



PATIENT CHOICE NOMINATIONS OPEN FOR LOCAL NHS STAFF **AWARDS**

Somerset Partnership and Taunton and Somerset NHS foundation trusts are calling on the people of Somerset to nominate staff for their annual colleague awards.

The two trusts have launched their Our People Awards 2019 and are looking for nominations from patients and carers for staff they feel have provided outstanding care and deserve the additional recognition.

This is the second year that the two trusts, which are looking to merge, will hold a joint celebration event for staff.

And the Patient Choice Award is now open to the public for nominations, as well as to staff who can nominate their colleagues.

Whether it is a physiotherapist, radiographer or other allied health professional, mental health team, community hospital staff, paediatric teams, nurses, midwives or doctors, nominations are wanted for the local NHS staff who have provided outstanding care.

Nominations close on September 16.

Volunteering has become more flexible and you do not need to fear that once you sign up, you will never have a Saturday to yourself again! Some volunteer roles can be conducted by phone and possibly from your home. Consider starting our Good Neighbours Scheme in your area - contact CCS on 01823 331222. We always appreciate additional support to run our Carers Groups that meet to provide advice and a break for unpaid carers. Contact me or the Somerset Carers Service number for more information.

Small Grants are available to start a community group or perhaps to support yourself when going through a difficult time. We can help you find these, either by contacting me or to access larger community based grants and consultancy for Parishes contact Ade on Ade@somersetrcc.org.uk 01823 331222. For personal funding go to the Turn2us website and tap in your particulars to see if you qualify for something. This could be a small grant for an unpaid carer to purchase something to enhance their caring role or for improving the insulation on your house. We are also supporting those who wish to become a self-employed paid carer. Contact project co-ordinator Rhys Davis: RPDavies@somerset.gov.uk or telephone 07788 350806 or our Enterprise Agent at CCS Vince Tillman.

Lastly, you could get £140 off your electricity bill under the Warm Home Discount Scheme. The 2019 to 2020 scheme will start on 14 October 2019. Eligibility Criteria: you get the Guarantee Credit element of Pension Credit or you're on a low income. Visit www.gov.uk/the-warm-home-discount-scheme or phone your provider.

We did not have a meeting in August, people were enjoying the summer holidays and getting out and about, just enjoying life and all the lovely weather we have had. I know that I am going to find it hard putting away summer clothes and getting back into the routine of everyday life.

How I wish that Parkinson's would take a holiday. It has a very bad habit of reminding you that you cannot do what you used to do. That is where the WASPS help you to cope. When someone is having a bad time they know who they can talk to and get support from. We don't spend a lot of time talking about our ailments, but we recognize similar symptoms and share with each other how we cope. We exchange information and it helps to know that we can offer advice to each other. That is exactly what a support group is meant to do. We know that we cannot advise on medications, that is beyond our scope. Just knowing that you are not alone is so very important. Our carers, who are our partners, husbands, wives or family members, benefit from having someone to talk to, to help them resolve issues, compare notes and basically deal with the effects of Parkinson's. It is very hard to be a carer, even harder than having Parkinson's, because the carer can only deal with the daily issues as they happen, knowing there is no cure, as vet. They can easily feel overwhelmed.

All the above reasons are why the WASPS exists. Understanding, support and friendship are what WASPS offer to those who deal with Parkinson's on a daily basis. What do we want in Williton? We are not demanding children, but a community that pays taxes to the Parish Council for providing what we need. Demanding children are often told, "Wants don't get". That is not the answer for the people of Williton. What is your idea of a good thing for the people of Williton? What do the people of Williton want done with their money to make a better community to live in?

Let's be realistic. If everything we wanted done was paid for by taxes then you, the tax payers, would have a hefty bill. There is a way to provide a lot in the community without it having to cost a fortune. Everything that goes on needs people to make it happen, to organise and staff events, clubs, support groups etc. The key is volunteering; people giving their time to help provide what others need.

The Parish Council has two paid part-time staff and it buys in other professional services. Its office is being bought on a loan. Having employed staff and provided a place for them to work, the next priority is to pay for things the Council does directly. This includes maintaining Bellamy's Corner and the Copse, and running the Christmas Festival, Easter egg hunt and the duck race, to name a few. It may surprise you, but the new Pavilion is not owned by the Council and it does not directly finance it. In this case the Council is only the trustee of the charity which holds in trust for the people of Williton the Memorial Ground and the Pavilion. The charity has its own finances and when dealing with them, the Council meets separately.

Much of what happens in the Pavilion and at other places in the village is organised and run by volunteers. While the Council can support groups, clubs and organisations through grants and facilities, to make every pound do much more, volunteers are needed. If you have an idea for an activity which others will want to join in with, why not get together with a few other people and organise it? Apply to the Parish Council for a grant to set it up or to help run it. My plea is that you put your idea into action and help turn Williton into a more interesting and vibrant place. Come together with others and make Williton what you want it to be.

If you have ideas and want to join an organisation which is already up and running, join the Parish Council. There are seven councillors at present and five vacancies. RECIPE FOR THE MONTH by Shirley Dee

STUFFED MARROW RINGS (use up your overgrown courgettes!)

1 marrow or a couple of big courgettes 75g (3 oz) butter

100 g (4 oz) lean cooked ham 50 g (2 oz) mushrooms 1 level dessertspoon chopped parsley 2-3 dessertspoons fresh white

breadcrumbs

Salt and black pepper Preheat oven: 190°C, 375°F, Gas 5

Cut marrow into two inch thick rings and remove the skin, unless young and tender. Spoon out the seeds. Butter a large ovenproof dish and arrange the rings in a single layer. Trim the mushrooms and chop them roughly. Dice the ham. Heat an ounce of the butter and lightly fry the mushrooms and ham. Add the parsley and season to taste. Stir in enough breadcrumbs to bind the stuffing. Lightly sprinkle the rings with salt and pepper before filling them with the stuffing. Dot with the remaining butter and cover the dish tightly with foil, so that the marrow will cook in its own steam. Bake in the centre of oven for about 45 minutes until the rings are tender. Serve straight from the dish with a tomato sauce.
