chard and Minehead to Frome, and on a daily basis my officers and staff show great professionalism and dedication in dealing with everything from theft, assault, complex fraud investigations, the protection of children and vulnerable adults, helping victims of

domestic abuse and hate crime and delivering the worst news possible to families after collisions and serious incidents.

This is all on top of three months of additional pressure on officers and staff working tirelessly throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, despite the clear risks to their own health.

We have a proud tradition of policing by consent. This means working with our communities. We put our lives on the line to serve and protect and you play your part by reporting incidents, giving us information and showing pride and respect for the community you're a part of.

Sadly, we don't have limitless resources and can't be everywhere at once. We have to use our professional experience to assess every call, every request for help – and consider what incidents pose the greatest risk to public safety.

Our brilliant 999 and 101 call handlers quickly prioritise calls based on the risk of harm – potential loss of life, serious injury or sexual assault, factoring in the vulnerability of victims and witnesses and whether the offender is on the scene.

Our officers, supported by a wide range of police staff and volunteers, will then respond. Their actions are dictated by the evidence and resources available and a wealth of legislation. Our first priority is to keep everyone safe. That's victims and witnesses – but also officers and staff and it includes suspects and offenders, no matter what we're told they have done.

I am hugely proud of my officers and staff and the special constables and volunteers who give their time to support us. We don't always get it right, but we learn from the times where we do fall short.

A home in South Road, Watchet was burgled on the 20th between midday and 3:40pm. The outer door to the property was open but the inner door to the main residence was locked and secure and showed no sign of forced entry. The offender had managed to gain entry via the front door and once inside stole a 16 week old puppy before departing back through the front door. The victim later contacted the police again to state they had seen the puppy for sale on Gumtree in the Bristol area and a mobile number was provided, this was linked to a male who is known for artifice crime and theft offences. Enquiries by officers from Concorde house at the suspects address led to the arrest of the suspect and the recovery of the puppy. Please do ensure your pet is microchipped with up to date information, it has proven invaluable in the circumstance above. This is unusual for a pet to be stolen, but with more and more people taking on puppies and their ever increasing value, this may change.

#### RE YOU SHOPPING ONLINE?

A Have you bought anything online recently?

Almost 34% of all retail sales during May 2020 were carried out online, and new research suggests that only 16% of UK consumers intend to return to their old shopping habits post-lockdown.

Online shopping fraud during lockdown Action Fraud, the UK's national reporting centre for fraud and cyber crime, received over 16,000 reports relating to online shopping and auction fraud during the lockdown, with losses totalling over £16m. Members of the public have reported buying mobile phones (19%), vehicles (22%), electronics (10%) such as games consoles, AirPods and MacBooks, and footwear (4%) on sites such as eBay (18%), Facebook (18%), Gumtree (10%) and Depop (6%), only to have the items never arrive.

Top tips for shopping online securely: Choosing where to shop: If you're making a purchase from a company or seller you don't know and trust, carry out some research first. For example, by checking to see if others have used the site and what their experience was.

**Email accounts:** Use a strong, separate password for your email account. Criminals can use your email to access other online accounts, such as those you use for online shopping. **Scam messages:** Some of the emails or texts you receive about amazing offers may contain links to fake websites. Not all links are bad, but if you're unsure don't use the link, go separately to the website. And remember, if a deal looks too good to be true, it probably is.

**Payment method:** If you decide to go ahead with the purchase, use a credit card if you have one as other payment providers may not provide the same protection.

What to do if you've fallen victim to online shopping fraud We all make mistakes and these days the scams can be incredibly convincing. If you think you've visited, or made a purchase on, a bogus website, you should first, take a note of the website's address, then close down your internet browser. You should then report the details to Action Fraud and contact your bank to seek advice. Whether you've been a victim of fraud will depend on how much information you've provided to the website, so keep an eye on your bank transactions, if you can. Contact your bank immediately about anything that you don't recognise, even small amounts.

Although we are now in the summer holidays, the last few weeks have seen a variety of activities in school.

Oak Class practised their archery skills, pedalled bikes on the big play-ground and spent lots of time making water runs. The children read Zog and then made their own dragon eggs by making papier maché balloons and decorating them in their favourite colours (with heaps of glitter too!) They also flew class kites out on the playground. 


