Council Tax 2024/25

By now you will have received your council tax bill for this coming year from Somerset Council and will have seen that the amount that Williton Parish Council is asking you to pay has risen by 41.5%. In percentage terms that is a considerable rise but in monetary terms that equates to a rise this year for a Band D property from £118.44 to £167.58 and for a Band B property from £92.12 to £130. 34, that is the equivalent of 95p and 74p a week respectively, far less than the cost of a first-class stamp. The Parish Council is fully aware of the current financial pressures everyone is facing at the moment, so the decision for this increase was not taken lightly.

The Parish Council has done all that it can to keep its expenditure as low as possible and, despite inflation increasing at more than 10% when the budget was being set, a figure of £166,281 was agreed. This is an increase of £3,850 (2.3%) on 2023/24, and we have asked for a Council Tax Precept of £163,000. Whilst we were setting the budget, and the amount we would request as Precept, the income we receive was not taken into account. When we look at our budget later this year for 2025/6 this income will be taken into account and will help to offset any potential increase in Council Tax next year.

Although this is a modest increase in the budget, the reason for the large percentage increase is primarily due to the Parish Council's desire to keep the Parish Council's proportion of the Council Tax as low as possible during the economic crisis. Our budget for this financial year (2023/24) was set at £162,431 and the precept was for £112,000, with the balance being taken from reserves. A similar approach was adopted in the previous year. This policy of using reserves is not sustainable and the difficult decision to ask for a precept that almost fully covers the budget had to be taken.

To give you a brief outline of how the Parish Council spends our share of your Council Tax: we provide and maintain the public toilets in Killick Way, undertake the grass cutting on the Memorial Ground, Bellamy's Corner and some of the verges around the village and keep the roadsides weed-free. We support the young of the village with the children's playground and through the



Report from Williton Response Group - Flooding

On 27th February a well-attended meeting was held at the Pavilion which gave professional and volunteer organisations the opportunity to tell the public what their roles are. It was made clear that there are no funds for major flood prevention work. The emergency services act when there is a serious threat to life. Flooding is always a possibility and preparing for it and clearing up is largely down to households and businesses, not the authorities.

At that meeting there was an opportunity to join the Williton Response Group. On 14th March The Williton Response Group held a meeting to which eleven people came and three more gave their apologies. In 2014 Robert McDonald drew up a flood plan which has not been continuously operational due to a lack of volunteers. Five people have now kindly offered to be flood wardens: a good start towards the eight needed. Before trying to organise ourselves further, it was decided to invite the Dulverton Flood Group to our next meeting as their experiences of flash flooding will be used to refine our Flood Plan. Communication is also key and that too will be considered in the light of Dulverton's experience.

It was emphasised that a flood warden is not about being a hero rescuing someone trapped by rising water: that is for the emergency services. Typically a flood warden could check road gullies, help draw up a list of vulnerable people who would need evacuating before a flood, distribute leaflets on how residents can be ready, check that people are able to cope with cleaning up, that they have food and can cook it, and raise the alarm if someone is missing.

As a minimum, we need three more flood wardens and there are also other roles that need to be covered. Communications need to be maintained and people evacuated to safety ahead of any possible risk of flooding and registered as in a safe place. Could you fulfil any of these positions or help in some other way? If so please come to the Group meeting on 17th April at 7pm in the Pavilion Quantock Room or leave your details with the Parish Office (see Parish Council report) if you can attend. It will be worth hearing what the Dulverton group can tell us and we hope to at least sign up three more Flood Wardens to get us up to the minimum of the eight that are required.

Please come to the meeting if you want to help our community cope with the inevitable.




Down at the Station

You are always welcome to come and have a cup of tea/coffee/snack - ice





HEDGEROWS: Rules & Regulations

N ow that former EU farming subsidies have been phased out, there is concern that protections for hedgerows have gone with them. The situation is not quite that simple!

Hedgerows support biodiversity and are home to 80% of our woodland birds and over 2,000 other species, some of which are protected. They also protect against flooding and soil erosion.

In the post-war decades, England lost half of its hedgerows and of those that were left, 60% were in poor condition. Concern mounted and finally, in 1997, protection of hedgerows was written into law. This is still in force.

The **1997 Hedgerow Regulations** define hedgerows broadly (even quite "thin" examples are included) and apply to any hedge over 20m long bordering agricultural, forestry, common, or equestrian land. They do not apply to hedges around residential property.

A landowner wanting to remove all or part of a hedge must apply for permission to the Local Authority. Removal without the required permission is a criminal offence and offenders can be fined and/or required to replace the destroyed hedgerow.

Under the old cross compliance rules, subsidies to landowners could be reduced for bad hedgerow management but in practice such sanctions were seldom applied and hedgerows suffered from over-aggressive, ill-timed flailing and too-close ploughing. It is now the government's intention to support hedgerow maintenance and planting by financial incentives. Unfortunately, the amounts on offer are not large compared to the subsidies resulting from some crops so time will tell whether this is effective.

The Hedgerow Regulations stemmed the post-war hedgerow destruction and now the tide appears to be turning as we try to meet a target of 40% more hedgerows by 2050. But perhaps this has diverted attention from adequate protection for existing hedgerows which have been benefitting wildlife and building biomass for hundreds of years. Friends of The Quantocks is gathering information about the state of hedgerows, so if you see a hedgerow being

damaged or removed, please don't just assume that this is "normal".



HEDGEHOGS

Hello folks. I hope by now you will be seeing 'your' hedgehogs returning to your gardens. I know that a lot of you are looking forward to seeing your little nocturnal visitors again. This month, I thought I would throw the spotlight on one of our keen members, Lesley Murray. Lesley and her husband Paul have been keeping an eye out for hedgehogs for several years, they have even

named the hedgehog boxes in their garden!

Lesley says:

"There is quite an active 'array' (name for a group of hedgehogs) in Williton. My garden houses the Hog estate, which some of you may have seen in videos on the Watchet Hedgehog Facebook page, which has 2 'detached' hedgehog houses (Cyclamen and Fern) and 1 'semi- detached' hedgehog house (Corkscrew and Azalea).

We have seen, and videoed, hedgehogs in our garden for about 5 years now. This winter we had no hibernating hedgehogs and it was very quiet on the Hog estate until Valentines Day. Since then, we have been having hogs regularly visiting each night and some days we have 'guests' staying.

We leave out dishes of water each night around the garden which not only hedgehogs use but other wildlife too. We feed our hedgehogs in a 'feeding station' which over the years has been wooden or plastic boxes, a few years ago we also used an old lawnmower grass box! We now have a dog cage with short pipes around the sides, this is to deter the cats, some of which are very agile.


We put out dried hedgehog or cat food, some of which we get from the pet shop on the Roughmoor Estate in Williton. We also get hedgehog food from the internet although we are now having to search as the sites seem to be selling out of our hedgehogs' favourite foods.

The hogs come into our garden via the gate, which we raised a little so that they can get under. One year there were 8 hogs crowded round 1 dish of food, now we have up to 3 dishes filled with food to try to stop squabbles."

Upcoming events, Speed Indicator Progress, Road Safety Campaign

Spring is on its way. How I love this time of year. Although we have had a lot of wet and sometimes cold days, overall it has been a mild winter. As I write this, the sun is shining and the ground is starting to dry out. Now we can start tidying up the garden and plan our planting for the summer.

This year's **Open Garden Day** will be on 2nd June '24, There will be a Craft Fair and cream teas in the Pavilion, plus refreshments at most of the Open Gardens. For details, contact the Parish Office or see the website. This is our event - so please support it and help to raise some money for charity.

The **Parish Assembly** will be held at the Pavilion on 23rd April at 7 pm. this year. Details will be on our website soon: guest speaker to be announced. This is an important meeting for the village and a good opportunity to meet and speak to your Parish Councillors, for you to have your say and to discuss village matters. It's your village and we need to hear your views and suggestions, so please do come along. We will all look forward to seeing you.

On that note, we need some **new Parish Councillors**. If you have ever considered standing, now is the time to join us and be co-opted onto the council. We have regular meetings and cover all aspects of the village and Memorial Ground as the trustee. You may have noticed that our **Speed Indicator Device (SID)**, is now up and running on the A39 (Priest St.) approaching Williton from Minehead. The device records and monitors the speed of each passing vehicle and performs a traffic count in both directions. This will give us, for the first time, traffic flow information through the village.

Our very own Speed Watch Team are back in action. So watch out for them and give them a wave as you pass. . . I said *wave!*

Continuing on the subject of road safety, Somerset Council have launched a new Safety initiative for the county called 'The Fatal Five' to fight the increase in

fatal accidents across our county. I would have liked to go into a lot of detail about this very important campaign but, unfortunately, space prevents me. However, here are a few sobering facts from the Council's website:

- 2023 saw 30 people die on Somerset's roads in 2023, almost 43% up on 2022
- Highest number of fatalities in 10 years
- No easy-to-see reason for the increase, but
- 76% of the fatal collisions involved **one of 5 Fatal Behaviours** (see bottom of the page). This is what gave the campaign its title.
- Almost half of fatal collisions were caused by vehicles crossing into the path of another one.
- Of the 30 fatalities, 11 were car drivers, 12 were motorcyclists, 4 were car passengers and 3 were pedestrians.
- Fourteen of last year's fatalities happened on the county's 'A' roads, five were on trunk roads, five were on B roads and six were on unclassified roads
- Figures for 2023 are the highest since 2014, when 33 deaths occurred.

The minimum pressure 29.15 inches - 089 mm on the 8th. (Lots of rain!)


The total rain was 132mm


