



Petrol costs

There are some great resources that allow you to find the nearest, cheapest fuel prices, https://www.petrolprices.com/ seems to be the best, with a handy downloadable app as well as a website.

Community Larders/Fridges

These are popping up all over the county where you pick up free food and household items, with no appointment or referral needed. Somerset County Council Household Support Fund

This fund offers short-term urgent financial help to people in Somerset struggling to afford essentials such as buying food, paying for utility bills, or other items such as beds and white goods. Bishop Fox's Educational Grant

Faith Reflection

After Mass one Saturday evening recently, a wine merchant parishioner asked me, "Are you observing dry January?". No, I told him, I'd rather observe dry Lent: it's longer than January and concentrates the mind better!

We seem to have just finished the Christmas season this year when the spectre of Lent looms up: Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, is on February 22nd. After the times of Advent preparation for Christmas and the joyful nature of the Christmas season, we now need to set our minds on the solemn reflections of Lent as we prepare to consider afresh the trial, humiliation and death of Jesus before his glorious resurrection and return to his home in heaven. Lent is a time to look both backwards and forwards: how have we failed ourself and others in the past, and how can we put this situation right in the future.

Lent is almost always seen as a time for giving things up. We deny ourselves some pleasure such as a glass (or two) of wine, or stop eating our favourite chocolate or fattening cakes in the hope of feeling better afterwards. We can, however, extend this practice from the obvious cases of self-denial to include more serious denial which can affect, not just ourselves, but those around us as well. Lent should, also, be a time to take a fresh look at our relationship with others and to see if there are ways in which we can better them by refraining from critical attitudes or harmful condemnation.

Further, Lent should be a time of self-improvement. The giving up of things and attitudes helps, but to make this really work we should try to improve our relationship with God. Put simply, we can try to talk to him more (yes, that's called praying!). We don't need to learn some complex formulae, just to "have a chat" with him: tell him what's on your mind and then have a time of silence, just to listen: you'll be surprised how often he does answer you.

So, give up things if you want, but remember to do the positive in Lent as well. Have a Happy and Holy season and an Easter full of resurrection joy. God bless you all. Deacon Vincent

I ended my piece last month with who knows what challenges 2023 will bring to Williton and mentioned the large housing development on Priest Street. No new details have come forward about that yet but a detailed planning application for the proposed estate off Doniford Road near Normandy Avenue has now been lodged with Somerset West and Taunton District Council (SWAT). Outline planning permission was given in 2021 for 139 new houses together with some amenity land with the only road access being from the Doniford Road about 150 metres Williton side of the junction into Alamein Road. This new application is now about house design, final details of the road layouts etc. The Parish Council will be discussing this and making its observations known to the District Council and if you would like to raise any concerns that you have about this new development please go to the SWAT website and log into the planning pages (www.somersetwestandtaunton.gov.uk/planning/find-a-planning-application) and search using reference 3/37/23/001 where you can see the documents and follow the instructions to make your comments.

On the subject of planning Watchet Town Council have also been looking at a large, proposed development at Parsonage Farm. Whilst some developments are within either Williton's boundary or Watchet's boundary some straddle the border but what they all have in common is that they will have an impact on both communities. The planners normally only speak to the Parish Council and Town Council individually so the two councils are in discussion to see how we can work together to put a united front to SWAT (and the new authority) when making planning decisions that affects us both.

The date when the new Somerset Council comes into being is fast approaching and it looks like a preliminary decision has been made as to which towns and parishes come together to form Local Community Networks (LCN's). Williton has been put together with Watchet, Minehead and villages along the A358 and A39. More details as to how these will work will no doubt become clearer in the next few months. The Parish Council was invited to a presentation about the properties that the Somerset County and District Councils own. With the New Council coming into force, it is anticipated that some of the properties will be surplus to requirements but the consultations and analysis as to what is needed is at an early stage. It was emphasised that service provision was not being looked at and this review is solely about how and where it is delivered.

After a cold December the start of January has been very wet, fortunately the flood plains have done their job and other than roads being closed we have not had the terrible flooding of homes and businesses that other parts of West Somerset and Exmoor has suffered. We still have a long while until summer and the possibility of further flooding is still there. Large parts of the village are vulnerable to flooding, so if your home or business is at risk please prepare for it and visit www.gov.uk and search for "flooding" where you can find lots of good advice and tips to help you.

Have you made any New Year's resolutions? If you have, do they involve doing something to help our native hedgehog population? If you haven't then maybe you may like to think about it. Making small changes in your garden will ensure that hedgehogs have safe havens. Not only that, you will be helping other wildlife as well. One important thing you can do is to make vour garden accessible to hedgehogs.

Have a wander around your garden, no matter how big or small it may be. Is there a point of access, can a hedgehog get under, or through, a fence, gate or wall? If not, what can you do to create access and be part of a hedgehog highway? One of the main reasons hedgehogs are struggling in Britain is because our fences and walls are becoming more and more secure, reducing the amount of land available for them in which to roam and look for food.

For hedgehogs one garden just isn't enough, they can travel up to 2km a night on their foraging forays, That's why you need to convince your neighbours to care about hedgehogs as much as you do. The residents of Dale Road in the Nottinghamshire village of Keyworth have made 42 holes in fences connecting gardens and creating a hedgehog super highway. In the village of Kirtlington, Oxfordshire, there are 60 connected houses, with gaps, holes and even ramps, in all shapes and sizes for hedgehogs to use, and other villages have announced plans to create similar networks in their bid to make the country's largest hedgehog highway.

Down at the Station February





Last year it was a very mild November up to 19°C in Aberdeen.


ASTRONOMICAL NEWS


