

SOMERSET QUALITY POTATOES

CAPTON FARM POTATOES

Williton has its very own potato farmer. You might not have heard of them even though the White family have been farming at Capton since 1967.

Potatoes are a tricky crop. They require a settled environment of warmth and water - something this summer did not offer them. Instead Capton Farm used their own reservoir (filled from winter storage of rain water) and an irrigation system laid in 1976/77. After many weeks of moving the rain gun within seven fields, and 'raining' 12 hours a day the potatoes are now ready and waiting. The job of digging, hauling, grading and bagging is still done on the farm using three generations of the farming family. Then they are kept cold and safe in their on site cold store.

They grow five varieties and supply and sell up and down the country to pubs, schools, chip shops and in the past have supplied to Ginsters. They do not supply supermarkets though. People are very welcome to come to the farm itself to buy a 10kg or 25kg bag.

They are also interested in providing 'potato hubs' within the community where they can drop off 10kg and 25kg bags which organisers can split down to supply customers with smaller quantities. You can find their potatoes at Veggie Patch (Watchet), Roadwater Village Stores and Doniford Farm Shop too.


Variety's available - Sagitta, Maris Piper, Picasso, Ramos and Markies.

Sagitta available now - 10kg bags are £4 and 25kg bags are £7 from the farm

Other varieties being bagged mid to late September. They will be available all over winter and into spring.

Spuds available for collection at Capton Farm at £4 (10kg) and £7 (25kg) - no pre order necessary - Monday to Friday - 8am to 5pm.





Down at the Station October 2022



The minimum pressure of 29.7 inches. On the 15th.


The total months rainfall was only 74mm most of it on the 16th & 17th.

The Mobile Pantry Project

This wasn't the temperature outside fortunately, although it may have felt like it if you had to work in it. Thankfully the Methodist Schoolroom was blissfully cool last week, and we were quite comfortable even if the clients arriving for the Pantry were not, reminding us how hot it was outside. However, thanks to our friends in Kilve, we had Ice Pops for them to take home and freeze to help them cool down.

Volunteers have been kept busy as numbers have risen and a queue is usually forming thirty minutes before our designated opening time. Nevertheless, we are conscious of those who are unable to get to us, and it is only because of the Community Network in Stogursey picking up fortnightly for ten families that we are able to support them. This situation continues to remind us how much the Mobile Pantry is needed.

At the end of March, the fund for the Electric Vehicle stood at 53% of the target required. Since then, our indomitable supporters have caught the vision for the venture and started fund-raising, holding garden open days, growing and selling produce, and busking. To these and many more who have given so generously we are incredible.

Demand on the Pantry soars again ...

It is not surprising that people are turning to the Foodbank for support. Everyday essentials: pasta, butter and milk, have risen between 24% and 30% whilst the increase in confectionery was 4% and alcohol even lower at 2.8%, holding the overall percentage down. However, the latter attracted no comment from the media.

As the evenings draw in we will start to see our spikey little visitors earlier and earlier in our gardens. Hoglets born in the late summer, known as Autumn babies, are very vulnerable due to the change in the weather and the reduced amount of time they have to 'fatten up'. They need to put on lots of weight to survive hibernation and they are prone to heavy burdens of internal worms that can quickly debilitate them and be life threatening. Any help you can

give in your gardens will be much appreciated by hedgehogs.

Putting out extra food and water can be a life saver, offer meaty cat or dog food or cat biscuits and water to drink. If you have an empty hedgehog box you could prepare that for any juveniles (or adults) to encourage them to make their home near a regular supply of food. Collect up some dry leaves and put them in the box to help them with their nest making. Consider putting some dry hay in a large flowerpot or bucket and put it on its side next to the house. The hedgehog will help itself to the hay to make a cosy nest. Do not leave food in the nest box except biscuits in the entrance initially to tempt them in. Once occupied only provide food away from the home, perhaps in a feeding station. Plans for building homes and feeding stations can be found on the BHPS website, www.britishhedgehogs.org.uk

If you are concerned about any that look small as autumn progresses, contact your local rescue centre or the British Hedgehog Preservation Society for advice (01584 890801).

Remember that poorly hedgehogs are likely to be out in the day so use this as a warning sign. Those that are poorly could be lethargic or have flies around them or be struggling to walk, however hyperactivity in small hedgehogs eg racing around the garden rather than wandering looking for food, can also be a sign that there is a problem and help should be sought immediately. Adult hedgehogs moving 'with purpose' that appear healthy and are just out for short periods of time are probably ok to be left in the wild but do keep an eye on them. (Thanks to Kay Bullen, Trustee of the British Hedgehog Preservation Society for her advice)

I know that there are a lot of you in the area who are very protective towards hedgehogs and are already doing your bit for their survival. I love hearing your stories about your little visitors, and watching your film footage on our Facebook page (Watchet Hedgehogs) keep them coming!




