
Eliza Pelling Working with Refugees



Down at the Station October 2021



As I write this, we are just into the Mixed Traction Weekend where over the next two days there will be about eighteen trains running in each direction through our little station! A mighty change from the past few months when there has generally been three each way every running day. However, it is good to be able to report that passenger numbers have been higher than expected, which must be good for the overall finances of the WSR. Trains are still terminating at Dunster with a bus transfer on into Minehead, and this is expected to continue for the remainder of the season. Hopefully by March 2022???

At Williton we have been staffed every running day and the shop has been open for visitors and passengers alike. We are now able to serve from inside the shop rather than through the window which makes life a little easier. The Plant Sales have come to an end but have been replaced by home grown garden produce which has brought in some useful funds to help us keep afloat. The Book sales both at the station and from 6 Long Lakes, have been steady and again a useful help. Thanks to all those who have made so many purchases over the year.

You may have seen in the local Press that the Christmas trains have been announced and there are leaflets available at the station giving details. They are split between the traditional Santa Trains running from Bishops Lydeard to Williton and return, with a visit from Santa on the way - these will be at weekends during December with a few extra during the week running up to Christmas. Then this year there will be the Winter lights, a new venture for us but special illuminated trains will run on some evenings from mid-November from Bishops Lydeard to Crowcombe and back with additional illuminated tableaus in some of the fields, on the way. These will be run every weekend from the 19th of November and then more often into December. Bookings have already commenced, which you can do online: John Parsons Station Master.



Farming in Protected Landscapes September 2021 Newsletter

Protected Landscapes - our National Parks and Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty - are special and unique places. They are living, working landscapes that also support a huge range of habitats and species, and they are enjoyed by millions of people every year. By supporting the farmers, land managers and people who live and work in these areas, we can help protect these exceptional places and support local communities.

The Farming in Protected Landscapes programme has now been launched and is open for applications in the Quantocks Hills AONB.

Through the programme, farmers and land managers can be supported to carry out projects that support nature recovery, mitigate the impacts of climate change, provide opportunities for people to discover, enjoy and understand the landscape and cultural heritage, or support nature-friendly, sustainable farm businesses. This is a programme of funding for one-off projects covering these areas of work, not an agri-environment scheme.

The programme supports activity on any land within the Quantocks Hills AONB. It can also support activity on other land where projects can demonstrate benefit to the Quantocks Hills AONB, or the AONB's objectives.

The application window for the first year of funding closes in January 2022, but applications will be assessed on an on-going basis throughout the application period, so we're advising applicants to apply as soon as possible for the best chance of success. Applications for £5,000 or more will need to be approved by our Local Assessment Panel, which meets periodically.

The total months rainfall was only 43.5mm.



Williton And Surrounding Parkinson's Support Group WASPS

After a break of eighteen months, we were at last able to have a normal monthly meeting. On September 2nd the meeting took place in our new venue, the Village Hall at Sampford Brett. The Hall is a good size for us and there is ample free parking, just over the road.

The meeting was preceded as usual with exercises. Our new exercise leader is Jane Snell a qualified Tai Chi instructor. The exercises were excellent, easy to do sitting down and it was fascinating to discover that shoulder exercises could make turning your head so much easier. We were also given advice about sitting correctly and ankle and foot exercises.

Jane Cooper opened the meeting thanking Linda Bishop for her many years of work as Chairman of the WASPS committee and presenting her with flowers. Linda reported there is still a struggle going on with Parkinson's UK over our blue sticks. They do not feel that they are strong enough, but our supplier will emphasise that they are made to accepted standards. We do still have some of the blue sticks for sale.

Our speakers for the afternoon were our two local community Police Officers Sue Thompson and Sue Marks. They are both based in Williton and, with other officers, are responsible for a huge area. Their responsibilities cover a wide range—crime prevention, theft, hunting issues, criminality, domestic disputes, and some emergencies. For the more serious incidents there are always trained police response officers based in Williton who also cover the area.

They reminded us that the Williton Police Station had not closed but is now located behind the old District Council offices in Killick Way. We were also reminded that for minor emergencies we should dial 101, using 999 for major emergencies.

The two Sues explained their work, how they communicate with each having their own unique shoulder numbers and personal radios. They share their jobs together each day and work shift times Any information they discover about families in difficulty because of problems such as long-term unemployment, poor attendance at school, or alcoholism they share at regular meetings with other social service and health professionals.

They explained the importance of putting information onto our mobile telephones including 'the What Three Words' App which helps people find you quickly if you get lost. They also explained ICE the In Case of Emergency app which is useful to have on your phone in case of accident or emergency as it gives details of your health, contact numbers etc.

Booklets were given to everyone warning of scams and cold callers. Scams can be very convincing, don't fall for them! If you are unhappy about a workman coming to your house who is unknown to you call for help. But better to employ someone who is recommended to you.

This very useful talk was followed by questions. A query was put about gun licences, and we were reassured to hear of strict checking. Neighbourhood Watch is helpful and there is also Horsewatch for horse owners. The farming community can be very helpful in reporting incidents.

Both Sue's are local and have good knowledge of the countryside which is useful for them and helpful to us. Continued on next page.
