There are local residents, mainly elderly people, in Watchet and Williton, who are unable either to drive themselves or to catch buses, which makes it very difficult for them to keep medical or dental appointments, visit their partners or friends in care homes, do their shopping, or even just get out of the house and meet other people.

WHEELS is a group of drivers who offer personal, door to door lifts in their own cars for as low a charge as possible, to avoid the practical difficulties and sometimes the isolation of those who cannot get about under their own steam. As well as being able to claim a mileage allowance, these drivers meet some lovely passengers, and know that they are providing a service which is very much appreciated. Drivers choose the journeys they wish to undertake, which may be as frequent or occasional as they wish.

AVIAN INFLUENZA (Bird Flu)

From 7th November 2022, it became a legal requirement for all bird keepers to keep their birds housed and to follow stringent biosecurity measures to protect their



This applies whether keepers have commercial flocks, or just a few birds in a backyard. The decision was made by the UK's Chief Veterinary Officer, as the UK continues to face its largest ever outbreak of avian influenza – with over 70 cases since the start of October. You should be vigilant for any signs of disease in your birds and seek prompt advice from your vet if you have any concerns.

You can help protect your birds and prevent avian flu by maintaining good biosecurity on your premises, including:

- Housing or netting all poultry and captive birds.
- Minimising direct and indirect contact between poultry and captive birds and wild birds - including making sure that their feed and water is not accessible to wild birds.
- Preventing access by poultry and captive birds to ponds and watercourses
- Cleansing and disinfecting footwear and equipment before and after contact with poultry and captive birds (or changing into clean footwear before tending to your birds).
- Regularly cleaning and disinfecting hard surfaces in areas where birds are
- Reducing the movement of people, vehicles or equipment to and from areas where poultry and captive birds are kept, to minimise contamination, and using effective vermin control.
- Keeping fresh approved disinfectant at the right concentration for use at farm entrances and before entering poultry and captive bird housing or enclosures.

Faith Reflection

I can't believe it's nearly December already! Where has the year gone? Has it been a good year for you, or has it been difficult? Perhaps it has been a mixture. As we approach the season of Advent, it is a time to stop, and reflect on the year and prepare for the coming of Jesus. Globally it has been difficult, climate change continues to be a pressing issue and the war in Ukraine has dominated much of the year bringing much pain, sadness and heartache to so many people. It has been good to welcome Ukrainian families into our communities, but we know for them, it has not been an easy time. The cost of living crisis has affected us all and money is tight. For some of us, with Christmas just around the corner, it is a worrying time, how will we be able to afford presents, how will we be able to celebrate in the way we normally do this year? These are difficult questions.

At Advent we are encouraged to take time to pause, to stand still, breathe deeply and prepare for the birth of Jesus. At Christmas we like to think of Jesus being born in a manger with Mary and Joseph and all the animals, the shepherds and the wisemen, and it being a sweet story that we see in the children's nativity plays. But it wasn't sweet and cosy, it was messy and difficult. Jesus was born in poverty, in a smelly stable with smelly animals and smelly shepherds! Mary and Joseph travelled a long way to Bethlehem, and when they got there, tired and weary, the hotels were full, there was no room. It definitely was not easy, as we like to believe.

Brian Draper, an author and Retreat leader, encourages us in Advent to stop and notice. To go outside, to stop and look at the trees, listen to the birds, look at the twilight skies, marvel at the beauty of creation. Whatever our circumstances, we can all do this. I would like to set you all a challenge to take 5 minutes each day to go outside, or if that is not possible, go and stand or sit by a window and look out and notice. And in that time of stopping and noticing think about our amazing God who made this beautiful earth and sent his son Jesus into the world to come and live among us. As the Message Bible puts it, 'Jesus moved into the neighbourhood.' (John 1). I love that! So, in all the difficulty, in all the pain, Jesus came to live amongst us and walk beside us. As we prepare for Christmas, let us hold onto that.

On behalf of the Churches in Watchet and Williton, I would like to wish you all much peace this Christmas.

Lowest income households set to pay no Council Tax

A new, unified Council Tax Reduction Scheme targeting help at people on low incomes, care leavers and foster carers is planned for Somerset from 1 April 2023 when the new Somerset Council comes into being.

The Scheme was approved by Somerset County Council's Executive on 16th November, and will go to Full Council on November 23rd for final approval. The scheme will be simpler and fairer and means that the lowest income households will pay no Council Tax.

A single person with an income below £95 a week, or a couple with two children on a weekly income below £260, would be entitled to the full 100% council tax reduction. However, some families with an income below £500 a week could also be eligible for some support.

Care leavers up to the age of 25 will continue to be exempt from Council Tax and an entirely new measure, not currently offered by any of the district councils, will give Somerset County Council registered foster carers and qualifying Special Guardians a 50% reduction.

Certain benefits for people with disabilities, war pensioners, families in receipt of child benefit/maintenance and carers will not be considered when income is assessed. The scheme for pension age applicants is set by Government and will continue unchanged.

Councillor Liz Leyshon, Executive Lead Member for Finance and Human Resources said: "This is going to be a very challenging year for council finances, but it is important that we provide help to the people who need it most, no matter where they live in the county. The new Somerset Council is a chance to make Somerset fairer for everyone.

"We also want to support our foster carers who make a real difference to the lives of vulnerable children in Somerset as well as charities based in the county that do so much for so many people."

The simpler scheme will, if approved by Council, replace four separate systems operated by Somerset's district councils with varying levels of council tax support. The changes will harmonise support for working-age people on low incomes across the county.

While increasing support for the most vulnerable, the Council also agreed fairer charges for second homes and empty properties aimed at bringing empty homes back into use. There will be no discounts for second homes or empty homes while long-term empty properties will attract premiums, for example 100% for properties empty for two years, rising to 300% after ten years.

The Council Tax Reduction Scheme went out to public consultation in July and by the time it closed in September had attracted almost 1,200 responses – the majority supporting the proposals.

The new scheme will be simpler, easier to understand and less complicated to administer than the existing four district-based schemes.

The Council has also developed a new Business Rate Discretionary Relief scheme which aligns the different approaches currently in operation across the four districts into a single scheme. The new approach targets discretionary support at Somerset based Together we are delivering your charities and many not-for-profit organisations







Look out on the 8th December 2022, Mars will be in opposition as Mars will pass behind the Moon this event is known as a lunar occultation.




Again, I notice there are a lot of trees with green leaves while many are just bare twigs. I saw a bumble bee still about on our flowers.




