



Hello from Williton Hospital!

We are sure that a lot of you will know that there is a wonderful Community Hospital in the Village, some may have visited family, or been a patient yourself or maybe come to one of our fabulous Christmas Fairs!

We felt it is time to let you know more about the Hospital and how you can become involved with supporting your local Community Hospital!

Williton Hospital is part of the Somerset Foundation Trust which includes the Acute General Hospital Musgrove Park, and 13 Community Hospitals such as Williton, Minehead and Bridgwater. Each of these have their own specialities, some are for short term general rehabilitation. Williton and South Petherton are for specialised rehabilitation from stroke and brain injury.

Williton Hospital currently has 20 beds open on Meadow Ward – 19 within the Stroke recovery Centre and 1 End of life bed in "Graces Room". Patients can be admitted from anywhere across Somerset. There is also an Ambulatory care Unit which enables treatment of day case patients who would otherwise have to travel to Taunton, and visiting clinics for physiotherapy and maternity. The District Nurse and the Single point of access teams are both based in their hubs on the Annex.

We have recently won a "Somerset Stars" Award for our multidisciplinary approach to Stroke Rehabilitation where the Nursing and Therapy teams work closely in conjunction to enable patients to achieve their best potential. Social Workers and Community Agents in-reach closely to help support patients with finances, housing and placement if required. Our Doctor Clare provides full time dedicated care and is supported by MPH Stroke Consultant Rob. Our psychologist Scott supports patients in what is in no doubt a life-changing time.

"Graces Room" is a "jewel in the NHS" – a dedicated bed for End of Life care, a very spacious and peaceful room where families can stay with their loved one, knowing there is 24 hour support and care on hand. Senior Sister Sharon has been instrumental in developing "best practise" in end of life and palliative care across the trust.

We are heavily supported by our fantastic League of Friends who campaign fiercely to protect our services and also fundraise for purchases that are not covered by the NHS – they have recently provided new furnishings for our staff room and equipment for the patients to use in sessions with our Activity co-ordinator Kim. We rely on volunteers who work alongside our staff to enrich patient experience and activity – they support us with tasks including; bed-making, hand massage,

Somerset Bus Partnership Welcomes Flat Rate Fare Proposals



Somerset Bus Partnership welcomes the Government's plan to provide up to £60 million, to enable bus operators to cap single adult bus fares at £2. The £2 flat fare comes in from the beginning of January and will continue through to the end of March 2023. Most bus operators are expected to adopt the scheme.

This means millions of people across England will save money, at a time when many households are suffering massive pressures from the rising cost of living. The move will help people travel for work, education, shopping and medical treatments and provide a much-needed saving in daily expenditure.

The current average single fare for a 3-mile journey is estimated at over £2.80, meaning that the new fare will save passengers almost 30% of the price every time they travel.

In addition, Somerset County Council currently plans to introduce a £1 single/ £2 return bus fare in Taunton, as part of its Bus Service Improvement Plan. Somerset Bus Partnership welcomes this initiative but emphasises the need to procure further funding to enable this flat rate fare to be extended across all of Somerset.

Somerset Bus Partnership Co-Chair, Peter Travis, said, "Bus usage declined in Somerset in the last decade, and even more so during the pandemic. We need initiatives like these to restore and improve passenger levels. Encouraging people to choose buses over cars helps to reduce carbon emissions. It is estimated that the Government's £60 million will reduce car journeys by at least 2 million and cut pollution and congestion for all of us."

Somerset Bus Partnership will continue to work closely with Somerset County Council to encourage bus use and ensure implementation of the Bus Service Improvement Plan across the county.

The end of the old year and beginning of a new one is traditionally the time when we look back on what has happened and look forward to what is to come.

2022 started with some optimism that the worst of the Coronavirus pandemic was over but is ending with worry and concern for many with the cost-of-living crisis. During the year there has been the so-called Russian "military operation" in Ukraine and its ongoing threat of world, possibly nuclear, war and times of celebration and having fun and times of mourning.

So, what has Williton Parish Council been doing during this historic year.

During the Coronavirus pandemic the Parish Council has received funds for grants to help enable our businesses, and the village, recover and in March working with those businesses we re-opened the Public Toilets in Killick Way and as a result rather than just passing through the village travellers are now taking a break and visiting our shops. We have also facilitated the creation of a business group Williton and District Business Association which is going from strength to strength.

Other grants we received were to assist those who were feeling isolated and lonely because of the pandemic with a hot meal, initially expecting that to last for about ten weeks, however, working with Foxes Academy in Minehead not only are we continuing to provide a meal at a reasonable cost once on Tuesdays but also a cream tea each Thursday during term times.

June 2022 saw the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and the Parish Council organised the Beacon Lighting Ceremony on the Memorial ground on a lovely early June evening and a "Party in the Park" on a very damp Sunday! Not long after that we were mourning the death of Her Majesty and the Parish Council had a moving tribute in the office window and led the vigil for Her Majesty and read the Proclamation of the Succession of His Majesty King Charles III on the eve of the Queen's funeral.

Late February saw the start of the war in Ukraine and by May families in the village were welcoming refugees into their homes. The Parish Council, working with the Village Agents set up a facility to help those refugees adapt to life in the UK and settle into our community.

The war in Ukraine amongst many other factors has led to the energy and cost-of-living crisis that we are all facing at the moment some more so than others. In addition to the meals on Tuesdays and Thursdays which also provide somewhere warm for a few hours. As well as this the Parish Council is opening its office in Killick Way as a "Warm Hub" on Monday afternoons and Wednesday and Friday mornings and we are working with Foxes to start a "Soup Club" in the near future, more details to follow in the New Year.

As Cllr White mentioned last month we have been working with the police to restart the Speed Watch group which is starting to see some results in slowing traffic in the village; but we need more volunteers to be able to be out more often and at more locations, if you are able to help please contact the office (details on top of previous page). We are also working with our County Councillors and Highways to see what other measures can be introduced to slow traffic down particularly on Long Street and Tower Hill.

In addition to everything above the Parish Council has been commenting on many planning applications that affect our village and we are looking at ways that we can work with Watchet Town Council on applications that have an impact on both communities.

Who knows what 2023 will bring, but there will be challenges for us as the new Somerset County Unitary Authority comes into being and the old County and District Councils are dissolved in April and Parish Councils will be encouraged to take on services that have previously been done by others. Also depending on the planning process it is anticipated by the developers that the building of the new 350 house estate on the edge of the village will start by the middle of next year, we will have to see how the works traffic affects us and be ready to start welcoming new residents to our village shortly after that.

If there is anything that you feel that the Parish Council could or should be doing for the village and its inhabitants, please let us know and in the meantime may I wish you a healthy and prosperous 2023.





Last year it was a very mild November up to 19°C in Aberdeen.


ASTRONOMICAL NEWS






