

■ When is it winter in the middle of one of the hottest summers? When it's Polar Explorer's week for 5-11 year olds in August at Alcombe Methodist Church.

The stage was set with one large ingeniously built igloo, centre stage



(made of 4 pint plastic milk bottles, recycling at its best). Lots of snowscape, mountains and snowballs (ever useful white sheets and pompom balls provided by generous Methodist ladies)! Signposts to the North and South Poles. Complete with penguins (not real of course), skis, and walkie-talkie radios. So much more completed the scene, including some crazy volunteers dressed suitably (or unsuitably considering the heat) in quilted jackets,

salopettes (skiing trousers to you and me), bobble hats, goggles, thermal gloves, and lined boots. Now that's what I call dedication to commitment!

And what on earth was all this for? Well, perhaps children will not go willingly to church on a Sunday, perhaps church to them has come to mean something different from the usual church service. All we know is that there are some forty local children who love to come to our August Holiday Club. Each year has a particular religious theme using stories from the Bible, cheerful songs which recognise God and welcome everyone to come and worship as part of his family, prayers, fun building dens out of cardboard, games which make you laugh and scream, lots of creative crafts - and food, too. The children also learn to memorise a Bible verse and most of all they learn to work together as teams, earning points along the way.

Each year has its 'characters'. This year, with the help of Sir Random Finds (Rev Tim) and Bare Feet (Exmoor Youth Project leader Lynne), plus many volunteers from all churches and none, the children in their four groups as explorers went on a mini-expedition each day and learned about a New Testament character. They learned how the characters also have faults, as well as special gifts and skills, all things which we all have. Through these lives the children learned that no matter who we are, everyone can be part of 'God's big expedition' and be a friend of Jesus and help others to be friends of Jesus too. They are already queuing up for next year.

And perhaps... next year a jungle scene might be more apt!



ROM YOUR VILLAGE AGENT, IZZY SILVESTER

When September comes, the summer fetes end and the regular groups resume. These are a great way to meet people and to share experiences and thoughts. They can be extremely uplifting and can give a great sense of purpose. Most will love extra volunteer support if you have time to give.

Talking Cafés are sometimes held on a Monday to provide much needed company after a long weekend. The Beach Hotel in Minehead has a Café every Monday morning from 10 am till 1 pm. The Talking Café in Williton is in the Library on the second Wednesday of every month from 10.30-12.30. You are sure of a warm welcome where you can come and chat to like-minded people and find support and advice from the agencies who attend each week.

Village coffee mornings or groups are wonderful – a great way to meet up with the community and chat about local issues. There are also gentle exercise groups (see the Age UK article on page 13). There is also a network of support groups for those who work as unpaid carers - go to www.somersetcarers.org and click on what's on in your area. If you are new to the village or finding it difficult to get the confidence to attend a coffee morning or group please give me a ring. I can come along with you or arrange for one of your neighbours to accompany you for the first time.

If you drive to a social group, perhaps you could consider if there is anyone in your area who can't walk there and give them a lift?

If you struggle to get out of the house, you could receive a weekly telephone call from Age UK (01823 345626) or Silver Line (0800 4708090) or a visit from the Royal Volunteer Library Service (Jacqueline Brown on 01984 631371).

Not sure who to turn to? Village Agents are a charity that work with individuals and social groups to give confidential support and advice. We can enable people to be more independent in their home, manage personal finances, care for family members and advise on just about anything!

QUANTOCK FOODBANK
Much work has been going on behind the scenes to set up the Quantock Foodbank administratively, and to secure funding and premises. TATURALLY REDUCING FLOOD RISK IN WEST SOMERSET

Residents of Stogumber, Monksilver and Williton have experienced flooding in the past. Now residents living near Monksilver and Doniford streams will benefit from new measures to reduce flooding, using natural methods such as planting hedgerows and creating wetlands.

The Environment Agency and the Wildfowl & Wetlands Trust are delivering a Defra-funded scheme to cut the risk of floodwater surging onto roads and into villages.

Natural flood management is an approach that aims to hold back and slow down the flow of water before it reaches properties and businesses. It is already in use in various places across the country including Holnicote near Minehead and around Stroud in Gloucestershire. All the nutrients in any soil washed off fields by heavy rain end up costing farmers money to replace. Stopping that soil erosion has a direct financial benefit. It also prevents the roads from becoming silted up, and it stops those nutrients ending up in the streams, which ultimately helps the local salmon and sea trout population. Everyone's a winner

Any property or land that drains into either the Monksilver or Doniford Streams is eligible for assistance. Farms can also ask for free soil analysis and help to reduce soil erosion.

teacher, Mr Lund. He visited the school a couple of times at the end of the summer term to start to get to know the children and to see his new classroom.



Throughout July and August, we have been busy working with the contractor on the infrastructure to support the equipment requirements. The media equipment has been a challenge and working with the supplier, we have now agreed the layout. RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee

COUNTRY CAKE

6 oz (150 g) soft margarine 1 teaspoon (5 ml) cinnamon 3 oz (75 g) soft brown sugar 2 oz (50 g) chopped mixed nuts 4 oz (100 g) cream cheese 3 beaten eggs 4 tablespoons runny honey 2 oz (50 g) icing sugar 9 oz (225 g) wholemeal SR flour 2 teaspoons coffee essence 1 teaspoon (5 ml) baking powder Sprinkling of toasted mixed nuts

Pre-heat the oven to 180°C / 350°F / Gas 4.

Beat together all the ingredients, except cream cheese, icing sugar, coffee essence and chopped mixed nuts. Put into a greased, lined 8" (20 cm) deep cake tin and bake for 45 minutes (you know your own oven). When cool, beat together cream cheese, icing sugar and coffee essence and spread over the top of the cake, then sprinkle with the toasted nuts.

T DECUMAN'S CHURCH LAUNCH THEIR CWGC BOOKLET

The 8th of August 2018 was the 100th anniversary of the battle of Amiens and The Hundred Day offensive, the battles that brought the First World War to its conclusion. The British Expeditionary Force gained land every day from the German front, supported by the artillery and hundreds of tanks. Many hundreds of German troops surrendered.

St. Decuman's Church launched a Commonwealth War Graves Booklet on the anniversary as a symbol of remembrance to the men lost, not only in the First World War, but in all conflicts since.

St Decuman's Church was given Commonwealth War Grave status last year and has been correlating the booklet for the last few months. A small team was put together to find the graves listed and along the way have found others in the churchyard that were not listed by the War Graves Commission, but these are now included. The team consisted of Keran Spears, Alan Jones and Sara Summers, who is the Watchet Town war memorials historian.

The booklet consists of photographs of the graves and headstones of the men in the two church cemeteries and aerial photographs taken by local photographer, Paul Scullion. Historical facts were researched and archived by Sara Summers from the primary source of the CWGC internet research website. The CWGC have given their guidance and support throughout the process and have printed the booklet.

The booklet will be available at St. Decuman's Church, the Market House Museum and Watchet Visitor Centre for anyone with a family link to the men on the list or for anyone with a general interest in the Commonwealth War Graves.





Follow your dream...

Anna (not her real name) was born in Maidstone, Kent, in 1935. She recalls that, at the age of 9, she took the preliminary 11+ in an air raid shelter! She passed the exam and went on to Grammar School. However, money was tight so, even though she had hopes of becoming a teacher or occupational therapist, Anna left school to become a telephonist, handing her wage over to her father each week.

In 1960 she met her future husband and they married in 1960, moving to Croydon. Children followed, all born at home, prompting a move to a larger property in Selsdon. Here, Anna became involved with pre-school play groups, a defining moment being a conference held at Lancaster University at which the prominent Labour MP, Barbara Castle, spoke.

Listening to her speak about her life and what she had achieved inspired Anna to return to education. With a young family this was no easy task. Fortunately, her husband was very supportive and Anna studied psychology and English, which enabled her to enter teacher training college where she spent four very happy years, despite the fact that, during this time, her husband experienced periods of unemployment in the printing industry. On leaving college, Anna taught maths and English to primary school aged children in two schools; her abiding concern was that children should enjoy what they were learning and have fun. After a heart by-pass operation, Anna's husband took early retirement and the family moved to Boscastle where Anna had a job supporting children experiencing difficulty in maths.

Those years as a teacher were really enjoyable but the memory that really sticks out is receiving her degree in the Albert Hall. In her opinion, the fact that she held down a full-time job as well as bringing up her family, did her children good and inspired them to achieve academically.

So how did Anna end up in Somerset? Well, she and her husband knew this part well having spent many holidays here. Due to his health issues, her husband and she agreed that they needed to live somewhere close to local amenities and, when the house in Williton came up for sale in 2008, they decided that this was the place they wanted to be.

Anna's story is one of perseverance. She followed her dream and wasn't afraid to both accept a challenge and to stick with it when the going got tough.

I look forward to finding out about the interesting lives of other inspirational residents of Williton.
