



For those people who want to up skill with their computers, laptops, tablets or mobile phones we have sessions available to support you. These sessions need to be booked with the library staff.




If you would like to play Scrabble, we have a wonderful Scrabble board available for use in the library. Please be aware that you can book a session to use it.

Doing Our Bit for Climate Change



Villagers may have noticed that work has commenced on the creation of a number of wildflower areas within Williton. Earlier this year, the Parish Council was successful in its bid to create wild flower areas in Williton on 3,050 square metres of land at Larviscombe Road, Orchard Way/ Long Lakes, Northcroft and The Green/Danesborough View, the verges around Williton Fire Station and part of the Memorial Ground.

Aimed at improving the biodiversity around the village and creating a resilient sustainable habitat for wildlife, it is a small contribution to wider work to tackle climate change.

The areas have been prepared and seeded with native or naturalised wildflower mixes including both annuals and perennials and meadow grasses. We are looking forward to seeing these bloom next year, although we have to be patient as they will not fully come into their own until their second year.

The Parish Council is extremely grateful to the Climate and Emergency Community Fund of Somerset County Council for agreeing to the funding of this project, to Magna Housing, Devon and Somerset Fire Service and the Williton War Memorial Recreation Ground charity for agreeing to planting on their land, and to former Parish Councillor Rosemary Woods for all of her hard work in making this happen. If there are other initiatives you would like the Parish Council to consider, please do let the Clerk know. Contact details above.



Two Valleys Slow the Flow Natural Flood Management

Since 2018, conservation charity the Wildfowl and Wetlands Trust (WWT) has been working on natural flood management (NFM) as part of the 'Two Valleys' project. We're working with local landowners to put in interventions such as

leaky woody dams, wetlands and trees to help store and slow the flow of floodwater in the Doniford and Monksilver streams. We're hoping lots of NFM measures upstream add up and ultimately help to reduce the 'flood peak' to alleviate some flooding in Williton, all the while creating a multitude of habitat and biodiversity benefits throughout the catchment area. We're also scientifically monitoring the streams to build an evidence base on the effectiveness of NFM, supported by local volunteers who are out monitoring waterways (thank you!).

We're now entering the final few months of funding for this four year project, which runs to March 2022. In this time, in partnership with local landowners, contractors, volunteers and communities we have created:



- 19 wetlands.
- 3678 native hardwood trees planted. •
- 193 woody dams
- 1 wet woodland (very rare habitat).
- 12 volunteer citizen scientists actively monitoring the streams Dozens of community engagement events.
- Working with four parish councils of Bicknoller, Stogumber, Sampford Brett and Elworthy to identify future opportunities for taking NFM forward.


What's next?

We hope communities and landowners will continue to implement NFM if and when funding becomes available, supported by WWT's help in identifying opportunities and next steps. Though WWT's funding is drawing to a close, new funding may continue for NFM managed by other great charities and organisations.

WWT is the UK's leading wetland conservation charity. Our vision is a world where healthy wetland nature thrives and enriches lives.






Open House on 27th February 10AM – 1PM.

DECEMBER

In the first half of December we had every type of weather except for dense fog : rain hail sleet snow thunder lightening rainbows and floods.

NOVEMBER


ASTRONOMICAL NEWS
