I am honoured to have been re-elected as Chair of Williton Parish Council at our Annual Meeting in May and hope that I can serve the Council and the Parish to the best of my ability in the forthcoming year. I have already had a couple of official engagements and was proud to have been invited into both Danesfield and St Peter's Schools to present their students with commemorative mugs as lasting memento of the historic event we saw at the beginning of May.

After the frenetic lead up to King Charles III's Coronation life seems to have gone a bit quiet for the Parish Council for the last couple of weeks but there is still plenty of work being done behind the scenes to make sure that services we provide are done to a high standard.


One of the things that is taking up our time is the children's playground. A routine health and safety inspection has highlighted the state of both wooden climbing frames, with them both approaching their end of life, especially the smaller frame. We have had to take the sad decision to remove that structure and it will be fenced off until we are able to do so. The larger frame has elements of it that have to be repaired but it will only be a short-term solution until that structure has to be removed as well. The small cradle swings are also breaking up. I would like to reinforce though that this is due to wear and tear and not vandalism. We are going to be replacing swings as soon as possible and we are investigating options as to what we replace the frames with. We welcome any suggestions so that the younger children in the village get what they want but we do want whatever it is to be more inclusive so children with disadvantages can also use it. Whatever we do though will be expensive and we are looking for funds and that will take some time and unfortunately I don't think the playground will fully re-open before the summer holidays.

We have had to close the public toilet that is open for everyone as the toilet has been damaged, it looks by accident rather than malicious, and we are having it repaired, but again it may be a few weeks before we can re-open. The disabled toilet is open but you need a RADAR key to get in.

Many things cannot happen without the aid of many volunteers, too many of you to mention by name, but thank you to everyone who helps us. However, I particularly want to thank those who have come forward to help us with Speed Watch in the village recently. With more volunteers Speed Watch can operate in more locations and more frequently and hopefully over the summer the amount of speeding along all four of the main roads coming into the centre of Williton will reduce.

The Parish Council can have twelve councillors and at present we have one vacancy. We have gone through the statutory requirements of asking residents if they want an election and have received no request to do so. We are now able to co-opt a councillor so if you would like to have an input into the way the Council serves the village please contact our clerk, Michelle Francis for more information and an application form.

I end in my usual way by asking that you contact the Parish Office if you think there is anything we are doing well, wrong or would like us do. *Cllr Peter Payne*.

Dear friends

Spring is a lovely time of year with the trees in full leaf and the flowers out in the hedgerows and gardens. I had a lovely walk on the Quantocks the other day with my dog, Ella. She is a golden retriever so even on the hills she manages to find some water to paddle in! She likes to stand in the water and look up at me, waiting for the command to carry on walking. When she was a puppy we had awful trouble getting her to come out of a river or the sea but now she is trained and comes out when called. It is always a joy to see the horses and foals when we walk the hills. It was a warm sunny day and most of the foals lying down in the warm sun.

Thinking of the sun reminds me of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. On the 4th of June it is Trinity Sunday, a topic that many preachers find difficult. Personally I have always found Augustine's illustration for the Trinity as the sun helpful. We experience the light and heat of the sun here on earth and we can see the colour of the sun from earth. But we can't separate those parts of the sun. While we read with the light from the sun's winter rays, we do not assume that the sun itself is different from what it is when we sit outside in the garden and enjoy its heat in the summer. We are aware that the light and heat and the colour of the sun are part of its whole being. They are not separate entities, they are part of a whole. Each part can only exist if the sun exists. They have no existence if there is no sun.

The sun is always there, even when we can't see it and I think that also relates to

our relationship with God. Sometimes we feel Jesus close by our side, sharing the joys and sorrows of life with us and loving us. But at other times we lose him and feel alone and unloved. But just as the sun is shining brightly in the midst of dark skies and thunderstorms, so is God with us at all times. It is just our

Known as the 'gardener's friend' our wild native hedgehogs munch their way nightly through the numerous creepy crawlies which frequent our gardens, to the delight of gardeners all over the country. But which of the long list of creepy crawlies are their favourites? Hedgehogs feed on a wide range of things but the majority of their diet is made up of invertebrates.

Scientific studies have analysed hedgehog poo or looked in the stomachs of hedgehogs killed on roads, to come to this conclusion. Hedgehogs are mostly insectivorous, and the most important invertebrates in their diet are caterpillars, earthworms, beetles, slugs, earwigs and millipedes. Occasionally they may eat amphibians, small rodents and birds that are already dead which they may come across in their nightly forays.

This is why it is important to keep an area of your garden 'wild'. To attract insects which will in turn attract hedgehogs. Using chemical insecticides will mean no food for hedgehogs!

Many people put out food for their nightly visitors, dry, meat flavour cat biscuits or wet food, or special hedgehog food. This is supplementary to a hedgehog's natural diet and there is no evidence to suggest you are causing them to become dependent on you for food.

Remember, don't put out bread and milk, dried mealworms, peanuts or sunflower hearts for hedgehogs as these all bring with them the danger of serious health problems. Always put out a shallow bowl of water, this may well just save a life!


# **Community Market**



From Thursday 8th to Saturday 10th of June, the West Somerset Railway will be staging another of its popular special events. This one celebrates historic diesel locomotives and star of the show will be 62-year-old Deltic locomotive No 55009. The Deltic class of locomotives were designed for high speed running with express passenger trains, and operated mainly on the East Coast mainline, between London (King's Cross), Newcastle and Edinburgh. When they were first introduced they had quite a lot to live up to because they replaced the A4 streamlined Pacific steam locomotives.

But over the years the diesel electric Deltic locomotives made a real name for themselves, running reliably at high speeds. Built by English Electric in 1961, 55009 was based at Finsbury Park depot in North London. Following East Coast tradition, 55009 is named after the racehorse Alycidon and the characteristic "Deltic roar" will be heard in West Somerset for those three days. 55009 will be working no less than two round trips each day during the festival and this will be the first chance to travel behind 55009 during 2023. She is normally based at Barrow Hill near Sheffield and can be seen on rail tours on the mainline from time to time. There will also be other visiting diesel locomotives as part of the weekend celebrating our heritage. 

I heard my first cuckoo on 10th of April as well as a red woodpecker on Staple Plain. Another dog walker said he saw a red kite there that week. Two days later


Kathy my wife spotted a red kite near Dunster castle. This year the blossom on the trees and shrubs are magnificent.




