



Flood Group - First on the agenda is the Flood Group. The Parish Council is in the process of signing off the flood plan, but the group is in dire need of flood wardens - if you would like to help, please pass on your details to the Parish Office who will in turn, pass these on to the Flood Group. We hope to have a contact number for next month, if flood assistance is required.

Speed Watch - Williton now has an active speed watch team. We also have been allocated three sites Danesfield School, Long Street and Tower Hill. We hope this will help alleviate the problem of speeding to some extent. At present the team is small group of 2 with 3 more awaiting training to sign on. If you would like to join just pass your details if interested to the Parish Office.

Williton Royal Mail - There appears to be an ongoing problem with mail Delivery. This is an important and vital service in many people's lives and the Parish Council is concerned by the development of the situation! We are contacting Royal Mail.

Memorial ground - The Parish Council was contacted with regards to antisocial behaviour, this included moving the picnic table by the old changing rooms (now known as The Barn) and climbing onto the roofs, this is of great concern both to potential damage to property and also the risk of injury to those individuals that are climbing on the roofs. Please if you see this report it to the local police as the Parish Council already have.

Childrens Play Area - The Parish Council acts as trustees to the Memorial Ground and as both Parish Councillors and the Trust would like to thank the users of the play area for their patience whilst the repairs are underway to the play equipment. Whilst on this issue the Trust is considering the future of the play equipment and will keep you updated as the future developments are decided.

After a short break in early November West Somerset Railways starts its festive experiences including the

Christmas Market at Minehead on 25th November, Dunster by Candlelight on 1st & 2nd December, Santa Expresses, Carol Trains, and our very popular "Winterlights" later in the month. All trains start from Bishops Lydeard and full details and booking for the events are on the website:

Although the public timetable will be stopping shortly it doesn't mean that we will be having a long rest. The maintenance needed to keep the station looking good will begin on Tuesday mornings in November starting with the cutting of the hedge along the platform and then moving on to repainting areas that need it. We are also pleased to see those others who have been away over the summer are now back to "work" with us.

Thank you to everybody who has come to the station this year whether it has been to catch a train, have a cup of tea or buy something from the plant and book stalls. It has been wonderful seeing you all and chatting. The topics of conversation we have with you and what we learn is amazing, and if we don't see you over the Christmas season we look forward to seeing you again next year.

Hello there.

I recently flew in an aeroplane for the very first time.

If you're surprised to find a 47-year-old who hadn't flown, imagine how amazed I was! Anyway, I found it to be an incredible experience (although not so much the security bits and the immigration stuff). The taking off, flying and landing experiences were incredible. At both ends of the trip.

I was amazed at how much power you can feel as the plane takes off - and how the world looks from high above. I saw a rainbow that was an almost complete circle and a sunrise, too. It was incredible.

One of the most striking things was watching the ocean below, as clouds drifted across it, far below. I wondered how high those clouds looked from the sea's surface - but there was no ship in sight.



In November, we will spend time remembering. Firstly, the plot to blow up Parliament in 1605 and later, those who have served in armed conflict. We will face the sad truth that humanity is capable of horrible violence and destruction. This can make me, and maybe us, feel both sad and cynical about the world. But the bible (see Psalm 8) reminds us that God

makes amazing things and that he cares deeply for them - even in parts of the sea that are nowhere near people. It might be that we feel God could do more to care for his creation; we might even feel angry about that. At the same time, I think it's worth remembering that God pays attention to everything in creation - from fish to people and everything in between.

And that a new perspective can be really good for us - no matter how old we are or how much we know.




I will advertise the rest of the Posting Dates in December's Williton Window. If you would like to pick up a pamphlet with all the dates, please pop in to the Post Office!

St Peter's School October News

Signs of Autumn were everywhere this afternoon as we walked to the church for our Harvest festival. Thankfully the rain held off just enough to allow us to enjoy the sights and sounds as we walked as a whole school through the community.

The boys and girls in Reception have well and truly settled into school life. They are engaging in new learning with great enthusiasm, showing fantastic perseverance and courage in the face of challenge – inspired by their new favourite book character Zog! 

Brrrrrrrr! It's getting colder! As I write this the leaves on trees are starting to turn to the wonderful colours of Autumn and the spiders in the garden are doing all they can to catch me as I walk around, by making the most wonderful webs across the path, at face level! Is it just me or does anyone else apologise to them when their webs are destroyed by walking into them?

So, what does this time of year mean for our hedgehogs? Thoughts of hibernation of course! They will soon start making cosy nests to hunker down in when the Winter really gets going. If you haven't already cleaned out your hedgehog boxes then time is running out. Check that the box does not have a resident and then take all the old bedding out (using gloves), wash the box with boiling water and let it dry. Then fill it with fresh bedding and Bob's your uncle!

In our part of the country hibernation doesn't really get going until December/ January, but if we have a cold snap before then our hedgehogs will be looking to make their 'hibernaculum' (the word for a hibernation nest).

The reason for hibernating is not just because it is cold. It is because the natural food source, beetles, caterpillars etc, are no longer available for a good feast and so the hedgehogs go into a state of torpor where their bodily functions slow down. Breathing and heartbeats are reduced to just a few times a minute to save energy, and with any luck they will have built up their fat reserves to enable them to survive hibernation.

Hedgehogs may wake from their 'long sleep'every now and then if the temperatures rise or they are hungry/thirsty. This is why it is so important to keep putting food and water out for them even though you think they won't want it. They will really thank you for putting it out and it could be a lifesaver for them.

Put a large flower pot or small bucket by the side of your hedgehog box, and fill it with straw, hay, dried leaves etc. The hedgehog will take mouthfuls of it back to the box to make their hibernaculum really cosy. And you might even capture them doing it on your night time camera if you have one!

The total month's rainfall was 68mm. (Most of which was in the last two weeks).


NATURE NOTES
