

He spoke of the hardships for the lighthouse keepers and the cramped conditions that they lived in.


We have a speaker for the June meeting. David Hawkins who will be speaking about Criminal Ancestors.

Faith Reflection



The last two years have forced us all to face issues which previously we may not have given much thought to. Areas of life which we could never imagine changing but suddenly did. We couldn't even see family and friends freely let alone hug them or hold a hand... so much of our lives that we take for granted was taken away. There are not enough words to tell the whole story. It is no wonder that there is a dramatic rise in mental and physical health problems. Every one of us faces difficult times in our life and for many it feels as if times are always difficult. As I write this, one of the issues that appeared on the news was that of chronic pain. I had an aunt who fell down a short flight of stone steps when she was fourteen damaging the bones at the base of her back, for the next eighty years she suffered constant severe pain. Every day was a battle for her, not to be overcome by it, yet she had a capacity for joy which was amazing and a deep sense of peace because of her faith.

In truth do those experiences determine whether we are happy, content or at peace? I suggest they have an effect upon but do not determine those deeper feelings.

Just before the outbreak of Covid 19, I was diagnosed with serious illness. I found that this was where the rubber hit the road once again with regard to my faith. I have known the poverty of being a single parent family with no money for heating or birthdays; I have known the heart breaking loss of a parent when I was a child and the early loss of a husband. I think I have a strong faith but in fact whether it is strong or weak the important thing is that whatever faith I have it is in an immensely strong God. He is a God who loves me (which doesn't mean he isn't very tough with me at times); He is always present with me; His wisdom guides me and through Jesus, who is God's Word made flesh, provides me with a means of forgiveness and peace. I do not fear the future whatever it may bring. As the Psalmist implied in Ps 121 I look around me, where does my help come from? My help comes from the Lord, the mighty creator God who fills my heart with his peace.

Are you happy? I pray you are at least sometimes. Do you feel content? I pray you are most of the time. Are you at peace within yourself? I pray the peace of the Lord be always with you. Rosie Brown.

At the end of the First World War, Joseph Henry Warner, journalist with the Western Gazette newspaper, put out an appeal for essays detailing the contribution parishes had made to

the war effort. 172 of these returns survive at the Somerset Heritage Centre and provide amazing detail on the county's war effort, all of them proving to be a very valuable resource for those conducting research for the First World War centenary.

Just over 100 years later in this Platinum Jubilee year the Somerset Archives and Local Studies Service, part of the South West Heritage Trust, are putting out a similar appeal to ask you to send us portraits of your parish, something which will mark your parish's place at this unique moment in history and to provide future generations of Somerset with information on our communities.

We aren't looking for a history of the parish, we have lots of that already, but a snapshot of your parish today, a celebration of what makes your parish special in 2022. Things which you may wish to include could be:

- Local shops and business. Services and facilities.
- Clubs, societies, and village past times. Schools and pre-schools.
- Environmental initiatives. Modern day traditions.
- The effect of the Covid-19 Pandemic on your community, and how has your community come together to support each other.
- How your parish is marking the Jubilee.

We are happy to receive your portrait as an essay, as a scrapbook, or a combination of the two – surprise us! If you are including photographs please label and date them where possible and please do not include any personal information such as addresses as we wish to make them available for research. We would also ask that the copyright of all the content, including photographs, be transferred to the South West Heritage Trust and for the portraits to be gifted to us.

#### The Times They Are A-Changing

With the council elections now complete, all of your Parish Councillors await the changes that could arrive from the new unitary council. But, the whole country appears to be preparing itself for changes on a grander scale, from decisions our Queen will make for England's future. So, with these thoughts in mind I thought it would be interesting to reflect (as much as I could); on what events have happened in our part of Somerset over the last seventy years of our Majesty's magnificent reign.

It appears that our new Queen became aware of Lynmouth's plight right from the start of her reign in 1952. News of the terrible storm and flooding in Lynmouth was to reverberate around the world on August 15th. Our new Queen's message of sympathy to the people of Lynmouth, was quickly followed up by her treasured Consort, the Duke of Edinburgh, arriving to see the devastation and to talk to those involved either from evacuation, homelessness or family tragedy. On the night unfortunately due to mobile phones not yet invented, PC. Derek Harper ran 5 miles to raise the S.O.S. alarm service, returning to continue working with the rescue. He received the George Medal for his dedication to duty.

Through the 50's we saw Mr. Gadd licensee of the Wyndham Arms Hotel, Williton, being only the second man in Somerset to possess a driving licence! Sadly in 1953 Capt. Tony Collins the Olympics Equestrian trainer in Porlock was killed in the Comet airline crash; he was due to take the team to the 1956 Melbourne Olympics. Good news did follow in 1955 with the announcement that Dunster Castle and grounds had been sold back to the Luttrell family. The Good Neighbours club launched in 1957 - still going today; preceded by the Reading Room started in the 1900's, which is today - Williton's Social Club. Also in 1957, work started at the controversial Hinckley Point site where employers were looking for 2,500 staff.

In 1960 someone spotted a man called Billy Butlin in Minehead looking for a suitable site for a holiday camp – the camp opened its doors in Minehead 1962! But, soon after this, in 1963 the 'Beeching Report' brought despair when learning his intention was to close all the branch lines around our area. Then in 1964 the overwhelming Beatlemania came to our shores during filming 'A Hard Day's Night'the Beatles arrived by train. Williton's little Alison Clark, 4yrs old, had the privilege of meeting the' Fab Four 'out of thousands of screaming young girls. Looking back through old photos of Williton covering all these years I found many new groups, societies, along with numerous functions increased in the 1960's. These ranged from; keep fit, drama and musical groups, sporting teams, (skittles in pubs and the Egremont Hotel). In 1967 Williton Players musical 'Sherana' played to 1000 people over a long weekend. Train closures continued into the 70's but Minehead wasn't giving up, by eventually re-opening their first public train service in March 1976.

### Parish Council continued from previous page.

Street parties celebrated the Queen's Jubilee in 1977 across the country. Started in 1975 the case surrounding the Right Honourable Jeremy Thorpe MP suddenly hit the headlines again in 1977. The case started its early days with the Free Press in Minehead's court had become more complicated, the case moved to the Old Bailey in London.

A letter from France in 1982 from Neung Sur Beuvron to the Parish Council; contained a request of the possibility, of twinning their town with Williton. It became a mix of a cider county with a wine one in France. A new society began. Charlie Martin expanded his businesses, giving Williton its own greengrocers. But, then a mystery deepened, accumulating in Marines camping out on Exmoor hunting for the 'Beast!' Sadly in 1984 one of the main contributors to the Free Press newspaper passed away, a new event happening in Minehead would have definitely be something he would have written about in his 'Notes by the Way.'It was the new Minehead to Barry Hovercraft but it too sadly passed on, two weeks after starting going into liquidation. A bit further along the coast in 87 at Blue Anchor; 25,000 tons of rock was loaded as sea defence onto its beach. There were plans put forward for a Super Highway which would bypass Williton but nothing happened. By 1989 the **Free Press** stopped printing the newspaper in Williton, moving it to a new printing establishment.

Alarm came in 1990 as Watchet needed help as their sea defences were failing fast; emergency work completed a new sea wall by 1991. West Somerset Rail set up a journey from Paddington to Minehead. Drama on the railway started from Crowcombe when a work train's brakes **were not locked on properly**; so staff had to attempt a rescue - just like in the movies! It ran for 5 miles until it stopped - by itself without mishap followed by exhausted staff arriving too late. At this time all types of hunting was also under threat across the country. But almost from out of space in 1995 NASA space authority had an interest in Somerset, with Arthur C. Clark author, recognising his writings be awarded the Distinguished Public Service medal. Just like science fiction the Millennium arrived and although predictions said it was the end, everyone survived and life continued.

Over the next ten years, reprieve came to the Exmoor ponies now legally allowed to stay forever, on Exmoor. Plans for a new pier at Minehead never continued. Major efforts almost thwarted the Foot and Mouth outbreak in Somerset but, a very few were sadly affected close to it being conquered. For many the banning of hunting across the U.K. in 2005 brought despair. In 2007 the lottery fund helped restore the Bearland Ventilation Flue created in 1860 to prevent suffocation of mine workers by foul air. The next 15 years I have not covered they need more research to be fair.

But 2022 will be a year to remember, just check out social media, the press and the Williton Window. *Councillor Barbara Nye.*



As always you will be welcome to call down to watch (and smell!) the trains and enjoy a coffee or ice cream at the same time. *John Parsons Station Master.* 




### Williton Garden Club

#### In June we have two events happening although no actual meeting.







### NATURE NOTES



### ASTRONOMICAL NEWS

I was unable to see the conjunction of the 4 planets as it was cloudy every morning for 12 days! But a lot of people heard the sonic bangs on the 3rd. week, due I think to meteorites.

From June 1st, watch in the dawn sky for Jupiter and the Moon to appear close together, and by the 4th in the constellation of Aquarius. On the 18th Saturn will be very close and after the 20th the moon will be close to Jupiter. Then look out on the 22nd when Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, and Saturn will all be seen in a line! (If it is not cloudy!)


