Starting back cautiously with all seats being pre-booked and social spacing in all the carriages etc, we have slowly come back to something nearer normal, although on-train staff have continued to wear masks and Perspex dividers have remained in place between the seats. We are now able to sell tickets and in the most, passengers may sit anywhere in the trains.


The long awaited work on the crossing equipment at Seaward Way in Minehead should also be completed and over the next month, final rewiring of the signal-box and associated works should be completed; staff training will have been carried out, and all will be set to open the 2022 season with trains running the full length of the line. In aid of St Peter's Church

As we come out of lockdown and enter a new phase in coping with Corona virus, the Parish Council is gradually getting back to a more normal way of functioning. During this period we lost one of our members of staff and have completed the recruitment of a new person to fulfil a slightly re-defined role. We are pleased to welcome Julie to that role. There will also be a third person for a newly created part-time post which will complete our plans for the proper administration of the Council.

There are several projects that the Council have been trying to progress and are at various stages of development. Funds have been received from the Somerset West and Taunton District Council to refurbish and re-open the public toilets in Killick Way. There has been considerable delay in securing the lease of the building from Somerset West and Taunton Council but this has been achieved. The electricity supply has been split to the building so that it can be can be metered. The next step is the putting out for tender the works required, a process that will be overseen by a third party agent who has now been appointed. It is essential that the project is completed before the end of the financial year or the grant may have to be returned to the District Council. Although the grant is bringing the toilets back into use, the Parish Council will need to subsidise their operation year-on-year.

Speeding traffic is a problem. Two initiatives are being progressed. A Speedwatch Group has been set up thanks to volunteers who have offered their time. A "speed gun" will be used on the roadside, to measure the speed of vehicles. Those clearly ignoring speed limits are reported to the police who will take appropriate action. Full training is being arranged with the Police before the group takes its role. In the past the Group has been very effective in reminding motorists of their speed on roads in the village. This more softlysoftly approach is better than having the dreaded speeding notice arrive in the post with a fine and three points. Another road safety initiative being progressed is the installation of a Speed Indicator Device or SID for short. Many villages and towns have these. They used to be bought, installed and monitored by the County Council Highways Department, but it no longer does this. The original poles and brackets are still in place. Later this month a Highways engineer will inspect the poles and say what needs to be done, if anything, to bring them back into use. Meanwhile the Parish Council has sourced the SID and will take delivery of it as soon as it can be put into use. It only remains for a contractor or individual to be appointed and trained to maintain the SID and move it from post to post as required. If you are interested in fulfilling that role please get in touch with the Clerk..

Something to look out for is the result of an application for a grant to start up a "lunch club" event in the Pavilion. The Council should hear very soon if the grant application is successful. The plan put forward is to provide 10 lunch sessions with up to 20 places. The purpose is to encourage people who have been isolating themselves for a long period during the pandemic to gain confidence to come out of their homes and meet others. A further grant has also been applied for to extend the number of sessions based on what is learned from the first pilot phase. Arrangements are being made with a professional caterer to provide the meals and serve them to ensure the project can quickly go ahead if the funding is given.

In the months ahead these things and many others are being organised or funded by the Parish Council. If we are to see more happening in our community it needs volunteers to come forward. Parish councillors decide how funds are to be spent. Of course, on occasions they roll up their sleeves and actually get involved in events. However, at present, there are only eleven of them so if you would like to help decide how to spend our share of the Council Tax, apply to the Clerk to fill the vacant place and bring us up to full strength. If you are interested in helping run events then please contact the Clerk as a register of volunteers is being drawn up with the purpose of putting them in touch with organisations which need voluntary help. If people come forward much more can be done in our community and Williton made a better place for us all to live in.

Overgrown Hedges: Please could we politely request that if you have a hedge on your boundary that you trim back vegetation, as the hedges are causing problems around the Parish. The next Full Moon will take place on November 19th, it's known as the Beaver Moon so named because it marks the time when beavers are preparing their homes for winter.


NATURE NOTES



This Month's Recipe

1tsp

- Apples
- 1kg 225g Soft Brown Sugar
- 110g Sultanas
- 50g Dried Cranberries
- 50g Chopped Hazelnuts
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp Cinnamon

200ml Dry Cider 225g Raisins 60g **Dried Apricots**



- **Dried** Cherries Ground Mixed Spice
- Grated Rind & Juice of a small orange

1-2 tsp Brandy

Method

- 1. Heat the cider and sugar in a large pan, until the sugar dissolves.
- 2. Add the remaining ingredients apart from the brandy.
- 3. Partly cover then simmer for approximately 40 50 minutes until the apples are pulpy and the liquid has been absorbed.
- 4. Stir in the brandy.
- Spoon the mincemeat into clean warm jars. 5.
- 6. Cover and store in a cool place for up to 6 months.
