



BOOKINGS ARE ESSENTIAL

FOR YOUR SPACE

NEW HEALTH INITIATIVE? YES, PLEASE!

I was chatting with some friends in Blenheim Gardens, Minehead, last autumn, when I heard about this new health initiative, which is spreading out all over the British Isles and even abroad. I made some enquiries, attended a couple of meetings, and landed up on what might be called a "steering committee" though it is open to new folk at any time.

This is the People's Health Alliance, or PHA. What with the difficulties the NHS is going through at present, it is hard for us to secure a medical appointment of any kind, and with the GP's stretched to snapping point, we might only get 8 minutes of their time.

So who is going to listen to our health concerns? This is why the PHA is being set up, in over 70 towns and cities in the UK, each hub tailored to the needs of its area – there is no blueprint, other than a) giving the person TIME to talk about their health concerns, free of charge, and b) to offer a list of practitioners, ideally in time, in conventional medicine, as well as right now, in complementary therapies.

But many of us don't know what the complementary therapies ARE, or where to find a practitioner, particularly if not that good on the computer. So we at the Taunton Hub are setting up a series of evening presentations at which practitioners will speak about their "modality" – for instance, Naturopathy/ Wholistic Living, which deals with nutrition and lifestyle for health, or Micronutrients for Brain Health.

How will the Taunton Hub work? Well, it's all run by volunteers, there is a non-profit organization set up, with a conversation room, and trained folk who will listen to your problems, and then explain some suitable modalities, and show you a list from which you may choose a practitioner, and make your own appointment with them. We have an increasing list of practitioners in the area who would like to work with us – our role is to help you find treatment which suits you, and thus empower you to increase your own health.

Most services in the NHS are currently free, though over the decades we have had to pay for more and more (dentistry, optical, prescriptions) and the govt are talking about charging us for more services. Complementary therapists/ practitioners charge fees, because they are self-employed and this is their job. Ultimately, I hope we can set up a Hardship Fund, to help those who would find these fees beyond their means. And maybe Membership (at the small cost of £5 per month, which gives you free access to the Seeking Better Health educational evenings) will accrue enough that each Member could get at least one 'free' consultation with a practitioner per year. That's my dream!

This is all very new and we are feeling our way, and hoping, if the Taunton Hub is successful, to set up other hubs for instance in Minehead, which is closer to Williton. If you think this sounds interesting, do visit our website: www.tauntonpha.org, and/or write to us at: info@tauntonpha.org.





On Thursday, 23rd March local historian Geoff Lloyd will be giving an illustrated talk on Minehead Families in the First World War at Methodist Church Hall, The Avenue, Minehead, 7.30p.m.

Geoff is well known for his involvement, with Ian Davidson, in the publication of several books on Minehead, telling the stories of those who went away to fight and those who served in what later became the Red Cross hospital.

Following times of singing, prayer and bible reading – with contributions from all the churches represented – the congregation shared a buffet-style meal together.





It is mid-February as I sit down to write this, and as I do I wonder whether the hedgehogs which roamed the gardens in our terrace last year will do so again this year. I have three feeding stations in our garden, mainly because our garden is so long, in which I have put food for hedgehogs throughout the winter, and apart from the odd few biscuits disappearing

no one seems to be visiting to feast on the cat biscuits I leave out for them. Habitats change, people change the layout of their gardens and the places hedgehogs used to hide in are no longer there. This means that they will have to seek other places in which to forage for food.

However, recently a member of our group, who lives in Williton, has posted wildlife camera footage on our Facebook page showing that there is a very amorous male hedgehog in her garden, who appears to be pestering a smaller female while she was trying to eat. This could be an indication that in some areas here hedgehogs have come out of hibernation and are raring to go. The worry is that we will be seeing hoglets earlier than normal this year as the weather has been warmer lately. This is fine providing the night time temperatures are warm enough and there is enough natural food about. But if we suddenly have a cold spell then tiny hoglets born early may struggle if their mums cannot find enough food to keep their strength up to feed their tiny charges.

Something we must all bear in mind is taking care when starting to 'tidy up' our gardens after the winter months. Please check areas before you start to strim,



mow, and cut back any undergrowth. You may find that a hedgehog has made a winter nest (hibernaculum) and is still in there. Consider making plans now to 're-wild' a part of your garden for wildlife. Have a look for wild flower seeds in garden centres and make a list of plants to put in your garden which attract bees and other insects. Bee prepared (see what I did there?)

Hedgehogs and other wildlife will love you for it.

Search for Missing History of Women's Royal Naval Service

The UK Ministry of Defence estimated that 33,000 ladies of the Women's Royal



Naval Service were trained between Feb 1946 and July 1981 near Reading, on the site that was known as HMTE Burghfield, later HMS Dauntless.

During that period literally hundreds of 'official' photos were taken including training class photos. The negatives of these 'Divisional' photos were sent to the RN Photographic Unit in Yeovil. The WRNS Burghfield-Dauntless Project recently learned that many years ago the photographic units of the Army, Royal Navy and Royal Air Force were merged and the Archive went to an RAF base. Sadly space was an issue so any photos that were not considered of historic importance were destroyed. Divisional Photos were probably amongst the first to go.

The Project also discovered that HMS Dauntless kept hand-written ledgers. Massive great books that listed chronologically every Division, date and number, the name of every Wren in that Division and her naval details.

These ledgers were taken to HMS Raleigh in 1981 on the closure of HMS Dauntless as a training establishment. They were placed in storage and last seen in the mid 90s where they were being moved, destined for a Museum. And they then disappeared. Attempts to find these Ledgers both locally and nationally have come to nothing.

In an attempt to recreate this missing piece of Wren history the WRNS Burghfield-Dauntless Project was started in 2020 with the hope of finding as many of the 33,000 ladies, or their descendants, as possible. We know that military families travelled far and wide and settled all over the globe. We are gathering information from personal collections, service documents, memories and anecdotes and between the ladies who served and the families of those who are no longer with us, to put back what has been lost or destroyed over the past 30 years.

The total months rainfall was 147.5mm.


The minimum pressure of 29.8 inches. ASTRONOMICAL NEWS



We were delighted to welcome Dr Simon Cooper, who is well known by many of the members, and also our Patron, Mrs Anne Luttrell. Dr Cooper gave us an update about some of the latest research taking place around different medications. We were encouraged to take part in this research.

Although the Parkinson's team have been working throughout Covid, things are still not quite back to how they should be. A new Parkinson's nurse is due to start soon – although more are needed, and there should be a new consultant specialising in Parkinson's being trained to replace Dr Cooper it is hoped that he will not retire too soon!
